# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Maintain **2.0 GPA** ('C' letter grade average)
- ✓ Pass **10th grade FAST ELA** or SAT/ACT/CLT
- ✓ Pass **Algebra 1 or Geometry EOC**
- ✓ At least 1 virtual course



\*All EOC's count as 30% of the Final Grade

**NOTE:** Most four-year Colleges/Universities and the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship require at least 2 years of the same Foreign Language

# COLLEGE READY

## 4 Year College Entrance Requirements

- All Graduation Requirements plus the following
- 2 Years of the Same Foreign Language \*
- 4 Years of Science
- Honors, AP, IB and Dual Enrollment courses are highly recommended
- Upper level Math (Pre-Calc or higher)
- Upper level Science (Chemistry, Physics, etc.)
- Community Service Hours\* (Read Below)

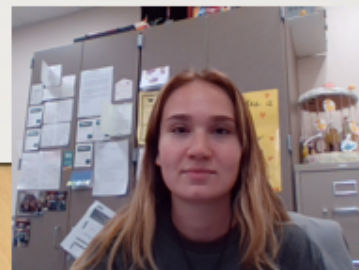
## What is IB

## *Dual Enrollment*

### **1. Dual Enrollment (part-time, Junior/Senior) 3.0 unweighted GPA**

Qualified grade 11/12 students dual enroll in approved college course-work that will satisfy both high school and college requirements.

### **2. Early Admissions (full-time, Senior only) 3.0 unweighted GPA**

Qualified grade 12 students to enroll in approved college course-work.

### **3. Accelerated Dual Enrollment (full-time, Junior & Senior)**

**3.3 unweighted GPA**, pass ALL portions of the PERT or qualifying SAT/ACT scores. Qualified rising grade 11 students with the ability to potentially earn the AA degree.

## WHAT IS OJT?

- OJT is on-the-job training at a work site during school hours. It is designed to give students supervised, practical application of work experience based on previously learned skills in a related industry.

## BENEFITS OF OJT

- Real-world experience, skill development, career exploration, networking opportunities, increased employability, confidence building, personal growth, improved decision-making, professionalism, smooth transition to the workforce or further education.

## REQUIREMENTS

- Two CTE courses within one pathway (Culinary, Digital Design, Engineering, Construction, Business, or Medical)
- Industry Certification (earned within students' chosen pathway)
- Enrolled as a Junior or Senior
- Hold a valid driver's license
- Minimum GPA: 2.0
