MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of East Lincoln High School is Empowering Leadership through learning with High expectations for all Stakeholders.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

East Lincoln is a comprehensive four-year high school accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Located near Lake Norman between Charlotte and Hickory, the school provides for the development of the total student through varied curricula, including advanced placement (AP), career and college promise classes (CCP) and honors/advanced courses. All students may participate in any program of study regardless of sex, race, religion, national origin, age, or disability.

SCHOOL YEAR

Lincoln County high schools use block scheduling. Students take four 90 minute classes each term. The academic year which is 36 weeks long is divided equally into two terms.

CAREER-TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Career-Technical Education is a priority of the Lincoln County Board of Education. Instruction is provided at the high school and the Lincoln County School of Technology. LCST is a unique, centralized educational center which serves as an extension of the four county high schools. Career-Technical students are eligible to participate in apprenticeships and career internships.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

East Lincoln has numerous opportunities to get involved. ELHS supports over 20 clubs and student organizations as well as 22 athletic teams, marching and concert bands, color guard, drama, and chorus. The journalism classes publish the student yearbook, **Retrospect**.

UNITS OF CREDIT AND PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

Students may earn one unit of credit for each course passed in a semester. Students may earn eight credits per year during the regular school day.

- Grade 9 to Grade 10 must earn **six** units of credit.
- Grade 10 to Grade 11 must earn **thirteen** units of credit.
- Grade 11 to Grade 12 must earn **twenty** units of credit.

Rank is based on an average of final marks in all courses beginning with 9th grade. All members of the senior class are included in the ranking. Grade point averages are calculated on a traditional 4.0 scale. Honors/advanced courses, denoted by one asterisk, are weighted with an additional half point in computing GPA. Advanced Placement (AP) and Career and College Promise (CCP) courses, denoted by two asterisks, are weighted with one additional quality point.
