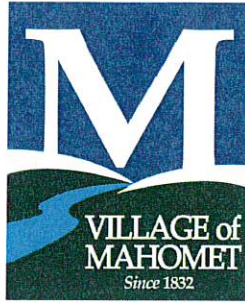

INTRODUCTION: The Board of Trustees is asked to consider a request for the termination of the recorded Bridlebrook Planned Unit Development (PUD) with its covenants, restrictions and development plan.

LOCATION / SITE DESCRIPTION:

The site is located south of Patton Drive and north of Delane Drive from Heather Drive to Churchill Dr. encompassing 7.8± acres. The site contains an assisted living center and related parking and circulation and expansion area; eight (8) single family lots with attached homes known as Bridlebrook Villas, 16 single-family lots with attached homes under construction, known as Unlimited Villas, and associated outlots.

BACKGROUND:

At the time the PUD was established and later amended, the entirety of the land was intended to work as one fluid development with villas on individual lots, but the grounds managed by the developer/corporation operating the assisted living center. The Bridlebrook Villas were set up as age restricted units with “buy back” potential from the operating corporation.

On September 29, 2015, the developer sold the assisted living center and the two underlying lots to a private company operating as The Waterford at Bridlebrook. All previous attempts to continue the development of the villa homes were unsuccessful due to the PUD.

The delay in action by majority land owners on the previously approved PUD termination was due to another sale, in August 2021, of the assisted living center property.

On September 7, 2021, in response to an application from the landowner of the formerly vacant land to “terminate the PUD” a public hearing was held in front of the Plan and Zoning Commission. The eight (8) Bridlebrook Villa owners supported the application for termination. The owner/developer of the vacant land (between the assisted living center and the Bridlebrook Villas) undertook the development without termination secured.

The approval by the BOT for the termination expired.

STATUS:

The vacant land between the assisted living center and the eight (8) villa owners has now been developed into 16 lots and the construction of attached dwellings is in progress. A fence was erected west of the existing Bridlebrook Villa land. The outlots containing the shared driveways have been transferred to the adjacent landowners.

The Bridlebrook Villa landowners have since engaged an attorney to adopt new by-laws and covenants to operate as independent HOA and retain contractor maintenance services for their eight (8) units.

The owner of the assisted living center and their vacant lot to the west must sign off on the termination because the 24 residential lots do not constitute the majority (by land area) vote necessary to alter (or terminate) the PUD. The petitioner is working with the majority landowner.

COMMUNITY INPUT: A public hearing was held and closed before the Plan and Zoning Commission on September 7, 2021. No one from the public provided comments related to the PUD termination request.

- Final Plat - Bridlebrook Development Tract Subdivision (Replat) – Approved by Staff – Recorded March 2019
- Rezoning - Bridlebrook Development Tract Subdivision Lot 102 – Rezoned from R-3C to R-3G – BOT approved June 2021 – Ord 21-06-01
- PUD Termination – BOT approved Res. 21-09-02 – Resolution had 180 day expiration which passed without owner action therefore PUD Termination approval is no longer valid.

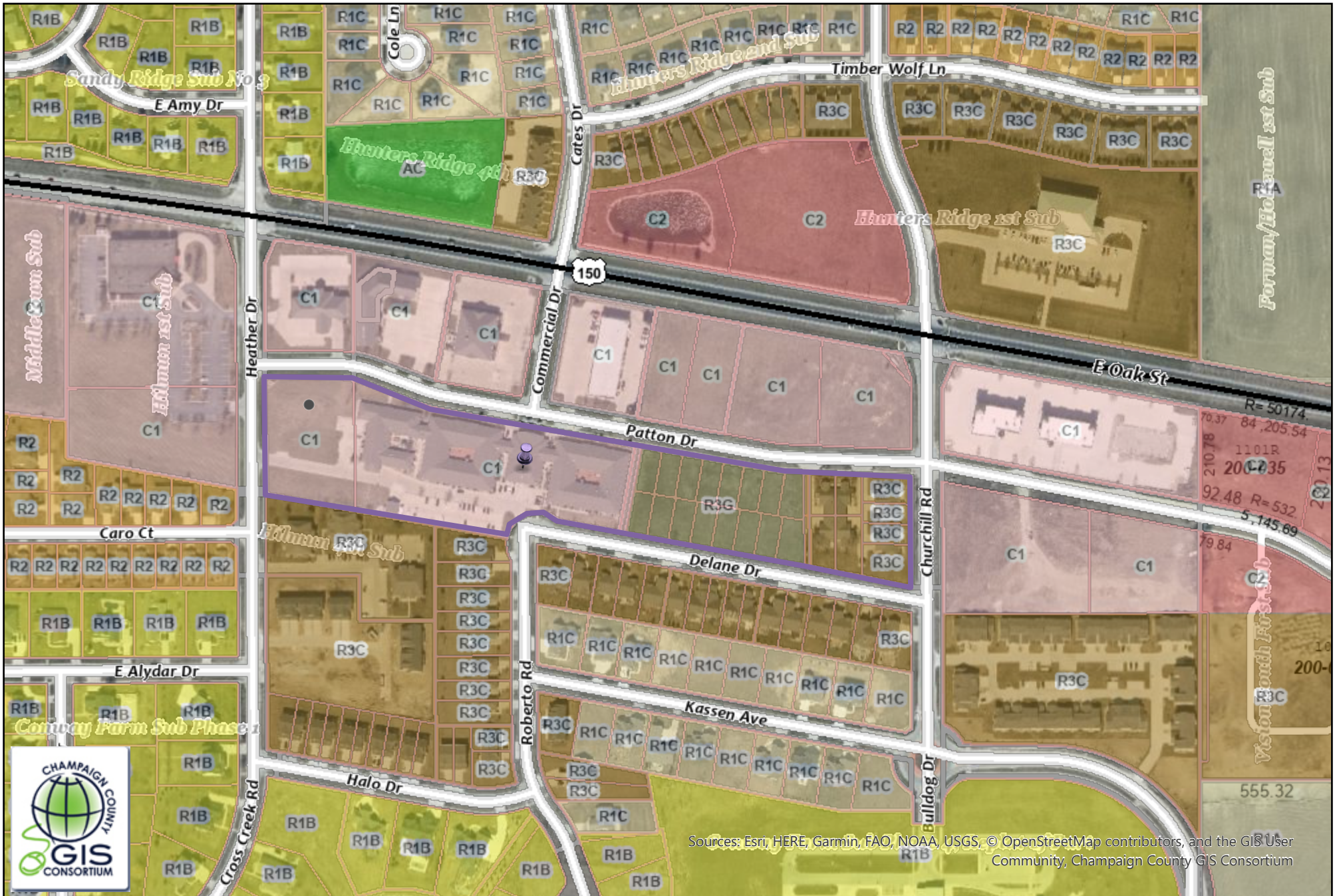

STAFF IMPACT: Staff will be much less impacted if the PUD is terminated than if it is left in place.

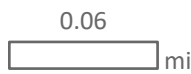

INTRODUCTION:

While inspecting new construction houses over the past two years it has been identified that conflicts readily happen between return air and electrical wires, switches, and receptacles when wall cavities are being used as a duct/plenum

BACKGROUND:

Since the adoption of the 2015 International Residential Code and amendments in 2019, enforcement began January 1, 2020. Staff has used this first year to work with the new code and to establish new processes, procedures, inspections, and enforcement. During year three Jim Barden was added as a building inspector. His addition has provided the opportunity to spend the needed time in the buildings to do more through inspections.

While inspecting we observed switches, outlets and wires running the length of building cavities being used as a ducts or plenums. The code requires the supply side of the HVAC system to be ducted which eliminates electrical conflicts however there was minimal language for return air. This conflict creates the potential for smoke from an electrical fire to infiltrate the return air to the HVAC system and spread smoke throughout the house quickly.

I presented a change to the Building Code Review and Advisory Board that when these conflicts arise, we could require hard ducting in that cavity. This would be the lowest cost method to address the issue approximately \$50 - \$75. However, the BCRAW did not agree. A member of the board presented language from the energy code that requires all return air to be ducted. When we adopted the residential building code in 2019, we wrote out the energy portions of that code. The BCRAW determined and voted on the change to require all return air ducts to be ducted, which is consistent with the ordinance we plan to present at the board meeting. The additional cost this change will cause an increase of \$750 - \$1000 per residential dwelling unit.

In additional to the specific code change related to HVAC, staff is also seeking a discussion on work plan direction on the next codes the Village Board would like us to research for adoption.

The State of Illinois has the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code adopted but does not require municipalities to enforce. They are likely to adopt the 2021 IECC with amendments within the next 6 months to year. To analyze staff used the same set of municipalities as before to review energy codes practices in the area. Two of the three most similar in population have adopted the IECC by reference to the state law. One municipality much larger than Mahomet has chosen to follow the same as we currently do, which is to inform the builders of their responsibility, but not take an active role in inspection and enforcement. There is no definitive estimated cost for building to the IECC or not. There are incremental costs provided by a national research laboratory that shows going from the 2018 to the 2021 IECC will add about \$3,569 - \$4,393 to our typical 2 story home with a heated basement. Currently we have builders that abide by the State law and others that do not.

With respect to the commercial, industrial, and mixed uses that is anticipated over the next few years our current building code does not regulate these types of construction. The International Building Code is used for regulating these types of construction. There is a state law in place that establishes the 2018 IBC as the code that builders are to follow for public buildings but does not address private commercial. The state law does require the IECC to be followed for all commercial construction

International Property Maintenance Code is a potential direction we may want to go. It would take time to review against current ordinances to identify and resolve potential conflicts. Our current ordinances address how properties are to be maintained spread out through various ordinances. With the IPMC it would better clarify expectations and provide structure around the administration and enforcement procedures. In the next year I do anticipate having more time to address current property maintenance issue since Jim is available for building inspection. I would still complete the application reviews and go on inspections as workload demands.

DISCUSSION OF ALTERNATIVES:

1. Direct staff to prepare an ordinance with language that requires hard ducting only when conflicts arise, for presentation at the Board of Trustees meeting Dec 20, 2022.
2. Do not adopt any changes at this time.

PRIOR BOARD ACTION:

Adopted the 2015 International Residential Code in Dec 2019

COMMUNITY INPUT:

The Review Board met 3 times this past year and no one from the community has attended these meetings.

BUDGET IMPACT:

Staff expects there will be no budget impact due to this change as it is part of a inspection process we already do for each single family residence.

STAFF IMPACT:


With the current housing lot stock, we anticipate the single family attached and detached to continue at a steady pace. Work load will be minimally impacted due to this change as it just another inspection point while we are currently in the building.

SUMMARY:

The residential building code administration and enforcement has and will evolve. Changes to the residential code is expected from time to time as we identify issues that need to be addressed.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Move the attached ordinance to the consent agenda of the Board Meeting on December 20th.

WHEREAS, as a Unit of Local Government, the Village of Mahomet, Champaign County, Illinois (“Village”) has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, that protect the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens, and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees (the “**Corporate Authorities**”) of the Village now find it necessary, desirable and appropriate to amend certain provisions of the Building and Maintenance Codes under and pursuant to its power and authority as a Unit of Local Government and the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 et seq.)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MAHOMET, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The recitals listed above are incorporated in this Ordinance as the findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2. NEW SECTION 160.065. The following Section 160.065 is hereby added to CHAPTER 160 BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE CODE of the Code of Mahomet as follows:

§ 160.065 CHAPTER 16: DUCT SYSTEMS

The following sections of the 2015 International Residential Building Code, Chapter 16: Duct Systems are hereby revised as follows:

(A) *M1601.1.1 Above-ground duct systems.*

DELETE: 5. The use of gypsum products to construct return air ducts or plenums is permitted, provided that the air temperature does not exceed 125°F (52°C) and exposed surfaces are not subject to condensation.

AMEND: 7. Stud wall cavities and the spaces between solid floor joists to be used as air plenums shall comply with the following conditions:

- AMEND: 7.1. These cavities or spaces shall not be used as a plenum for supply air or return air.
- ADD: 7.1.1 Return air must be ducted with metal or flex ducting.
- ADD: 7.1.2 When return air ducting and electrical wiring, switches or receptacles conflict metal ducting is required.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective following its passage, approval and publication as required by law and shall take effect and be in full force effective January 1, 2023. For any penalty imposed by this Ordinance, said sections shall become effective 10 days following its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

SECTION 4. CONFLICT. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. SAVING CLAUSE.

If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance, which are hereby declared to be separable.

SECTION 6. PUBLICATION. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form.

INTRODUCTION:

The Village issues annual garbage hauling licenses. The current licenses expire on December 31, 2022. Applications have been received, fees have been paid, and insurance certificates have been provided for the current three (3) licensees.

BACKGROUND:

Village code Chapter 50 requires licensing of garbage haulers within the Village of Mahomet. The existing code establishing the collection of garbage was done in 1987 and the maximum number of licenses was set at four (4). However in 2017, after Corray Sanitary was purchased by Area Disposal (PDC) from Peoria, the board decided to reduce authorized licenses from four (4) to our current level allow of three (3). This is where we are at today.

As in the past years, just like with alcohol licenses, existing established licensees have rights to renew their license first. GFL did purchase all assets of Area Disposal (PDC) earlier this year. The Village has received applications from all three existing licensees, which are all compliant with the Ordinance requirements:

- GFL (Green for Life), Clinton
- Republic Services/Allied Waste, Urbana
- Area Garbage Service, Mahomet

The resolution being considered only deals with approving our three existing license holders.

Other background for future consideration for ordinance revisions that Staff seeks direction on:

§ 50.21 REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

If, during the period covered by the license granted, hauler shall permit his or her equipment to fall into disrepair or shall fail to keep the same in a sanitary condition when not in use, or shall fail to obey any of the provisions of this chapter, the license may be revoked after reasonable notice and hearing by the Board of Trustees.

§ 50.22 NUMBER OF LICENSES.

The number of licenses to be issued under this chapter shall be the maximum of three.

(Ord. passed 3-9-1987; Ord. 17-03-04, passed 3-28-2017)

§ 50.23 ASSIGNMENT OF LICENSES.

No license may be assigned or transferred without the express approval of the Board of Trustees of the village.

(Ord. passed 3-9-1987)

Some board members have asked about allowing additional garbage collector licenses. The board can direct staff to make changes to our ordinance related to increasing our number of licenses. Staff would suggest though, that for each license above our current three we would need to have a lottery system to decide which company would get our additional license. Likewise, even if you do not support increasing licenses, we should still have a lottery system in place in our ordinance to decide which company could get an open license if one of the existing companies relinquishes their license or fails to renew it. There would be several companies that would be interested in open licenses who have expressed interests in the past several years.

Additionally we should update our ordinance to more clearly state the renewal process that has been in place since 1987 and likely prior.

Finally, we should update our Revocation of License clause to include performance-based issues as a reason to revoke licenses with proper notice.

Staff seeks direction on these three questions. If the board give staff direction to make all or some of the changes, we will update in the spring.

DISCUSSION OF ALTERNATIVES:

1. Not approve the licenses. However, all three have legally met the ordinance requirements for renewal.
2. Direct staff to make changes to our Ordinance in time for implementation when it is renewal time.
3. Go to one contracted (through bid process) garbage collector.

PRIOR BOARD ACTION:

The Village Board previously approved the licensing of the three applicants.

COMMUNITY INPUT:

We do from time to time received complaints about haulers from time they pick up to “they skip my residence”.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The positive budget impact is the collect revenues from \$3,000. There is no negative budget impact, but the garbage trucks traveling Village streets do have an impact on their condition.

STAFF IMPACT:


The impact on staff is minimal. It consisted of mailing an application form, and letter advising the haulers of their renewal and preparing documents for approval. Staff, upon approval will mail out the licenses.

SUMMARY:

Approval of the Resolution would allow the licensing of and prevent a lapse in garbage collection service for the residents of the Village.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Village Board of Trustees adopt the current Resolution and approve the garbage collectors licenses for the three current license holders.

COLLECTION OF GARBAGE

§ 50.01 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

ASHES. The waste product of combustion of any material.

CUSTOMER. Any tenant, lessee or occupant of any dwelling, tenant house, lodging house, hotel, restaurant, boarding house, or other person, persons, firm or corporation who hires a hauler as defined herein for the purpose of regularly collecting garbage.

GARBAGE. Includes kitchen and household garbage and ashes and other refuse matters as herein defined.

GARBAGE CONTAINER. Containers having a minimum capacity not to exceed 30 gallons.

HAULER. A person licensed under this chapter.

KITCHEN AND HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE. Any, all and every accumulation of vegetable matter, liquid or solids, that is received from kitchens and households, and also any, all and every decayed or unsound matter, such as vegetables and fruits.

OTHER REFUSE. Sweepings, papers, tin cans, dirt or other accumulations not giving off noxious odors.

VEHICLE. Automobile, truck or any vessel, vehicle or wagon used to transport garbage or refuse as herein defined.

§ 50.02 GARBAGE DISPOSAL.

It shall be the duty of every tenant, lessee or occupant of every dwelling, tenement house, lodging house, hotel, restaurant, boarding house, or other person, persons, firm or corporation, on whose premises kitchen and household garbage collects, to provide, and at all times to keep within the building, or on the premises, garbage which may accumulate on the premises between collections, which containers shall be watertight, and with a tight fitting cover, and equipped with suitable handles, which containers shall be placed at all times so as to be readily accessible for removal and emptying, and where they shall not be a public nuisance. No person, firm or corporation, unless authorized and licensed for that purpose, as hereinafter specified, shall interfere with the containers or the contents thereof. All other refuse and ashes or cinders shall be placed in a separate covered receptacle, which receptacle shall be small enough that one person can easily handle it. The receptacles may not be placed in any alley or street, but must be readily accessible for emptying and removal, but in any event they shall not be placed in a position that they would become a public nuisance. All the garbage, ashes or cinders and other refuse shall be removed once each week.

§ 50.03 GARBAGE COLLECTORS.

No firm, corporation or person shall engage in the business of collecting garbage or be permitted to haul, convey or transport over and upon the streets of the village any garbage or other refuse as defined, or other material giving off noxious odors unless he or she shall be licensed therefor.

COLLECTOR LICENSING REGULATIONS

§ 50.15 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSE.

(A) No applicant shall be granted a license unless he or she shall have provided himself or herself with the proper and necessary machinery or other appliances for properly taking care of and disposing of the garbage in conformity with the health regulations of the state, the county and the village, nor unless the applicant owns each vehicle to be used in garbage collection, nor if the applicant has been guilty of any willful violation of any health or sanitary provisions of the village or is in default on any contract with the village.

(B) A certification of insurance from an insurance company licensed to do business in the state certifying that the licensee has the following coverage:

(1) Comprehensive general liability insurance of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 in the aggregate, and with the Village of Mahomet listed as an additional insured party;

(2) Vehicle liability of \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit, \$1,000,000 bodily injury per occurrence, and \$500,000 property damage coverage; and

(3) Workers' compensation per statutory limits required under the Illinois Workers Compensation Act, ILCS, Ch. 820, Act 305, §§ 1 *et seq.*, or as otherwise required by law.

(C) The certificate of insurance shall be submitted to the Village Clerk prior to the issuance of license.

§ 50.16 APPLICATIONS.

All applications for license hereunder shall be made in writing to the Village Clerk who shall refer the application to the Board of Trustees. Action shall be taken to grant or deny the application for license within 60 days of the date of filing with the Village Clerk.

§ 50.17 LICENSE FEE.

The license fee shall be \$1,000 per year for each license holder, payable at the time application is made. The license shall expire on December 31 of each year regardless of when issued, and there shall be no proration of the license fee, and the license fee shall be payable in advance.

§ 50.18 BEDS OF VEHICLES.

(A) The beds of all vehicles used in garbage collection shall be tight enough so that none of the garbage contained therein shall sift through, drop or spill from the vehicles, and covers shall be provided for the beds of all the vehicles which shall be kept closed when in use.

(B) The vehicles used in the collection of garbage shall have the name and phone number of the business painted on the vehicles.

§ 50.19 ASHES AND NON-NOXIOUS MATTER.

All ashes and non-noxious matter must be hauled in vehicles of such construction as not to permit the sifting out or spilling or scattering by the wind or leakage of any matter so hauled or transported.

§ 50.20 DELINQUENT CUSTOMERS.

Any hauler granted a license under this chapter shall be under no obligation to make a pickup of garbage from any customer who is more than 90-days' delinquent in paying garbage collection charges.

§ 50.21 REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

If, during the period covered by the license granted, hauler shall permit his or her equipment to fall into disrepair or shall fail to keep the same in a sanitary condition when not in use, or shall fail to obey any of the provisions of this chapter, the license may be revoked after reasonable notice and hearing by the Board of Trustees.

§ 50.22 NUMBER OF LICENSES.

Engineer's Monthly Report November 2022

- South Mahomet Rd:
 - Cross paved SMR and connector to 425E and as much of the shoulders as were ready at the beginning of the month.
 - Feutz backfilled all shoulders in order to open SMR to 425E south of tracks with double sets of barricades for the portion of SMR that will eventually cross the tracks.
 - Varsity striping provided temporary pavement markings for the re-opened section of road.
 - Feutz completed the concrete work south of the tracks (up to the transitions at the tracks). Also made the first pour at the roundabout but may be shutting down for winter.
 - Feutz completed earthwork south of tracks and some earthwork north of tracks too.
- Sidewalk Mudjacking: Mike Jansen completed 16 locations. Project is complete.
- Held walk-through meetings with the 3 firms we picked to interview for the 400 block of Main Downtown Reconstruction project.
- Had 30% design review meeting with Hanson for SMR Phase 2 plans.
- Worked on MFT budget, but we are rethinking priorities and did not get a program ready to present to BOT in December. (Ellen taking a vacation first full week of December)
- General roadway maintenance planning and started working on Transportation CIP project budget updates.
- Coordination with Eric on sewer lining locations. Discussion with Naren from Fehr Graham who is putting together the sewer lining plans. (This will be part of Jason's next sanitary sewer lining project.)
- Meeting and drawings for a possible redevelopment.
