Bill Stauts-5 E. Haddon Ave.-Having an overnight parking issue in front of his residence. Chief Jones said that she would look into it.

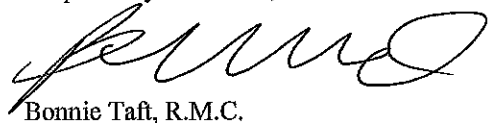
