What is Social Emotional Learning?

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. (casel.org)

How does Social Emotional Learning benefit my child?

Research shows that SEL not only improves achievement by an average of 11 percentile points, but it also increases prosocial behaviors (such as kindness, sharing, and empathy), improves student attitudes toward school, and reduces depression and stress among students (Durlak et al., 2011)

Many BPS teachers, school counselors and school social workers are integrating social emotional learning into their instructional continuity plans during the COVID-19 crisis. Communicate with your child's school about social emotional learning opportunities.
