The goal is not to tell people what to do, but to make messages clear and teach children how to behave for their own future success. The idea is to have mentors come in for students who are struggling. It will be a collaborative effort with everyone. Mrs. Melendez also stated that she will be looking to get teachers more leadership roles, bring in more fun, learning activities that families can attend and build community.

Mrs. Melendez stated that the Youth Truth survey was geared towards the school culture. Students have stated that they are getting tired of other kids impeding on their learning and not being able to do anything about it.

One of the goals for next year would be to assemble a student advisory committee to get the student's perspective and to promote student leadership as well.

Deputy Roger suggested having class presidents. Mrs. Melendez stated that she agreed and that it would be something similar to a student council and an advisory team comprised of students advising the administration on school culture.
