

School-Family Compact for Learning





This document was jointly developed by the families, students and staff of the South Alternative Learning Center. This agreement explains how families and teachers will work together to make sure all students reach grade-level standards. Meetings are held each year to review this Compact and make changes based on student needs. The South Alternative Learning Center data reveals that a significant number of referrals and sending offenses stem from **School academic** behavioral conflicts such as verbal and physical altercations, threats, and intimidation. Conflict mediation and resolution, and goal(s) and/or focus area(s) positive coping strategies development will assist the students in transitioning back to their homeschool, and building and maintaining positive peer relationships. Teachers will maintain regular and frequent communication with parents, families, and students utilizing a variety of methods including e-mail and phone. Teachers **Working together** will provide ongoing support in assisting parents in monitoring their student's progress, understanding student assessments, and building strong relationships for success: between the families and the school. Teachers will engage students in regular classroom instruction related to conflict mediation and resolution, social emotional In the classroom development, and resiliency. Students will be given the opportunity to practice skills development in real time through classroom activities, small groups, and individual interventions. Parents and families will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of trainings and family engagement opportunities throughout the school Working together year covering topics related to positive parenting, family conflict resolution, substance use prevention, mental wellness, and academic support for success: strategies. Parents will have the ability to monitor student progress through edgenuity and FOCUS, and regular teacher contact. At home **Working together** Students will have the opportunity to participate in conflict mediation and resolution training, peer mediation, and substance use prevention counseling services as well as additional school-based supportive services focused on goal setting and planning, decision making, healthy relationships, and communication. Students will have the ability to monitor their own for success: progress through edgenuity and FOCUS, as well as regular communication with their teacher. Students will be provided training on how to monitor their own progress. Student responsibility All pertinent information will be distributed in a timely manner using a variety of delivery methods to ensure all parents, families, and students are informed in a **Communication:** timely manner. Methods will include regular e-mail and phone contact, FOCUS communication, website and social media delivery, and through regular in person and virtual parent and family engagement events, parent conferences, and open house. Staying informed Students will have the opportunity to participate in school based mentoring programs, school based support services related to drug and violence prevention, and Building mental wellness support. Parents and families will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of events, activities, and meetings to connect with teachers and **Partnerships** staff, community partners, and other important stakeholders to better support them and their student.
