## Track renovation project complete

The construction that lasted 3 months cost more than a million dollars

On March 12 the ribbon cutting to open the long awaited renovated Titusville H.S. track was held on a bright and sunny morning.

The planning phase for the project lasted 1-2 years. "The Brevard School District paid fully for the track. The school fundraised and sought community support for the alternates that cost more than \$75,000," said Athletic Director Jason Berley.




