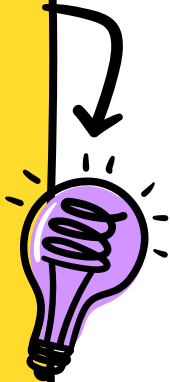


What is Pre-Registration?

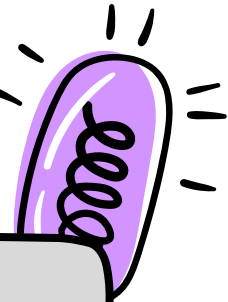


- Pre-Registration is when you meet with your counselor **individually** to pick classes and prepare for next year.
- Please go through this PowerPoint to learn about credits and what you need to do to graduate.
- This will prepare you to pick classes for next year.

What you need to graduate



Earn 26 Credits

Pass 5 End of Course Exams (STAAR Tests)

Earn at least one endorsement

- Algebra 1 (8th or 9th grade)
- English 1 (9th grade)
- Biology (9th grade)
- English 2 (10th grade)
- US History (11th grade)

How to Earn Credits



You can earn eight credits a year



Each class you take and pass each semester, it's worth 0.5 credits.

If you are taking eight classes a year, then each semester, you can earn four credits (excluding double blocked classes like sports).

Your credits add up each year in high school, which helps you move to the next grade level (6.5 credits → 10th grade)

How many credits do you need to move to the next level?

0 - 6 credits = 9th grade

9th

6.5 - 12 = 10th grade

10th

12.5 - 18 = 11th grade

11th

18+ = 12th grade

12th

Remember: Just because you are in high school for two years, doesn't mean you move to the next grade. You **MUST** have the correct number of credits to move up.



Why are grades important?

- 
- You need to pass your classes to stay on track for graduation. If you fail classes over and over, you get behind in credits.
 - You want a good GPA (Grade Point Average) – A GPA is an average of all grades you earn throughout high school.
 - When applying to colleges, GPA is VERY important and one of the top requirements college recruiters look at when deciding on your acceptance.
 - Sammy O. , a senior at Franklin says, “grades can often define you, but overall, they are important for your future.”

What is an endorsement?

- An Endorsement is a plan of study that you follow for 4 years. The Endorsement you choose indicates at least **1** class you must take all 4 years of high school.
- You need to earn at least **1** Endorsement to graduate!
- You must have a signed (parent and student) Endorsement letter on file with your counselor.

Endorsement Areas

- *Arts and Humanities
- *Business and Industry
- *Multidisciplinary
- *Public Services
- *Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM)



What is credit averaging?

Credit averaging happens if you fail a semester of a year long class with a 60-69. You must get a high enough grade the other semester so that both semester grades average to at least a 70. Then you get credit for the entire year. You won't have to take the semester you failed over again. Dual Credit does not credit average.

EXAMPLE: Joey fails his first semester English 1 class with a 62. He passes his second semester English class with an 80. Joey is eligible for credit averaging.

$$62 + 80 = 142, 142 \div 2 = 71. \text{ The final year grade would be a } 71$$

If you get a 59 or lower, you are not able to credit average.

Examples of Endorsements



Arts and Humanities

Fine Arts: You would take Art 1, Art 2, Art 3, Art 4.

Public Service

ROTC: You would take ROTC 1, ROTC 2, ROTC 3, ROTC 4.

STEM

Math or Science (this one is different): You would need to complete 5 years of either Math or Science before you graduate

There are several different options for Endorsements. You can change them, but you need to make sure you are able to take the 4 years that are required, if you do change.



Honors classes we offer



Pre-AP

classes are harder, faster paced classes that will boost your GPA. **No requirement to take.**

AP

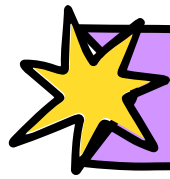
classes are college level classes where you take an AP test at the end of the year to earn college credit. You must get a 3, 4, or 5 to earn college credit. GPA booster! **No requirement to take.**

Dual Credit

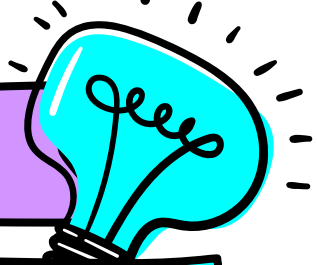
Classes are college level classes offered through El Paso Community College (taught by Franklin teachers). GPA booster! **You need to pass the TSI exam to take classes.**

UT OnRamps

courses are classes offered through the University of Texas at Austin. They are taught by a UT professor and a Franklin teacher. They boost your GPA and you decide if you want to take the college credit or not. **No requirement to take.**

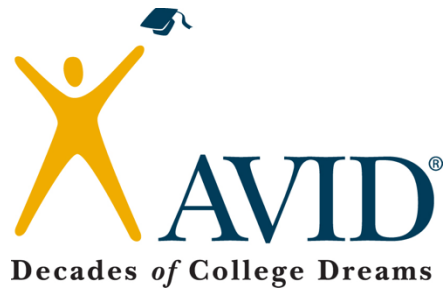
Mexican American Studies

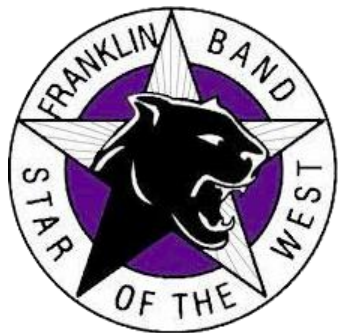

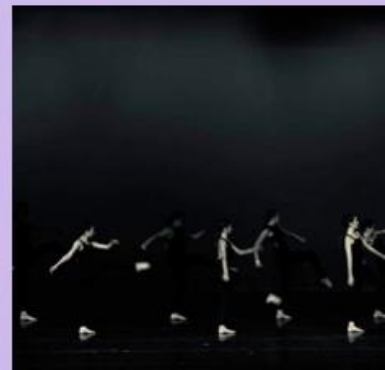
The Silver Starz perform at football games, pep rallies, various school functions, and events around El Paso including dance showcases and competitions.

Dual Credit: Music Appreciation

Want to know how music went from this — — — —> to this??

Johann Sebastian Bach (1685–1750)



Bach is the culminating figure of the Baroque style and one of the giants in the history of music. Born at Eisenach, Germany, he was raised a Lutheran and followed the family vocation of organist. At the age of twenty-three, he was appointed to his first important position: court organist and chamber musician to the duke of Weimar. During his Weimar period (1708–17), Bach's fame as organ virtuoso spread, and he wrote many of his most important works for that instrument.

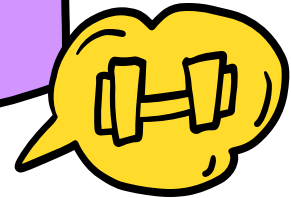
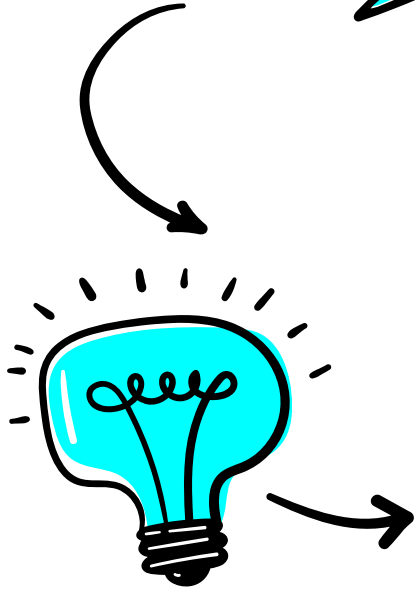
