## About Parkland Magnet High

The mission of Parkland Magnet High School is to build a community united in a quest for knowledge and purpose that values diversity and individuality, emphasizes integrity, respect, responsibility, and accountability, and equips students with skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> century and for success in a global society.

Parkland became a magnet high school in 2004-2005 and became an authorized IB World School, offering the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme in 2005. From the IB aims and objectives, Parkland created its magnet school theme of Internationalism and the Arts. The magnet program is open to students throughout Forsyth County.

In April 2017, Parkland received authorization to add the IB Career Prep Diploma to our program offerings.

In August 2021, Parkland received authorization to add the IB Middle Years Programme to our program offerings.

### **Course offerings**

Parkland offers courses in both traditional block and A/B Day format; some classes meet every day for 18 weeks and others meet every other day for 36 weeks. IB Middle Years courses are offered to freshman and sophomore. IB Diploma & IB Career courses are offered to juniors and seniors. Parkland students may choose from over 30 AP classes as well as advanced vocational courses at the Career Center, a centralized high school campus open to all students in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County school system.
