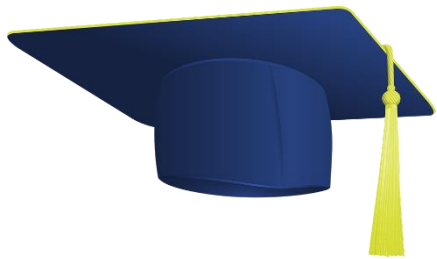


MISSION STATEMENT

AP Program Experience @ THS

WHAT IS AP?

The College Board Advanced Placement program is a nationwide program that offers college-level courses in high school.

- Courses reflect what is taught in top introductory college courses.
- Students take AP Exams at the end of the course to measure their mastery of college-level work.
- A score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam can typically earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college.

WHO SHOULD TAKE AP COURSES?

AP courses are for any students who are academically prepared and motivated to take college-level courses, as well as any students who are interested in college and want to start preparing now.

DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

BPS Advanced Placement Diploma Designation

In addition to meeting the Standard High School Diploma requirements, students must participate in at least six full-year AP courses (or a combination of full-year courses and semester courses totaling six credits) earning scores of 3 or higher on the exams for those courses. Students who complete this cluster of AP courses may accelerate the first year of college through early completion of lower division general education requirements.

AP Capstone Diploma

Students who earn 3 or higher on the AP Seminar and AP Research exams and on four additional AP exams of their choosing will earn the AP Capstone Diploma.

*** The AP Seminar and Research Certificate is awarded to students who earned 3 or higher on both the AP Seminar and AP Research exams.

CTE Program Experience @ THS

WHAT IS CTE?

The Career and Technical Education (CTE) includes a variety of programs that focus on providing the skills and experiences necessary for students to attain entry-level jobs in a career field, as well as preparation for post-secondary education.

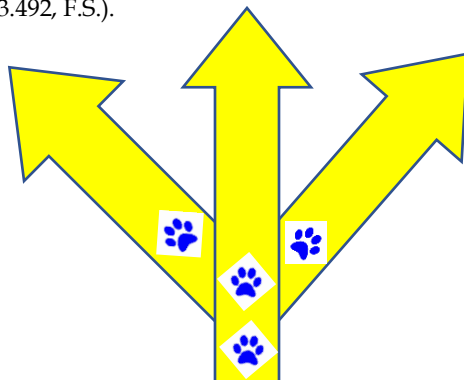
WHO SHOULD TAKE CTE COURSES?

CTE courses are for any students who enjoy small personalized learning communities involved in a selected career theme.

DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

Merit Diploma Designation

In addition to meeting the Standard High School Diploma requirements, student must attain one or more industry certification from the list established (per. S. 1003.492, F.S.).

DE Program Experience @ THS

WHAT IS DE?

The Dual Enrollment (DE) program allows high school students to earn high school and college or vocational credit at the same time.

- Part Time Option: Up to 3 courses per semester
- Collegiate High AA Track Option: 2 or 3 years 10th grade bus
- Early Admissions Option: Fall & spring semester of 12th grade on EFSC campus
- Full Time Option: Spring Semester of 12th grade on EFSC campus

WHO SHOULD TAKE DE COURSES?

Dual Enrollment courses are for motivated students whose goal is to earn an Associate in Arts Degree (A.A.) by high school graduation.

DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

Associate in Arts Degree Diploma Designation

In addition to meeting the Standard High School Diploma requirements, student must attain a total of 60 college-level credit hours, a state cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher, and a combination of general education and elective courses chosen to meet selected university major prerequisites which will be equivalent to freshman & sophomore years at a state university.
