Dance: Be prepared with a 1-2 minute piece of original choreography

Vocal Performance: Be prepared with a piece to perform

Instrumental: Be prepared to perform a piece during your interview

FACS: Can bring in pieces you've created that pertain to the category (must be able to carry in one load, by yourself)

Math: You will be asked to complete math problems as part of the interview

Speech/Theater Arts/Forensics: Have a piece prepared

English: Attach original works or pieces you've written to your application - without them you will not be interviewed.

Visual Arts: Bring in art work for the judges to see. You must be able to carry it in one load, by yourself.
