SpeakOut Hotline is designed to help you anonymously report any threatening behavior or situation that endangers you, your friends, family, community, or your school campus. Reporting isn't "snitching," reporting is when you need to keep yourself or someone you know safe from threats, harmful behaviors, or dangerous situations.

By guaranteeing a caller's anonymity, SpeakOut allows the caller to give information without the fear of retribution.

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and schools' officials.

Parent/Teacher Conferences: Parent/Teacher conferences are scheduled for **Thursday, October 26, from 6-8pm in the cafeteria**. Appointments are scheduled for 15-minute increments with the teachers of your choice. Please call the Front Office to schedule no later than 12pm on October 26..

Josten's Junior/Senior Class Meetings: Josten's visited THS on Friday, September 29 to meet with the junior and senior classes. Juniors and seniors received information about class rings, other jewelry, graduation

invitations, caps and gowns, and specially priced packages. **IMPORTANT: The deadline for seniors to order senior swag from Josten's is December 1!** Orders may be placed at www.Jostens.com. Extra materials, including ring sizers, from Friday's meeting are available in the Front Office.

Student Parking: All students who drive to school must display a 2023-2024 parking hang tag either by their rearview mirror or on their dashboard. To buy a hang tag, students should bring a valid driver's license, vehicle registration, and \$20 cash (no bill larger than a \$20 bill) to Ms. Desjardins in the Media Center before school, after school, or during lunch. **Students who park on campus without a parking hang tag will receive a \$5 fine that will be charged to their Obligations list.** After three tickets, students will be referred to the dean.

Free/Reduced Lunch: The Free and Reduced Lunch Application for the 2023-24 school year is now available in several different languages! DEAN'S OFFICE *from Mr. Sanders & Mr. Dunn*

Attendance Reminder - Off Campus Students: All RAISE tutor and EFSC students that are off campus are to not enter campus until their assigned THS class begins. When off campus students arrive to THS, they are to enter through attendance, show their ID to the attendance clerk, and go straight to class. Off campus students who are just arriving to THS are to NOT scan the kiosk with their ID. This will solve the tardy issue. All tardies that were logged from start of school for off campus students have been cleared out and removed from attendance portal in Focus.

Impact Forms: The federal impact forms have gone Virtual! Please log into your FOCUS account and fill out the Federal Impact Survey for your student. The deadline to complete this is October 19, 2023.

ID Badge Policy: Students must always **wear** their ID badges while on campus. Every student will receive an ID Badge and lanyard at registration. Students who lose their ID Badge will have to purchase a new one through the Attendance Office for \$5.00.

Student Dress Code: Hats can be worn outdoors only. Shirts must be worn at all times. Undergarments must not be exposed. Chest, midriff, and back should be covered at all times. Clothing, jewelry, and accessories shall not convey messages that are crude; vulgar/profane; violent/death-oriented; gang related; sexually suggestive; and/or promote alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.

Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy:

- Students may use cell phones before school, after school, during their assigned lunch, and during class changes.
 - Cell phones **must be turned off and out of sight during class times**, which are indicated by the late bells and dismissal bells.
- **Students are prohibited from using cell phones during class time.**

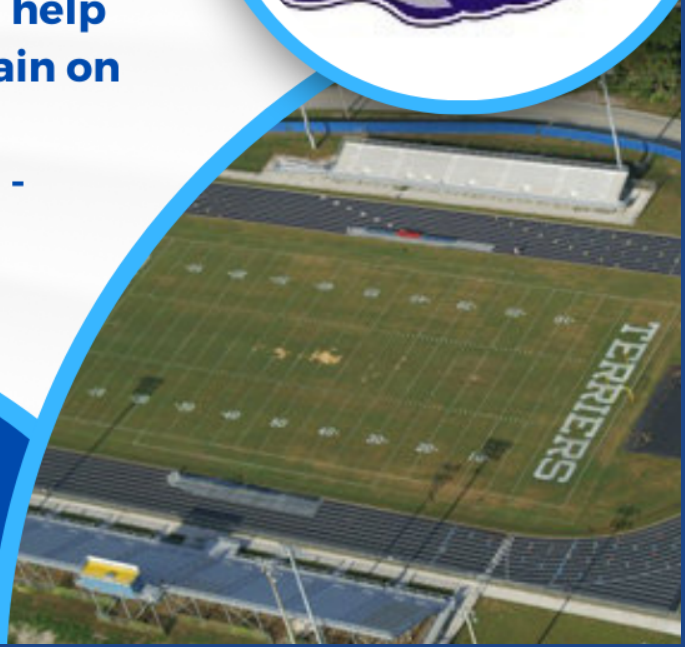
