RE: FY 2026 Certified Local Government Grant Applications Available

Dear Mayor:

The Historic Preservation Office (HPO) is pleased to announce that the applications for the 2027 (FY2026) Certified Local Government (CLG) grant round will be available on November 12th, 2025. Each year a portion of state and federal appropriations for historic preservation is passed exclusively to municipalities like yours that participate in the CLG program. This funding, in the form of reimbursable grants, can be used for local preservation activities such as intensive-level architectural surveys, planning documents, and National Register nominations. Grant funds can also be used for education, outreach, and training opportunities.

The grants are awarded on a competitive basis and there is no match requirement. It is anticipated that the amount of funding available for subgrants in 2026 will be between \$100,000 and \$130,000. The minimum grant award will be \$15,000 and the maximum grant award will be \$50,000. CLG grants are managed through NJDEP's System for Administering Grants Electronically (SAGE). The link to the SAGE website as well as a training webinar can be found on the HPO's website here: <https://dep.nj.gov/hpo/programs/community/clg/grants/>. The CLG grant application contains instructional PDFs containing information and detailed guidance regarding completing the application, development of a project, sample scopes of work for a variety of project types and the evaluation and award process. **Completed applications must be submitted through the SAGE system by 11:59pm on March 31st, 2026.**

League Sample Resolution Opposing Legislation Preempting Local Zoning

In response to member requests, the League has prepared the [League's Sample Resolution](#) opposing S-4736, which preempts certain local zoning and enhances the ability of religious and nonprofit organizations to convert certain property to inclusionary developments with affordable housing. Please consider adopting this resolution.

[S-4736](#) preempts local zoning and planning regulations and requires a municipal planning board to permit the conversion or partial conversion of an eligible property, as defined in the bill, into an inclusionary development, for which a certain percentage of the units are reserved as very low-, low-, or moderate-income housing (affordable housing).

The conversion of an eligible property into an inclusionary development with affordable housing would be a permitted use and would not require a use variance, and would be subject to certain zoning requirements and the following affordability constraints:

- At least 20% of the units are required to be reserved as very-low, low-, or moderate-income housing;
- Of the income-restricted units, at least 50% within each bedroom distribution are required to be low-income units, and at least 13% of the low-income units as very-low-income units; and
- The income-restricted units are required to comply with the State's Uniform Housing Affordability Controls.

The bill requires a municipal planning board to approve an application to repurpose or redevelop an eligible property into an inclusionary development with affordable housing, regardless of the eligible property's

location in the municipality, if the project complies with applicable zoning requirements, as described in the bill. The bill specifies certain permitted density and height criteria.

Sample Resolution Opposing S-4736

WHEREAS, municipalities are required to establish a Municipal Master Plan with a combination of mandatory and optional elements including Goals and Objectives, Land Use, Circulation, Housing, Community Facilities, Downtown Economic Development, Historic Preservation, and Sustainability; and

WHEREAS, municipalities are also required to reexamine the Municipal Master Plan every 10 years to ensure that the master plan meets the community needs and is relevant as communities, evolve, grow, and change; and

WHEREAS, municipalities complete this effort at great cost and community input to ensure their community has a roadmap for growth; and

WHEREAS, a municipality is best suited to plan for and understand their community's needs, the existing infrastructure to address the municipality's public safety, health, traffic, and character and the ability to expand such infrastructure for desired growth; and

WHEREAS, there are many mechanisms for exceptions and variances to the local planning process; and

WHEREAS, municipalities have been diligently working to comply with the changes outlined in the passage of A-4/S-50 in 2024 that made substantial changes to the 4th Round of Affordable Housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, affordable housing construction has generally comprised between 10 – 20 % of a total development, but municipalities will end up constructing far more units during this current round of affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, recent legislative proposals that preempt the planning process by permitting the conversion of underutilized properties into mixed used developments, reducing the number of parking spaces required for new developments near transit, making Accessory Dwelling Units permissible, and most recently, legislation that enhances the ability of religious and nonprofit organizations to convert certain property to inclusionary developments with affordable housing undermine the careful planning process outlined in the Municipal Land Use Law; and

WHEREAS, this proposal, S-4736 is particularly egregious because the required percentage of affordable housing units is only 20% with the remaining 80% at market rate making it more challenging for municipalities to meet their 4th Round Affordable Housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, this legislation bypasses local planning for increased density and height, regardless of a municipality's ability to ensure safety; and

WHEREAS, a worthy project could, and should participate in the local planning and zoning process to engage with the public; and

WHEREAS, S-4736 permits the bypassing of the local planning process which is an egregious assault on municipal autonomy and local decision making.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the [INSERTY MUNICIPALITY HERE] urges the legislature to defeat S-4736 and similar legislation that denies local autonomy in land use planning and ignores the well thought out master plan; and

SECTION I. The speed limits for both directions of travel along Knickerbocker Road in the Borough of Closter be established as follows:


ZONE:

A. 35 MPH along Knickerbocker Road from the Demarest Borough line at Grove Street to the Harrington Park Borough line 215 feet north of the centerline of Harrington Avenue.

SECTION II. That all prior ordinances or resolutions or portions thereof of the Bergen County Board of County Commissioners inconsistent herewith be and they are hereby repealed.

SECTION III. On or about 7:00 PM on November 5, 2025, at the Bergen County Board of County Commissioners Public Meeting Room, Fifth Floor, One Bergen County Plaza, Hackensack, NJ, 07601, is fixed as the time and place when and where any and all persons interested shall be given an opportunity to be heard concerning the ordinance

John Glidden has served the residents of Closter since 2004, first as a member of the Council and in 2014 he was elected Mayor of Closter, a position he proudly holds today. During his tenure as both a councilman and as mayor, he has served as Police Commissioner, DPW Chair, Member of the Zoning Board, Planning Board, and liaison to the Closter School Board, the Closter Recreation Commission, the Closter Coaches Association and liaison to the Closter Volunteer Ambulance & Rescue Corps. This diverse experience offers his constituents a broad knowledge of management and problem solving in a cohesive, supportive manner.

Prior to his election in Closter, Mayor Glidden served in numerous public voluntary positions throughout New Jersey. He was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Englewood Hospital, and later served as a Trustee of the Bergen Pines Hospital, the New Jersey Health Research and Educational Trust, and Commissioner of the NJ Governor's Commission on Capital Formation for Health Care Facilities. Mr. Glidden was born in Englewood, NJ and graduated from Union College. After college he was a US Air Force Pilot during the Vietnam War. He and his wife, Brooke (who is an EMT with the Closter Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Corps) have three children and live in Closter.

Alissa Latner has been Closter Councilwoman since 2010. She currently serves as: Police Commissioner (9 years, member of Public Safety Committee since 2012); Liaison to Closter Library (15 years); Liaison to Northern Valley Demarest High School (11 years); Human Resources Committee member (10 years); Ordinances Committee member (3 years); Department of Public Works Commissioner (2010-2015); Fire Commissioner (2010-2017); Closter resident 27 years

Chris Langschultz has served as the alternate to the Superintendent of Schools on the Bergenfield Public Library Board since 2011. He currently handles payroll, accounting, graphic design, and public relations for the Bergenfield Public School District, where he has been employed since 2002. Chris is also a sitting member of the Bergenfield Municipal Alliance.

Chris previously worked in IT, and is a licensed Realtor in New Jersey. He's also previously served on the Advisory Board and Finance Committee for the New Jersey School Public Relations Association, and has presented on various topics at the National School Boards Association, New Jersey School Boards Association, and NJ TECHSPO conventions, and for the New Jersey Association for School Administrators.

In his role on the Bergenfield Public Library Board, Chris often works as a liaison between the school district and library. The two organizations often share ideas and practices, collaborate on events and outreach efforts, and explore ways to share services.

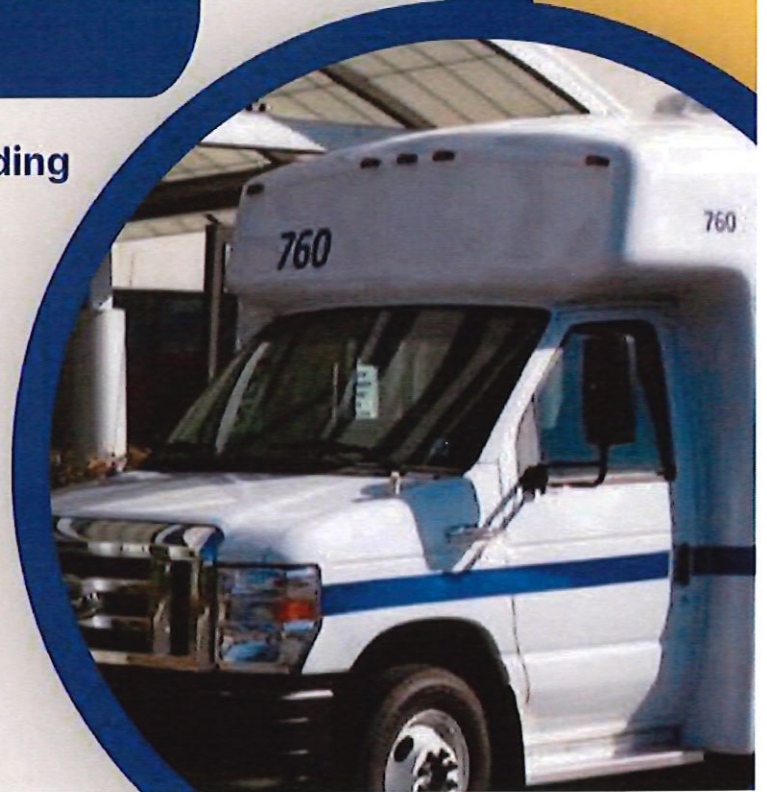
