Applications may be submitted on-line using a computer or mobile device. **The application is available in English, Spanish, Arabic, French, Haitian Creole, Korean, Somali, Vietnamese, Simplified Chinese, and Russian.**

Students who are approved for free and reduced-price meal benefits may be eligible for discounts on SAT/ACT testing, summer enrichment programs, and discounts on technology or internet services. **You MUST apply to receive these extra benefits.**
