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Curriculum Objection Form

A parent/guardian who believes that any curriculum, instructional materials, or programs violate rights guaranteed by any law or Board Policy may complete and submit this Curriculum Objection Form to the Director of Teaching and Learning for such objection to be considered.

As outlined in Board Policy 6:260, objections to curriculum, instructional materials, or programs may be based on one of the "opt-out" provisions within the School Code or a student's right to the free exercise of religion as provided by the First Amendment to the Constitution. Parents/guardians who are seeking an exemption based on an "opt-out" provision should complete Parts I and II of this Form. Parents/guardians seeking an objection in accordance with the right to the free exercise of religious belief should complete Parts I and III.

Parents/guardians should submit this form to the Director of Teaching and Learning. Upon review of the form, a determination will be made about the request for exemption from the instructional material or program which is the basis of the objection.

If the parent/guardian is not satisfied with the decision of the Director of Teaching and Learning, then the parent/guardian may file a grievance under the District's "Uniform Grievance Procedure," Board Policy 2-260.

*Students who are granted an exemption based on the “opt-out” related to the dissection of animals may be required to complete an alternative project. Such alternative project/assignment will be of similar length and difficulty. Students who complete the alternative project/assignment will be graded in a manner similar to students using the original material.

**Students who are granted exemptions from participation in lockdown drills will be provided with an alternative curriculum to address safety concerns related to active threat or active shooter events.
