"Acid rain" is a popularly used phrase that refers to the deposition of acidifying substances from the atmosphere and the environmental damage that this causes. Acid rain became a prominent issue around 1970, and since then research has demonstrated that the deposition of atmospheric chemicals is causing widespread acidification of lakes, streams, and soil. The resulting biological effects include the disruption or even localized extinction of many populations of plants and fish. Strictly speaking, the term acid rain should only refer to rainfall. However, acidification is not just caused by acidic rain, but also by chemicals in snow and fog. [View More](#)

## Invertebrate Development

If you were to randomly pluck any 100 animals from our planet, there's a good chance over 95 of them would be [invertebrates](#), a wide and diverse group with one key shared characteristic: they have no backbone. That's basically the meaning of the word. In Latin, in means "not" and vertebra are the bones of the spine. Invertebrates make up one of the two animal classifications. The other, those with a spine, are called the [vertebrates](#).

Researchers estimate that over 95 percent of all the animal [species](#) on Earth are invertebrate. There are worms, [insects](#), spiders, [shrimps](#), ants and crabs to name just a few. They range from microscopic to tens of feet long; living in the deep oceans to the treetops. Some have hard outer [shells](#) or skeletons called exoskeletons that offer protection. Other invertebrates, such as sponges and jellyfish, have a soft form.
