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## **CURRICULUM** from Ms. Connor

### **EFSC Dual Enrollment Update:**

If your student is planning to take classes for the first time this spring at EFSC, they have to have their application and test scores completed by OCTOBER 9th. This deadline has been set by EFSC and we have been told it is a HARD deadline. Have your student see Mrs. Roberts during lunch on Monday if they have any questions.

### **Resiliency Education: Civic and Character Education and Life Skills Education:**

In alignment with the Florida State Board of Education Ruling , students enrolled in grades 9- 12 will receive five (5) hours of instruction in Resiliency, Character Education, and Life Skills throughout this school year. As we provide this basic instruction to students during the school day throughout English classes, we encourage all families to have ongoing conversations with their children about Resiliency, Character Education, and Life Skills.

### **Testing Update:**

Throughout the month of September, Grade 12 (Cohort 2024) and Grade 11 (Cohort 2025) students that **have not met** the ELA or Algebra 1 graduation assessment requirements will participate in the FAST Grade 10 Reading Retake (*Monday 9/18/23*) and/or the Algebra 1 Retake (*Wednesday 9/20/23*).

### **PSAT/NMSQT:**

- On October 4th, all students in Grade 10 will participate in the PSAT.
- Any Grade 11 or Grade 12 student that has yet to meet the Algebra 1 graduation assessment will be required to take the PSAT in an attempt to earn a concordant score.

### **SAT NCR:**

- On October 11th, Grade 12 students that have yet to meet the ELA and or Algebra 1 graduation assessment will be required to take the SAT NCR in an attempt to earn a concordant score.

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## **SCHOOL OPERATIONS** from Ms. Burgess

### **Josten's Junior/Senior Class Meetings:**

Josten's will visit THS on Friday, September 29 to meet with the junior and senior classes in the Auditorium. Juniors and seniors who are scheduled off-campus during the meeting times are welcome to attend by reporting directly to the Auditorium at the meeting time:

9:45am - 10:15am - Junior Class - Info about class rings, etc.

10:30am - 11:15am - Senior Class - Info about caps, gowns, senior packages, jewelry and more!

**Covid Protocols Discontinued:** On August 28, BPS discontinued the use of special Covid protocols. BPS schools, including THS, are now following the same guidelines for Covid as for other communicable diseases. Students who are ill for any reason should stay home if they are feeling ill and return to school after they are fever-free for 24 hours. Absences that are documented with a doctor's note will be excused. Therefore, a doctor will need to indicate on a note the specific days that are excused.

**Student Parking:** All students who drive to school must display a 2023-2024 parking hang tag either by their rearview mirror or on their dashboard. To buy a hang tag, students should bring a valid driver's license, vehicle registration, and \$20 cash (no bill larger than a \$20 bill) to Ms. Desjardins in the Media Center before school, after school, or during lunch. **Students who park on campus without a parking hang tag will receive a \$5 fine that will be charged to their Obligations list.** After three tickets, students will be referred to the dean.

**Free/Reduced Lunch:** The Free and Reduced Lunch Application for the 2023-24 school year is now available in several different languages! 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**DEAN'S OFFICE** *from Mr. Sanders & Mr. Dunn*

**Impact Forms:** The federal impact forms have gone Virtual! Please log into your FOCUS account and fill out the Federal Impact Survey for your student. The deadline to complete this is October 19, 2023.

**ID Badge Policy:** Students must always **wear** their ID badges while on campus. Every student will receive an ID Badge and lanyard at registration. Students who lose their ID Badge will have to purchase a new one through the Attendance Office for \$5.00.

**Student Dress Code:** Hats can be worn outdoors only. Shirts must be worn at all times. Undergarments must not be exposed. Chest, midriff, and back should be covered at all times. Clothing, jewelry, and accessories shall not convey messages that are crude; vulgar/profane; violent/death-oriented; gang related; sexually suggestive; and/or promote alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.

**Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy:**

- Students may use cell phones before school, after school, during their assigned lunch, and during class changes.
- Cell phones **must be turned off and out of sight during class times**, which are indicated by the late bells and dismissal bells.

• Students are prohibited from using cell phones during class time.
