Diploma Designations

Scholar Designation

In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must

- Earn 1 credit in each of the following courses:
 - Algebra 2 or an equally rigorous course
 - statistics or equally rigorous mathematics course
 - chemistry or physics
 - a course equally rigorous to chemistry or physics
 - an AP, IB, AICE, or a dual enrollment course (1.0)
- Earn 2 credits in the same world language
- Earn a passing EOC score for the following subjects:
 - Geometry
 - Biology 1*
 - U.S. History*

*A student is exempt from this requirement if the student is enrolled in an AP, IB, or AICE Biology 1 or U.S. History course and the student takes the respective AP, IB, or AICE assessment AND earns the minimum score to earn college credit.

Merit Designation

Meet the standard high school diploma requirements

- Attain one or more industry certifications from the established list (per s. 1003.492, F.S.)

Biliteracy Designation

- Has earned 4 foreign language course credits in the same foreign language with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale.

or

- Has achieved a qualifying score on nationally recognized foreign language assessment.

For Gold Seal: A level 4 or higher on the grade 10 ELA FAST is also required as well as an advanced low level or higher.

CTE Pathways

CTE courses contain rigorous academic curriculum and performance standards and may be designated as honors courses. Some courses count toward science, while all of those offered at KWHS meet the practical/fine art/speech/CTE credits required for high school graduation.

Many CTE students earn industry certifications, which make them more employable. Industry certifications may be used to earn college credits and meet requirements for high school graduation.

CTE courses must be taken in progression, while some are eligible to be taken concurrently.

Students who take at least three courses in a program may be eligible for the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars Award.

Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) 2025-26

Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education.)

1. Submit the *Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA)* no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
2. Graduate with a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent.
3. Achieve the required weighted 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses.
4. Complete at least three (3) full Career and Technical Education credits
5. Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in Career and Technical Education credits.
6. Complete at least 30 volunteer service hours, 100 paid work hours, or a combination that equals a minimum of 100 total hours. For students entering grade 9 in the 2024-2025 school year and thereafter, 75 hours of volunteer service must be completed.
7. Achieve the required minimum scores on one of the college entrance exams per the chart below no later than August 31 of the year the student graduates from high school.

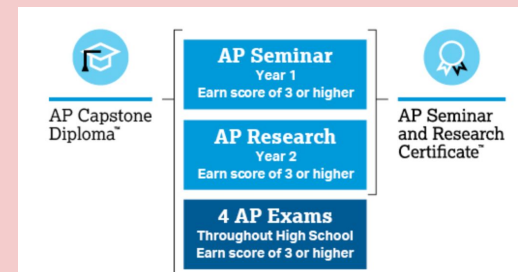

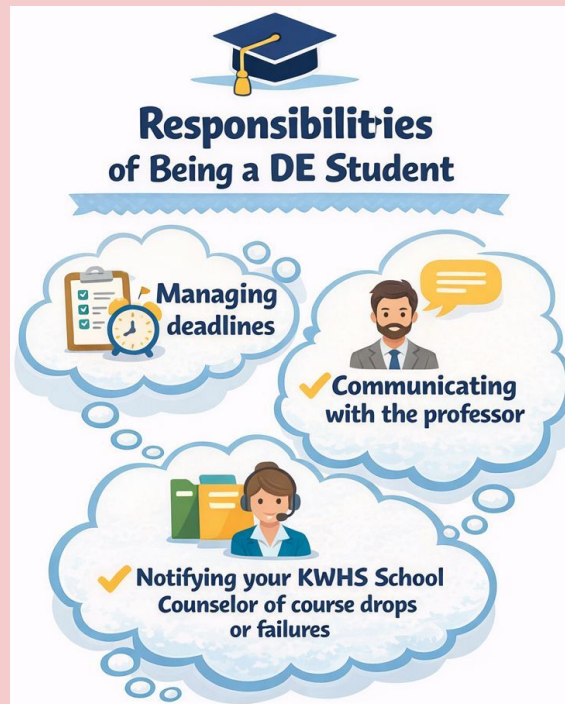
Dual Enrollment

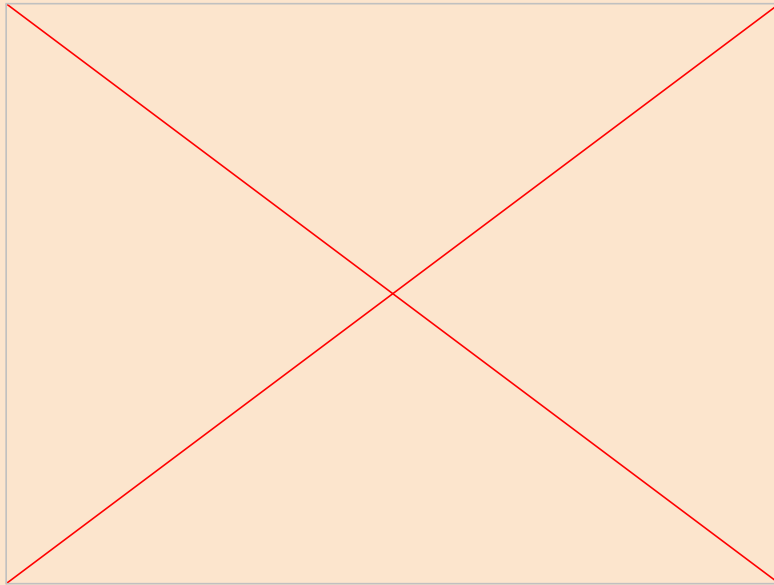

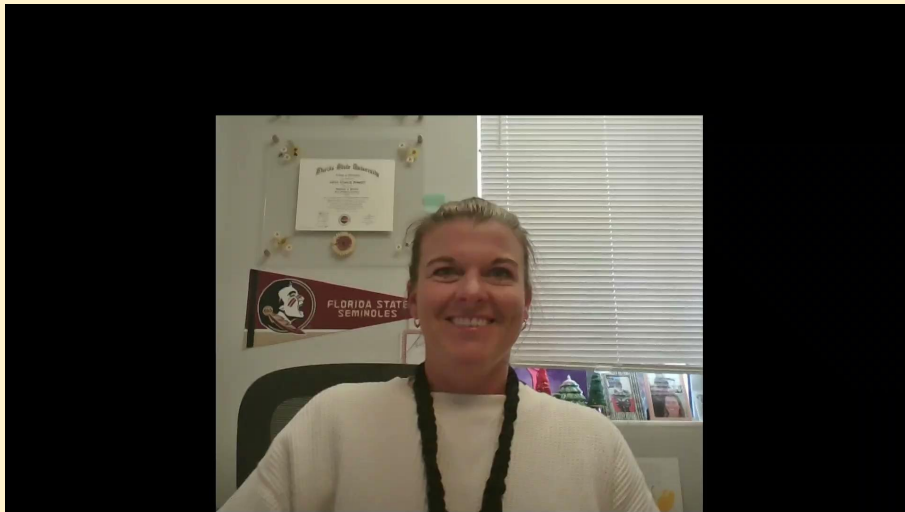

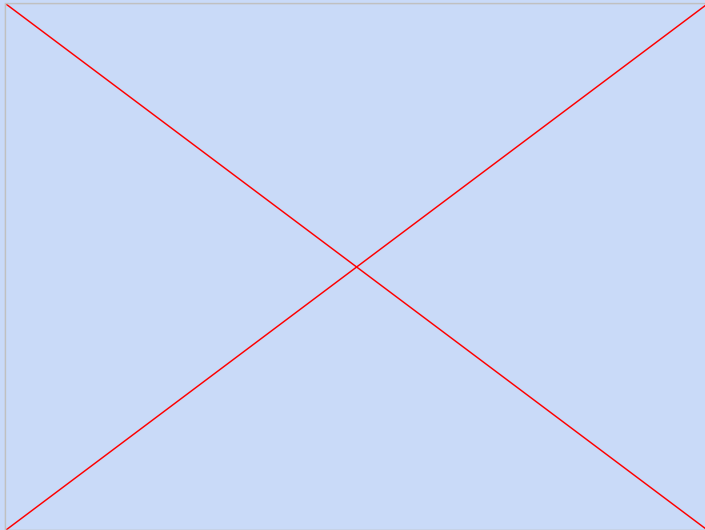

Step 3: You will be required to pick six elective courses but will only be scheduled into three based on availability.

Elective selections and course planning will be completed with your School Counselor starting the week of February 23, 2026.

Failure to meet with your School Counselor to complete this process will result in selections being made for you.
