COUNCIL MEETING

June 9, 2026

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brandley.

The flag salute was led by Mayor Brandley.

Mayor Brandley announced that the meeting was in compliance with the Sunshine Law.

Council Persons present: MacGregor, Cairns, Jordan, Wright, Angelucci and Valianti.

The minutes of the May 12, 2026 Council Meeting and the June 1, 2026 Caucus meeting were approved by motion of Councilman Jordan, seconded by Council President MacGregor All in favor-motion carried.

Treasurer's Report-Councilwoman Cairns read the May 2026 treasurers report which was approved by motion of Councilman Jordan, seconded by Councilwoman Valianti. Unanimous roll call vot.

Other Financial reports were approved by motion of Councilman Angelucci, seconded by Council President MacGregor. Unanimous roll call vote.

Committee Reports

PLANNING & ZONING-Councilman Wright reported that at the May Planning Board meeting a variance was approved and the sign ordinance was discussed. The next Planning Board meeting is Thursday, June 18th at 7 p.m.

PUBLIC SAFETY- Councilwoman Valianti read the Police report for the month of May as well as the OEM and Fire Department reports. Overnight Parking permits that renew on July 1st will be valid until December 31, 2027. The permits will then run January to December. The Ben Franklin Bridge will be closed on July 11th in commemoration of it's 250th Birthday.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS & PUBLIC WORKS- Progress is being made at the new Rec Center. The fencing will be completed soon and work has begun on renovating the old train station. Grass recycling has begun. Contractors are not permitted to leave grass clippings at the curb. The Shade Tree Committee met on May 27th. Received a \$1000 grant to plant trees. The "Tree City USA" signs are now up. Working on a page for the website.

RECREATION & AND SENIOR AFFAIRS- The Civic Associations Adult Dinner went very well. Working on the 4th of July Parade. Anyone that wants to participate please reach out to the Civic Association. The PTA's yard sale was June 6th and was a great day for all.
