CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES
December 1, 2025

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brandley.

The flag salute was led by Mayor Brandley.

Mayor Brandley announced that the meeting was in compliance with the Sunshine Law.

Council Persons present: Jordan, Angelucci, Cairns, MacGregor, Wright and Valianti.

Council went over the Engineer's report with Shawn Seroka from Key Engineers.

Council went over the tentative agenda for the Council Meeting.

Discussion Items:

There were no items for discussion.

Old Business-

Updating Upcoming Events on Calendar/App- Reminder to forward all town events and app.

Green Team-The Green team is looking at installing trash cans on the White Horse Pike in front of Dollar General and CVS. Borough CFO, Bonnie Taft, said she would look at the budget and see if funds are available to purchase the trash cans.

Councilman Jordan made a motion to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Council President MacGregor. All in favor-motion carried.

Shirienne Kirk-113 W. Parke Ave-Brought a bag of sawdust from the tree that cut down on W. Clinton Ave. Why was this a last minute discussion and why wasn't the public notified. Councilman Angelucci explained that the tree removal is part of the repair to the sidewalk on W. Clinton Ave.

Jessica Bader-609 Newton Ave-Asked about the trees being removed on Kendall Blvd. It was explained to Ms. Bader that Kendall Blvd is a County road and that the tree removal is being done by PSE&G as their wires run along that road.

Eric Bader-609 Newton Ave.-Asked if the trees on Kendall Blvd. are going to be replaced. Superintendent of Public Works Chris Marcucci said that it is his understanding that they are going to replace the trees.

Lois Giovacchini- 5 Laurie Lane-As Chair of the Shade Tree Committee she would expect the Borough to communicate better with the volunteers. The tree on W. Clinton Ave. should not have been taken down. Councilman Angelucci explained to Ms. Giovacchini that he explained to the Shade Tree Committee and the Green Team that he did in fact forget to notify them and was apologetic. He also explained to Ms. Giovacchini that the correct way to view her opinions to Council is not to take to social media and berate the employees and elected officials.

Bill Stauts-5 E. Haddon Ave.- Asked Mayor and Council to review the overnight parking ordinance and change it so that residents with parking permits can only park on the street they reside on. Borough Solicitor Timothy Higgins said that would not be acceptable.

Chelsea Gittle-45 E. Bettewood Ave.-Asked Chief Jones how did the police department notify residents that overnight parking was suspended for Thanksgiving weekend? The Chief said that they posted it on their Facebook page. Ms. Gittle asked that next time it be posted in the app and on the website for people that do not do social media. Chief Jones said that she would make sure next time that it is and apologized for not thinking about that.

Kelly Peters-34 Kendall Blvd.-Ms. Peters said that she moved here in 2017 and could not find any information for new residents. Councilman Jordan explained that there is a new residents packet on the website but he will take a look at it and see if it needs to be updated.

Kamilah Clarke-210 E Haddon Ave-Ms. Clarke asked if there is a way to get information out to new residents. Councilman Jordan said that the Borough is looking into ways to do that.

Being there was no further discussion, Council President MacGregor made a motion to close the meeting to the public, seconded by Councilwoman Cairns. All in favor-motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned by motion of Council President MacGregor, seconded by Councilman Jordan. All in favor; motion carried.
