ADMINISTRATION REPORTS

1. Law Enforcement Report

Sheriff Rigg reported there was more park activity, that Petals was broken into a few weeks ago and the robber from the recent armed robbery at Circle K was caught.

2. Village Staff Reports

Trustee Gruenewald inquired about the status of the Westerman issue and Village Attorney Moredock replied that settlement is an option and recommended it should be discussed at the next closed meeting, and all agreed.

Trustee London asked about an OSHA corrective action in the Public Works Director's report. Public Works Director Fowler said there was a surprise inspection on May 12 and all went well except gas cans were not kept in nonflammable cabinets and the type of cans used were not approved cans. Both issues have since been addressed and resolved, and all else passed inspection. He also reported that his staff swept the Village twice, is very happy with the new sweeper and they can almost do the whole village in one day now.

Trustee Shaw asked about the visit to the Sears/Bergners locations and how did it go. Trustee Gruenewald said it is a possibility, but much structural work would need to be done. Administrator Strohl has not received any feedback yet.

NEW BUSINESS

1. ORDINANCE NUMBER 2021-7, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE TEMPORARY USE OF 110 WEST WEAVER ROAD AS A C-1 SPECIAL USE (CHURCH) THROUGH NOVEMBER 30, 2021 (COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR SMITH)

Community and Economic Development Coordinator Smith summarized the request from Pastor Jeffery L. Ziegler of Cornerstone Church for temporary use of 110 W. Weaver Road for church purposes until November 30, 2021. The congregation is approximately 15 people. Trustees discussed and questioned the safety of the building for this purpose along with egress to the property. There was also concern that the church staff had already put up a sign and occupied the building before receiving Village permission. Trustees agreed to have Village Building Inspector inspect the building before moving forward with approval.

The Board agreed to table the issue until the next Board meeting.

2. ORDINANCE NUMBER 2021-8, AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF FORSYTH, MACON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, TO BORROW FUNDS FROM THE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY LOAN PROGRAM (VILLAGE ENGINEER FOSTER)

Village Engineer Foster summarized the IEPA loan details for Well 7 with the total being \$978,460 which covers the entire project. He further outlined the entire process and reconfirmed that by approving this authorization we are not locked into anything at this point. He also discussed the potential for loan forgiveness but was not hopeful that forgiveness would occur in the future. This is a very low interest loan and would be beneficial to the Village. General discussion ensued.

3. RESOLUTION NUMBER 2-2021, A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR EXPANDING REMOTE ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS HELD PURSUANT TO THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT (VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR STROHL)

Administrator Strohl summarized the origin of this resolution that arose from a discussion at the May 4 Board meeting. General discussion ensued, and agreement was reached to approve this resolution.

The quotes were as follows: J Green Electric for \$11,500; Bodine Electric for \$23,750; and Closs Electric for \$18,450. He shared his thoughts on the three quotes and answered Trustee's questions. He recommends J Green Electric as the contractor.

Public Works Director Fowler received two quotes for the work of adding five new Disc Golf Tee Pads to the Village course. He explained this will make the course tougher for advanced players and would help with the competitiveness of our upcoming Disc Golf Tournament on July 23-25, 2021. Quotes were as follows: Hutchins Excavating for \$4,750 and Jess Concrete for \$4,280. He shared his thoughts on the quotes and answered Trustee's questions. He recommends Jess Concrete as the contractor.

Administrator Strohl explained the request for funding is to support a PBA 50 Regional bowling tournament on July 9-11 at Spare Time Lanes. Teri Hamel, Executive Director of the Decatur Convention and Visitors Bureau further explained that the DCVB would be paying \$2,500 of the requested \$5,000 so the Village requested portion is only \$2,500. She explained that there is also a first-time golf package attached to this event which will generate additional revenue as well, and by supporting this with \$2,500 she is hopeful to set a precedent for the future and have this group return to the area. She feels there is significant return on investment and recommends the Board's support. General discussion was held.

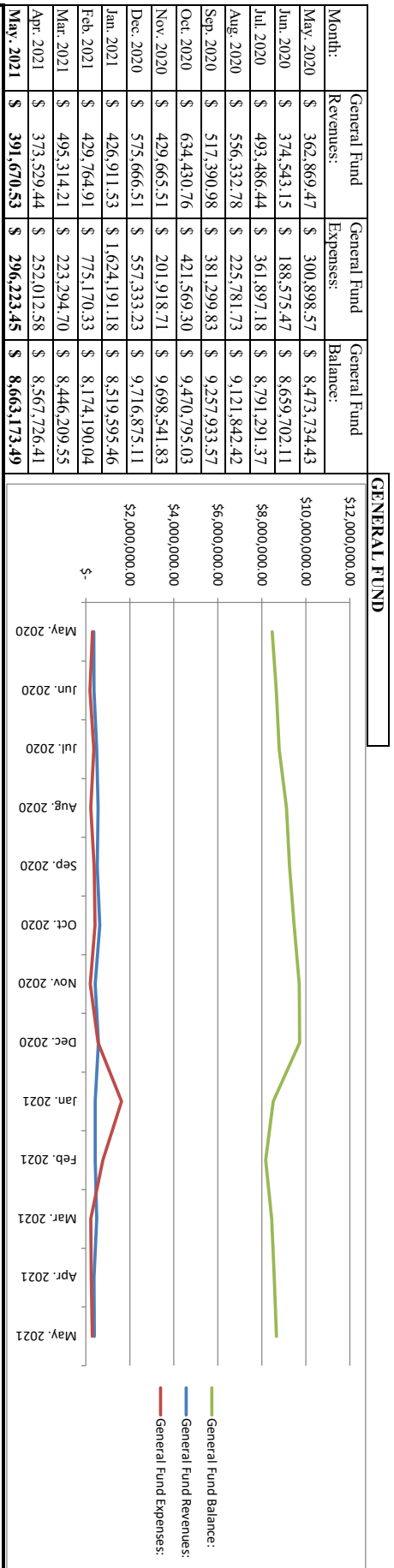

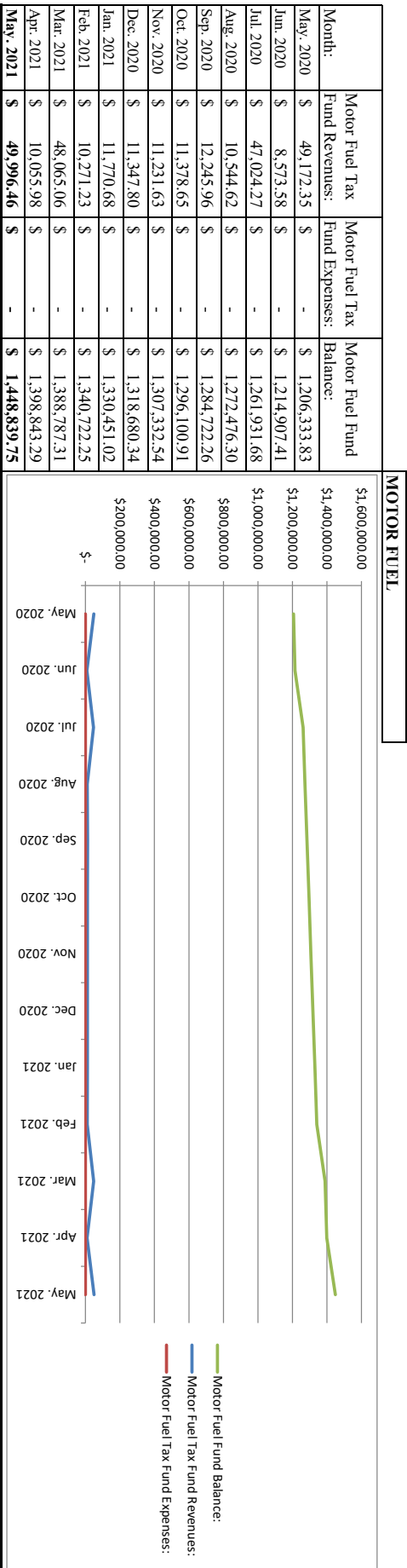

Revenues: Increased when comparing May 2021 with May 2020: Sales tax, state income tax, local use and community center rental fees were higher in May 2021 compared to May 2020. This makes up the majority of the increase.

Expenses: Decreased when comparing May 2021 with May 2020: Equipment maintenance, vehicle maintenance, operating supplies and street maintenance were lower compared to this time last year. This makes up the majority of the decrease.



Revenues: Increased when comparing May 2021 with May 2020: The Motor Fuel Tax and the Transportation Renewal Fund (.19 cents) revenues are received from the state based upon the amount they collect and Village's population. In "May 2020" the Village started receiving the REBUILD Illinois Bond Funds. The Village is to receive two installments for three years and each installment will be \$38,334.12 with a total of \$230,004.72. These funds must be used for capital projects and must be tracked separate from the other MFT funds. In May 2021 the Village received our fourth installment in the amount of \$38,334.12. This making the total received \$153,336.48 for the REBUILD Illinois (plus \$223.24 interest making the total \$153,559.72 for the REBUILD Illinois Bond Fund). In order to spend the Rebuild Illinois funds a resolution needs to be passed similar to MFT. The Motor Fuel Tax were higher compared to this time last year. This makes up the majority of the increase.

Expenses: Remained the same when comparing May 2021 with May 2020: The Village has not used Motor Fuel Tax Funds (MFT) since 2012 (Hickory Point Drive Improvements). Before any MFT Funds can be spent, paperwork must be sent to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for approval. In the past the Village's engineering firm has completed the paperwork. IDOT wants to ensure that the funds qualify for the use of the MFT funds.

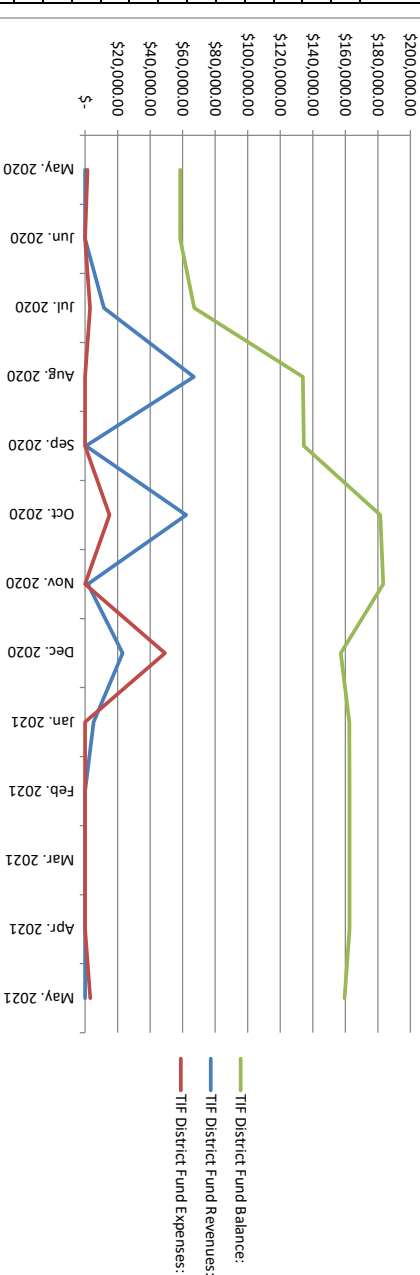

On 06/08/2021 I called again for the local hotel general manager who is out of the office until 06/14/2021. However another staff with the hotel is going to try and get me a contact name and a phone number with corporate. The next step would be to send a certified letter to the Forsyth location reminding them of the Hotel/Motel Tax and what months are past due. With things slowly opening up from the COVID-19 shut down it appears the hotel/motel occupancy stays are having a slight increase. This makes up the majority of the increase.

Expenses: Increased when comparing May 2021 with May 2020: The dugout #1, #2 & #3 roofs and the 2021 Spring/Summer Visitor Guide ad were completed in May 2021. This makes up the majority of the increase.

Economic Development

- Staff continues to monitor commercial properties on US-51, and work with interested parties to assess needs, through TIF and Enterprise Zone incentives and possibilities, and promote development in the Village.
- I have continued to work with Pastor Jeff Ziegler of Cornerstone Church, along with Building Inspector Summers and Public Works Director Fowler, in preparation for a request for temporary use, included in tonight's as continued from the June 1, 2021 Village Board Meeting.

Community Development

- The Village of Forsyth Planning and Zoning Commission will meet on Thursday, June 24, 2021 to discuss two items: potential amendments to the Development Ordinance and a proposed rezoning at 224 Barnett Ave. Currently, the property is zoned OT – Original Town and is being proposed as a R-3 – Multi-family Residential District.
- We have continued to receive a large number of grass complaints and other zoning violations. I, along with the assistance of Public Works staff, have continued to monitor and enforce properties. At this time, the Village has not had to abate any properties as of this report.

Miscellaneous

- Per the last meeting, the Board expressed interest in exploring further use of event pages and social media. Event pages have been created for upcoming sports tournaments and for the Family Fest and have been performing fundamentally well.
- Village Hall was visited by members of the Springdale, Arkansas on their trip north to Normal, IL. Their Senior Planner, Rick Barry, was a resident of Forsyth growing up, and provided a lot of insight and thought on planning processes and parks and recreation.

Project 6928 – Bike Path to Grade School

We are still waiting on IDOT clearances for the hazardous waste, biological and wetland reviews. I continue to discuss these items with the IDOT Local Roads Field Engineer. We will finalize a draft Project Development Report for submittal to IDOT for review once those items are received. It was announced on Wednesday, June 9 that the Village will be receiving \$363,920 in ITEP funding for this project. This was one of nine projects awarded in District 7.

Project 6972 – Phillip Circle & Cale Court Rehabilitation

We still need to wrap up a set of “as-built” plans for the Village records to complete our work on this project. We also intend to enter the as-built information for this storm sewer into the Village’s GIS once it is ready for new information.

Project 7485.01 – Well 7 Subdivision

We are still waiting on the title company the recorded warranty deed for this property, we have been told it will take them 60 to 90 days to wrap up the title policy so it should be here soon.

Project 7542 – 2020 Street Maintenance

We will be combining the sidewalk ramp work in the Schroll Pointe subdivision with the sidewalk ramps in The Greenbrier subdivision, the library sidewalk and a few other places in town into one concrete contract for the Village. This should allow the Village to get the overall best pricing on the work. Patching and cape sealing of the pavement will proceed next year when the City and the County have microsurfacing programs again.

Project 7778 – The Greenbrier Rehabilitation

The sidewalk and other concrete work for the subdivision will be split out into a separate contract. We will proceed with bidding on the rehabilitation project as soon as the concrete contract is in motion.

Project 7893 – 2021 Advisory

IDNR is reviewing the request for reimbursement through the LWCF grant for the park property purchase. They have not provided a time frame for their review, but I have been told they are working on it.

We are waiting on the IEPA to finish their review of the construction permit for changing out the chlorine system at the water treatment plant. Once the construction permit is approved, we will begin to assist Director Fowler starting this work.

We have continued to work on the library sidewalk design. We met with Village staff again had to update the preliminary layout. We will be joining this work with the other sidewalk work being done in the Village this summer.

Project 7981 – GIS Initial Development

Work on the GIS has continued. We have converted the maps and entered the data available into

the system. Stephanie Brown of my office will be attending the Board meeting to do a brief presentation of the GIS.

Project 7982 – Forsyth Park LWCF Grant Compliance

Topographic surveying of the site has started. Design will proceed once topography is complete.

Project 8000 – Well No. 7 Design

Design of the project continues. We continue to proceed with the project with the anticipation of applying for the IEPA loan as previously discussed but will continue to keep an eye out for other funding opportunities if they come available.

RE: Regarding a Temporary Occupancy Request at 110 W Weaver Rd

Previously, Staff had received a request from Cornerstone Church and Pastor Jeff Ziegler to make temporary use of 110 W Weaver Rd as a church. This request was presented at the June 1 meeting of the Village of Forsyth Board of Trustees, where it was tabled with further information required for decision. Specifically, the Board wished for Building Inspector Linn Summers to ensure viability of the property as special use, and ensure that the interior of the building was safe and to municipal standards. Summers, along with Public Works Director Fowler and myself visited the building on 6/2/2021. Summers found that the building was in need of exit signs and do not enter signs at all appropriate doorways, fire extinguishers placed adequately throughout, a maximum occupancy sign at the entry, and carbon monoxide detectors installed appropriately. Summers found all of these items were corrected within the day of inspection.

To reiterate from our last discussion, per 3.6 of the Village of Forsyth Development Ordinance, “The Village Board may authorize the temporary use of a building, structure or parcel of land in any zoning district for a building, structure or use of land that does not conform to regulations prescribed elsewhere in this Ordinance for the zoning district in which it is located, provided however, that such use is of a temporary nature. Such uses shall be granted for a specified period of time and shall be subject to such conditions as the Village Board determines to be necessary for the safeguarding of the public health, safety, and general welfare.”

Also, per request of the Board, all parties have been notified of dissatisfaction of the Village with beginning operations before checking in with the Village, and were cooperative to make changes to move towards correct process.

I have attached the letter requesting this temporary use following this memorandum, and an ordinance approving the temporary use of 110 W Weaver Rd as a church through November 30, 2021. As all items have been inspected and corrected, Staff recommends approval of this request for Temporary Use.

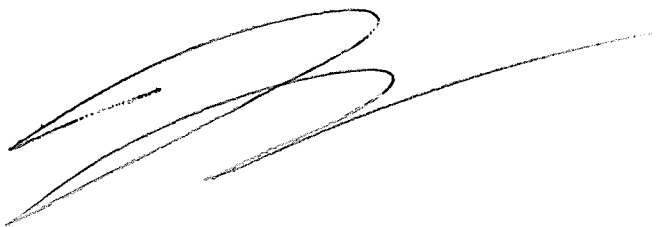

**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE TEMPORARY USE OF 110 W WEAVER RD AS
A C-1 SPECIAL USE (CHURCH) THROUGH NOVEMBER 30, 2021**

WHEREAS, the Village of Forsyth ("Village"), Macon County, State of Illinois, is a duly organized and existing municipality operating under and pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, on or around May 21, 2021, Cornerstone Church requested that it be allowed to utilize 110 W. Weaver Rd., Forsyth, IL as a temporary location for its services while work was completed on its permanent building and in no instance later than November 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, 110 W. Weaver Rd. is zoned C-1 Commercial, was previously the location of the Lamar Signs Building, and has been vacant for some time; and,

WHEREAS, the property must be granted a Special Use to operate as a Church in a property zoned C-1 Commercial;

WHEREAS, Section 3.6 of the Development Ordinance allows the Board to grant temporary use variances; and,

WHEREAS, given the temporary nature of the request and use, the Village Board of Trustees and the Mayor of the Village of Forsyth believe it is in the best interests of the Village to grant the requested variance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Forsyth, Macon County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth in this Section 1.

Section 2. Description of the Property. The Property is commonly known as 110 W. Weaver Rd., Forsyth, IL 62535 with Parcel Identification No. 07-07-15-426-002.

Section 3. Variance. From the date of this Ordinance until November 30, 2021, the Property shall be granted a C-1 Commercial Special Use for the temporary operation of Cornerstone Church. All remaining provisions of the Development Code shall remain in full force and effect as they pertain to the Property.

Section 4. Severability. In the event a court of competent jurisdiction finds this Ordinance or any provision hereof to be invalid or unenforceable as applied, such finding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance and the application thereof to the greatest extent permitted by law.

Section 5. Repeal and Savings Clause. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall affect any rights, actions, or causes of action which shall have accrued to the Village of Forsyth prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Effectiveness. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH
THE MAROA-FORSYTH COMMUNITY UNIT SCHOOL DISTRICT #2
REGARDING A SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER**

WHEREAS, the Village of Forsyth (“Village”), Macon County, State of Illinois, is a duly organized and existing municipality operating under and pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, The Maroa-Forsyth Community Unit School District #2 (“District”) provides public education to residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*, enable units of local government to enter into agreements among themselves and provide authority for intergovernmental cooperation; and,

WHEREAS, The District wishes to have a School Resource Officer position in order to build a positive relationship between Police Officers and the youth of the communities of Forsyth, Maroa, and Decatur; and,

WHEREAS, the District is requesting that the School Resource Officer be allowed to operate in the Village in accordance with the terms of the Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit A**; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Village Board of Trustees have determined it to be in the best interest of the Village to enter into the Agreement attached hereto.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Forsyth, Macon County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: Recitals. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Resolution as if fully set forth in this Section 1.

SECTION 2: Approval of Agreement. The Village Board of Trustees hereby approves the School Resource Officer Intergovernmental Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and authorizes the Village President or his designee and the Village Clerk to execute the Agreement and any such necessary accompanying documents to satisfy the terms therein.

SECTION 3: If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Resolution.

SECTION 4: All Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER
INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this ____ day of _____, 2020, by and among the city of MAROA, ILLINOIS (hereinafter referred to as "City"), the village of Forsyth (hereinafter referred to as "Village"), and the Maroa-Forsyth Community Unit School District #2 (hereinafter referred to as "School District") (and collectively "the parties").

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq, enable the parties to enter into agreements among themselves and provide authority for intergovernmental cooperation;

For and in consideration of the mutual promises, terms, covenants, and conditions set forth herein, receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. Purpose. This Agreement establishes and delineates the mission of the School Resource Officer Program (herein referred to as the "SRO Program"), as a joint cooperative effort. Additionally, the Agreement formalizes relationships between the participating entities in order to foster an efficient and cohesive program that will build a positive relationship between Police Officers and the youth of the communities of Maroa, Forsyth, Decatur, and the surrounding areas in addition to reducing crime committed by juveniles and young adults. By placement of a regular and consistent Police Officer (hereinafter referred to as the "SRO"), City, Village, and School District hope to reduce crime and improve trust and communication among School District, Village, City officials and officers, and children within the communities served by City, Village, and School District.

2. Mission. The mission of the SRO Program is the reduction and prevention of school-related violence and crime committed by juveniles and young adults. This is accomplished by assigning Maroa City Officers to School District facilities on an ongoing and regular basis. The SRO Program accomplishes this mission by creating and maintaining safe, secure and orderly learning environments for students, teachers and staff. SRO will establish a trusting channel of communication with student, parents and teachers. SRO will serve as a positive role model to instill in students good moral standards, good judgment, respect for other students and a sincere concern for the school community. SRO will promote citizen awareness of the law to enable students to become better-informed and effective citizens, while empowering students with the knowledge of law enforcement efforts and obligations regarding enforcement as well as consequences for violations of the law. SRO will serve as a confidential source of counseling for students and parents concerning law-related problems they face as well as providing information on community resources available to them. SRO will engage in proactive and preventative communication and education of students and their parents in order to improve trust and relationships between communities and police.

3. **Organizational Structure.**

A. Composition. The SRO Program will consist of one (1) full-time Maroa Police Department Officers, each of whom is a Certified Police Officer and meets all requirements as set forth by Maroa Police Department Rules and Regulations.

B. Supervision. The day-to-day operational and administrative control of the SRO Program will be the responsibility of the Maroa Police Department. Responsibility for the conduct of SRO personnel, both personally and professionally, shall remain with the Maroa Police Department. On a daily basis, each SRO will be expected to collaborate with School District administrators at times and locations scheduled in advance by School District administrators on many issues, including the disposition of various situations School District and SRO may encounter. Each SRO will report to School District administrators; however their ultimate responsibility is to carry out their duties as police officers, as expressed and interpreted through the Police Department chain of command.

C. Relationship of Parties. The City and SRO shall have the status of an independent contractor for purposes of this Agreement. SRO shall be considered to be an employee of the City and shall be subject to its control and supervision. SRO will be subject to current procedures in effect for certified police officers, including attendance at all authorized and required training. This Agreement is not intended to and will not constitute, create, give rise to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business association or organization of any kind between the parties, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be only those expressly set forth in this Agreement. School District and City agree that no person supplied by the School District to accomplish the goals of this Agreement is a City employee and that no rights under City employment, retirement, or personnel rules accrue to such person, and the parties agree that no person supplied by City and/or Police Department to accomplish the goals of this Agreement is a School District employee and that no rights under School District employment, retirement, or personnel rules accrue to such person.

4. **Procedures.**

A. Concept. The SRO Program shall utilize the SRO Triad concept as set forth by NASRO (National Association of School Resource Officers). The SRO Triad concept generally means that the officers assigned to the program are law enforcement officers, law-related counselors and instructors for law enforcement topics. SROs are first and foremost law enforcement officers for the Maroa Police Department. SROs shall be responsible for carrying out all duties and responsibilities of a police officer and shall remain at all times under the control, through the chain of command, of the Maroa Police Department. All acts of commission or omission shall conform to the Maroa Police Department Rules of Conduct. SROs are enforcement officers in regards to criminal matters only and

not enforcers of school regulations. SROs are not school disciplinarians and should not assume this role. SROs report directly to the SRO Police Department supervisor in connection with the assignment of law enforcement instruction and normal law enforcement duties. SROs are not formal counselors, and will not act as such, however, they are to be used as a law-related resource to assist students, faculty, staff, and all persons involved with the School District. SROs are to be used as instructors of law enforcement topics, and will provide instruction when School District requests it under the supervision of a licensed teacher. SROs can instruct on a variety of law enforcement subjects to students and staff, including alcohol and drug education. SROs may use this instruction to build rapport between the students and the staff while under the supervision of a certified teacher.

B. Duties. Police Department responsibilities of the SRO will include, but not be limited to:

1. To enforce criminal law and protect the students, staff, and public at large against criminal activity;
2. Provide information concerning questions about law enforcement topics to students and staff;
3. Speak to students on a variety of law enforcement related topics including, but not limited to, narcotics, safety, public relations, occupational training, leadership, and life skills when the School District requests it and under the supervision of a certified teacher;
4. Coordinate investigative procedures between Police and school administrators;
5. Provide law-related counseling on a limited basis to students, staff and faculty;
6. Handle initial police reports of criminal acts committed on School District campus;
7. Take enforcement action on criminal matters when appropriate, with jurisdiction conferred in both City and Village over students within the School District's charge;
8. Wear an approved police uniform at all times or other apparel approved by the Maroa Police Department;
9. Attend school special events as assigned by the Maroa Police Department in consultation with School District.
10. Comply with the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/22-85, which requires, in part, prior parental notification and reasonable efforts to ensure parental presence if a student is to be questioned by SRO related to suspected criminal misconduct.

C. Enforcement. Although SRO will be placed in a formal educational environment, he or she is not relieved of official duties as an enforcement officer. Decisions to intervene formally will be made by SRO when it is necessary to prevent any criminal act. Citations should be issued and arrests made when

appropriate and in accordance with Police Department standard operating procedure.

5. Equipment and Working Conditions.

A. City and Village Responsibilities. City shall provide one (1) SRO police Officer who have received appropriate and specific specialized training necessary to serve as a school resource officer. Each officer assigned shall be a fully equipped non-probationary Maroa Police Department Officer in good standing. City shall be responsible for assuring SRO has necessary and appropriate jurisdiction and support when conducting duties within Village, and Village shall confer necessary jurisdiction and authority upon SRO at any time necessary to perform actions related to his or her duties as SRO within Village territory. Nothing in this agreement shall be read to confer on Village liability for actions of SRO employed and deputized by City.

B. School District Responsibilities. School District shall provide SRO the following materials and facilities, which are deemed necessary to the performance of the SRO's duties:

1. Access to a properly lighted private office, which shall contain a telephone, which may be used for general business purposes;
2. A location for files and records, which can be properly locked and secured;
3. A desk with drawers, chair, work-table, and filing cabinet;
4. Access to and encouragement of classroom participation by SRO;
5. Opportunity for SRO to address teachers and school administrators about the SRO Program, goals, and objectives;

C. Reporting of Serious Crimes. If the investigation uncovers evidence of a serious crime as defined in state and county school system administrative regulations, the school official shall notify the SRO, the student's parent/guardian, and the appropriate school personnel. The SRO officers shall comply with the Illinois School Student Records Act (105 ILCS 10/1 et seq.) A records release will be obtained when required by law, and student records will not be disclosed to any other party except as provided under law or order of court.

6. Time and Place of Performance. City will endeavor to have one (1) SRO available for duty, each placed at the assigned school each day that school is in session during the regular school year. City is not required to furnish substitute officers on days when a regular SRO is absent due to authorized leave or Police Department training requirements. The Chief of Police at all times maintains the authority to reassign an officer to other duties, whether on a temporary basis or a permanent basis.

7. Selection and Assignment. School District and City understand and agree that the unique and special circumstances of serving as SRO in a school requires the

assignment of an officer with unusual sensitivity to working with children. It is mutually agreed that the parties will cooperate in the selection and assignment of a officer whose experience, education, training, and disposition is appropriate to the nature of work inside a school. Should an appropriate officer not be available or should School District and City be unable to agree upon the selection of an officer, the parties agree that this agreement may be suspended by either of them, waiving and discontinuing payment for such time until a mutually acceptable officer may be selected or this agreement expires.

8. Evaluation. It is mutually agreed that School District shall evaluate annually the SRO Program and the performance of SRO with forms developed jointly by the parties. The evaluation shall be shared with the Chief of Police. It is further understood that the School District's evaluation of each officer is advisory in nature and that the Maroa Police Department retains the final authority to evaluate the performance of the SROs.

9. Consideration/Reimbursement. The parties agree this Agreement is mutually beneficial, enabling the Maroa police to build better relationships with the community and reduce crime in consideration for the School District's receipt of protective, investigative, and preventative support services. The School District shall reimburse City for the partial cost of two (2) SROs for the SRO program. Accordingly, the cost set forth herein is the total cost to be paid by the District and is not calculated on an hourly basis or actual time basis but for the program as a whole. The School District shall pay to the City _____ Dollars and No Cents (\$ _____ .00) for the period July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 for the services of SRO as set forth herein. Such cost as set forth hereinabove is agreed by the parties to be the totality of the financial obligation of the School District to the City, payment of which obligation shall constitute satisfactory and complete consideration to compel performance under this agreement.

10. Term of the Agreement. The term of this agreement is three (3) years, commencing on the 1st of July, 2020 and ending on the 30th of June, 2023. This agreement shall not be extended without complete execution in writing of a successor term.

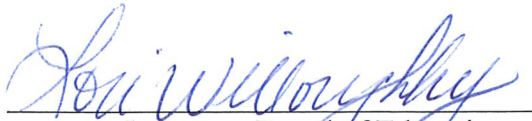

School District agrees to the extent allowed by law to hold the City its agent and employees free, harmless and indemnified from and against any and all claims, suits or causes of actions arising from or in any way out of the performance exclusively of School District employees.

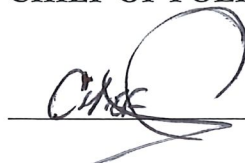

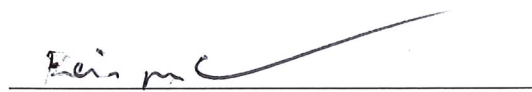

RE: Regarding the 2021 Community Survey

As you are aware, the Village of Forsyth Staff has been working with the Macon County Economic Development Corporation to distribute and now analyze findings from the 2021 Community Survey. Andrew Taylor, Economic Development Officer, is here tonight to discuss findings from the survey, specifically those related to importance and quality of Village programs, but as a brief overview and summary, the following was also discovered through review of the 2021 Community Survey.

The 2021 Survey had a sum total of 297 responses, very similar to the response rate of 20% in 2018. The survey once again was broken into four primary sections: quality of life, government performance, importance and quality of Village services, and demographic information. The following is a summary of the results of the Community survey from 2021, with results from 2018 as a comparison. Accompanying this memorandum is a copy of the full results of the Community Survey for your review and consideration. Please note that the percentages indicated are the percentages of those responding and that not everyone answered every question.

Demographic Information

58.16% of respondents indicated that they were Female and 41.84% indicated that they were Male.

58.30% of respondents indicated that they were age 56 or over, 30.74% indicated that they were age 36-55, and 10.96% indicated that they were age 18-35.

A plurality of respondents (47.41%) indicated that 2 people lived in their household.

A majority of respondents (69.18%) indicated that there were 0 children under the age of 18 living in their household.

44.48% of respondents indicated that they or another member of their household were age 65 or older and 55.52% indicated that neither they nor any other member of their household were age 65 or older.

60.14% of respondents indicated that they live west of Route 51 and north of Weaver Road, 21.01% indicated that they live west of Route 51 and south of Weaver Road, 17.03% indicated that they live east of Route 51 and north of Weaver Road, and 1.81% indicated that they live east of Route 51 and south of Weaver Road.

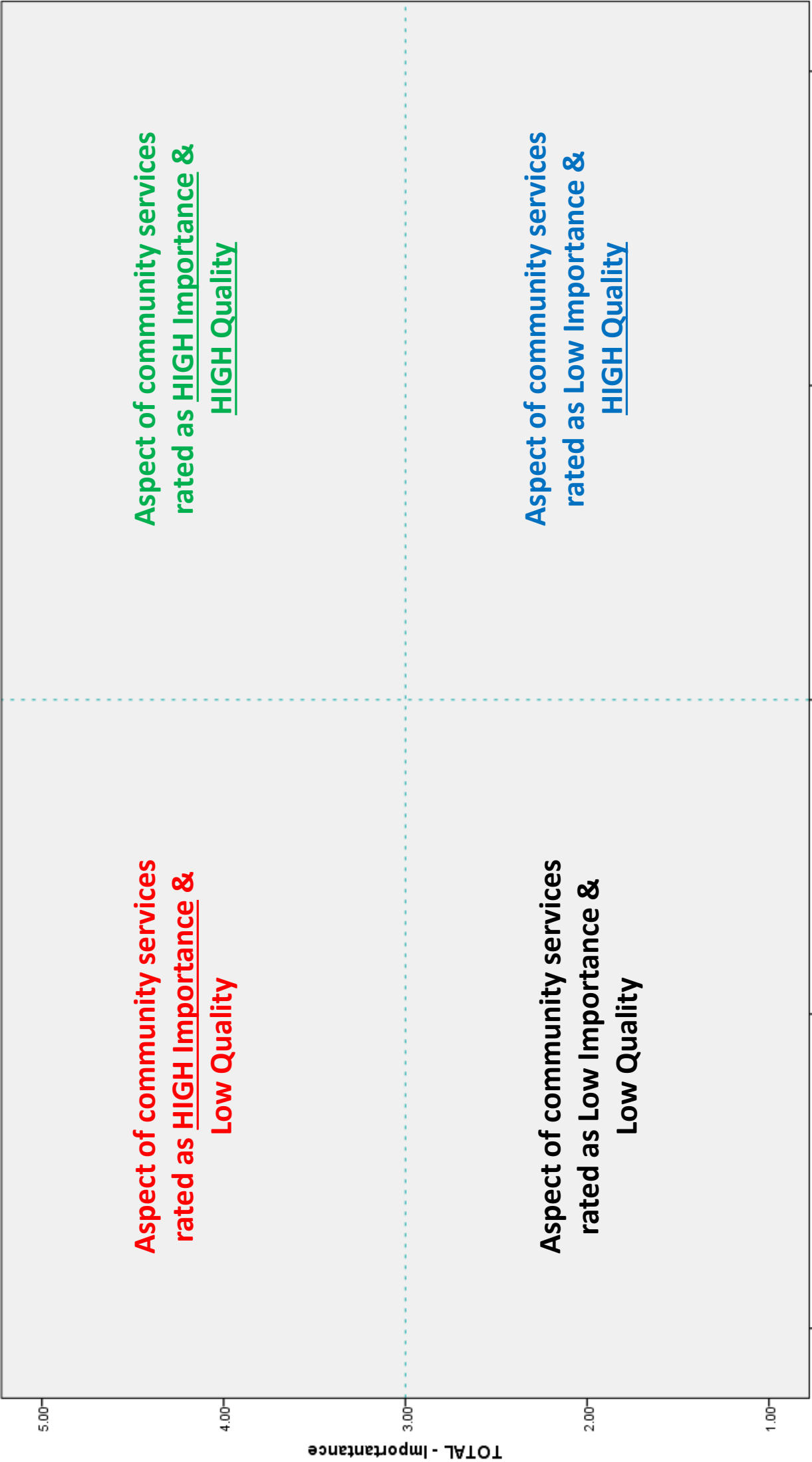
96.75% of respondents indicated that they own their residence and 3.25% indicated that they rent their residence.

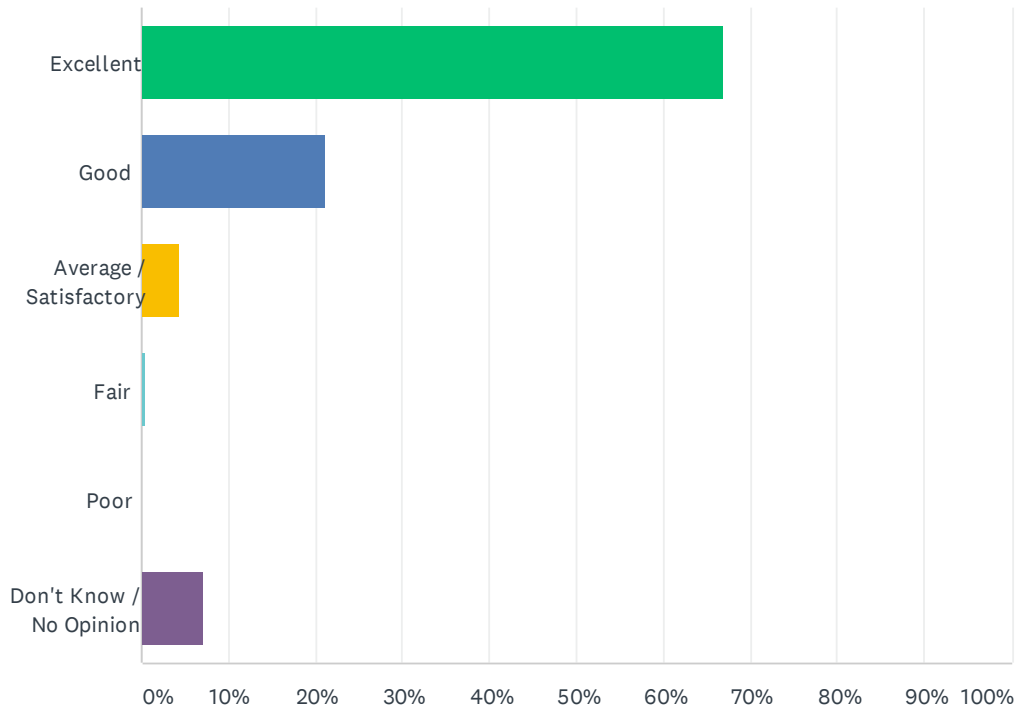

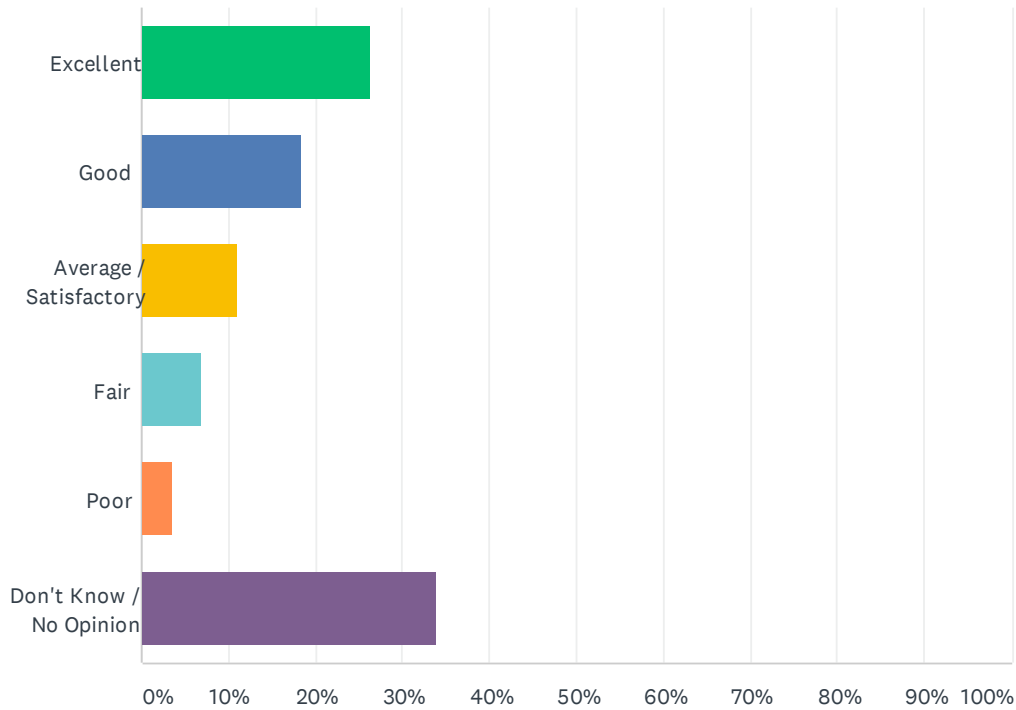

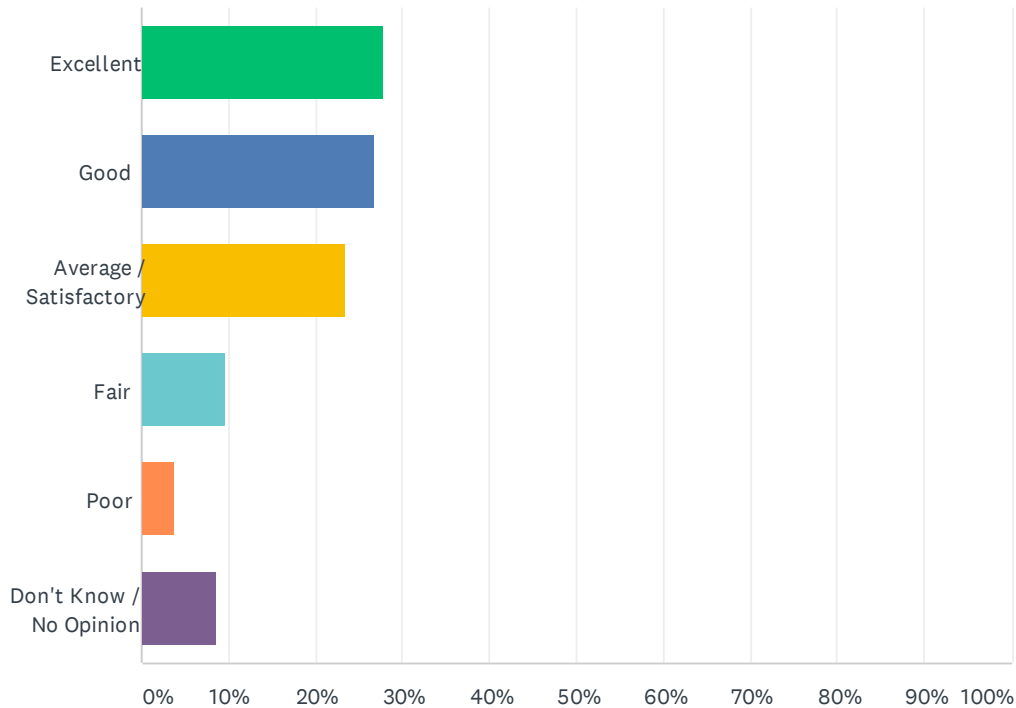

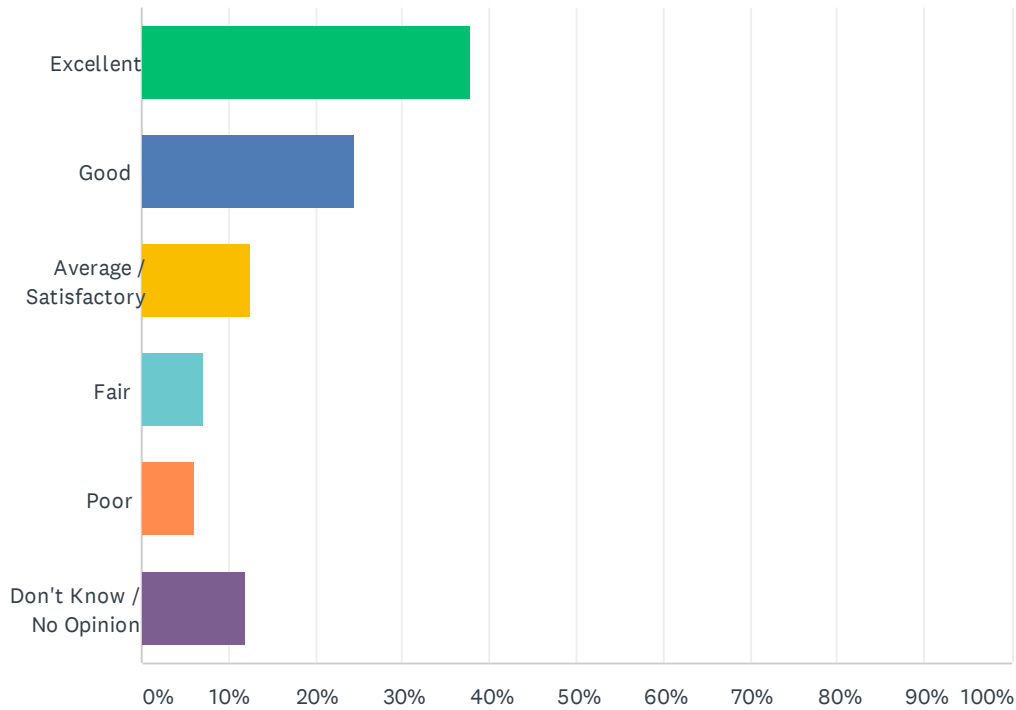

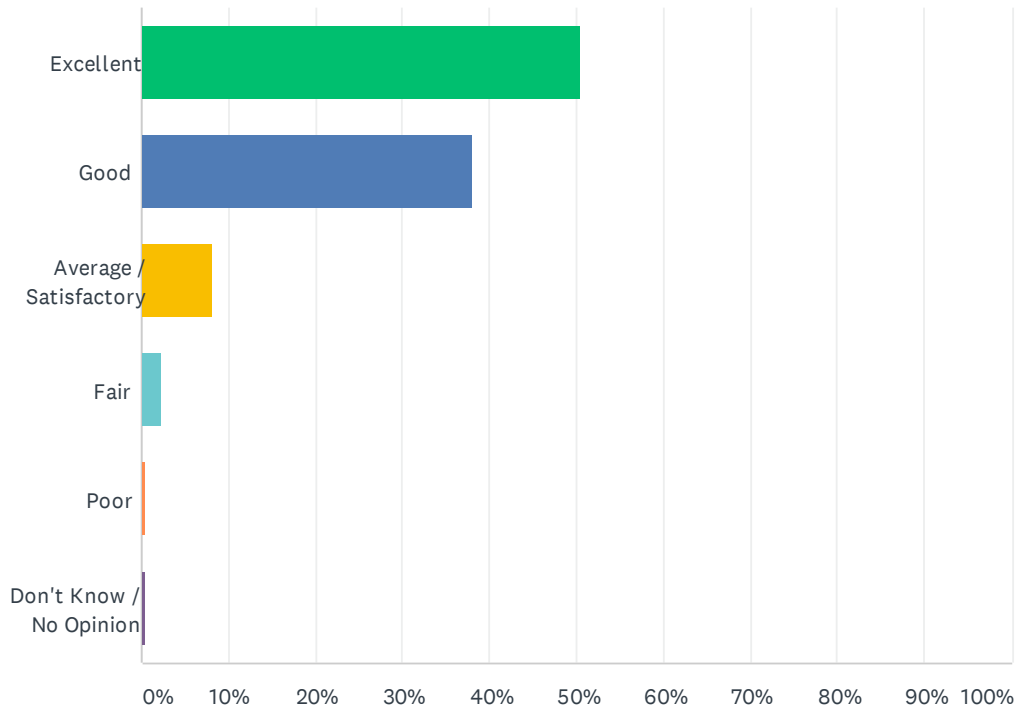

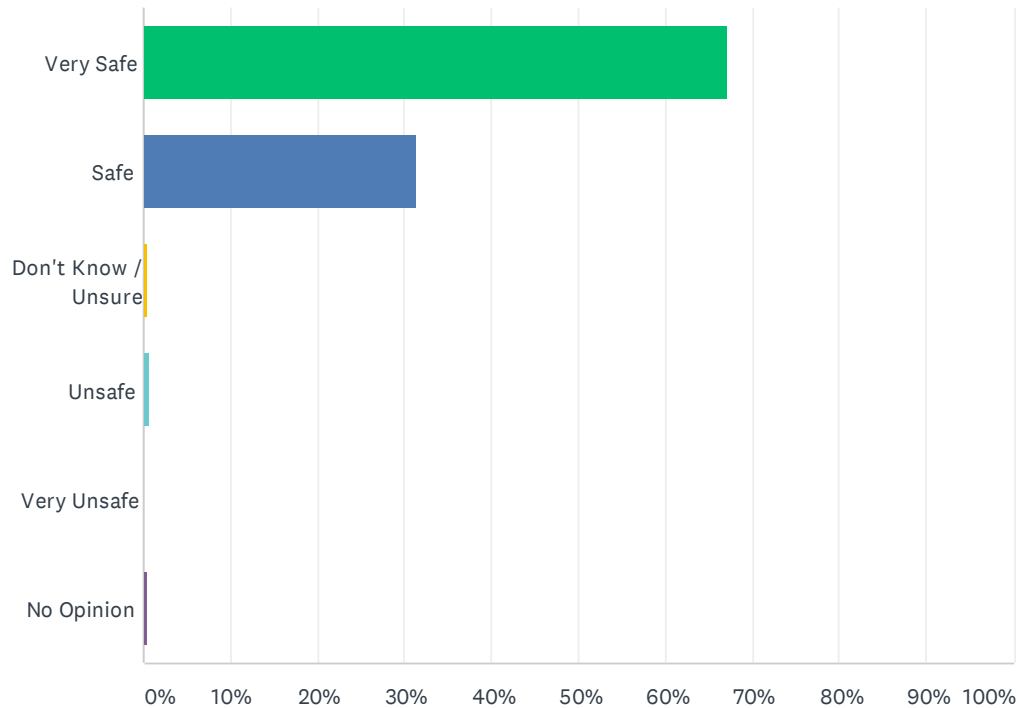

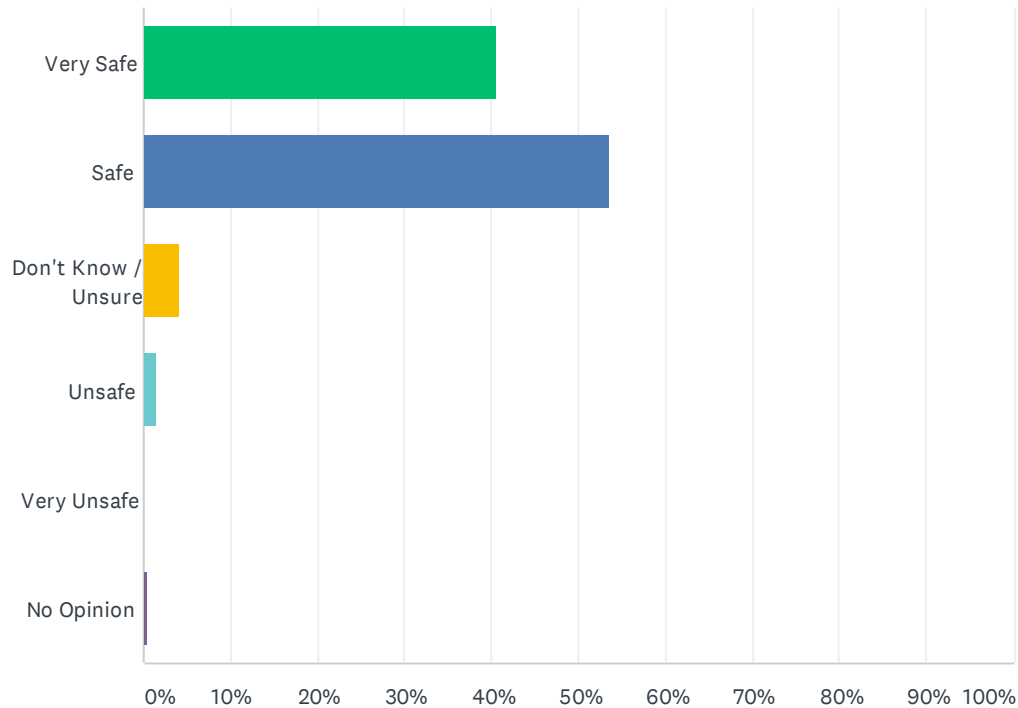

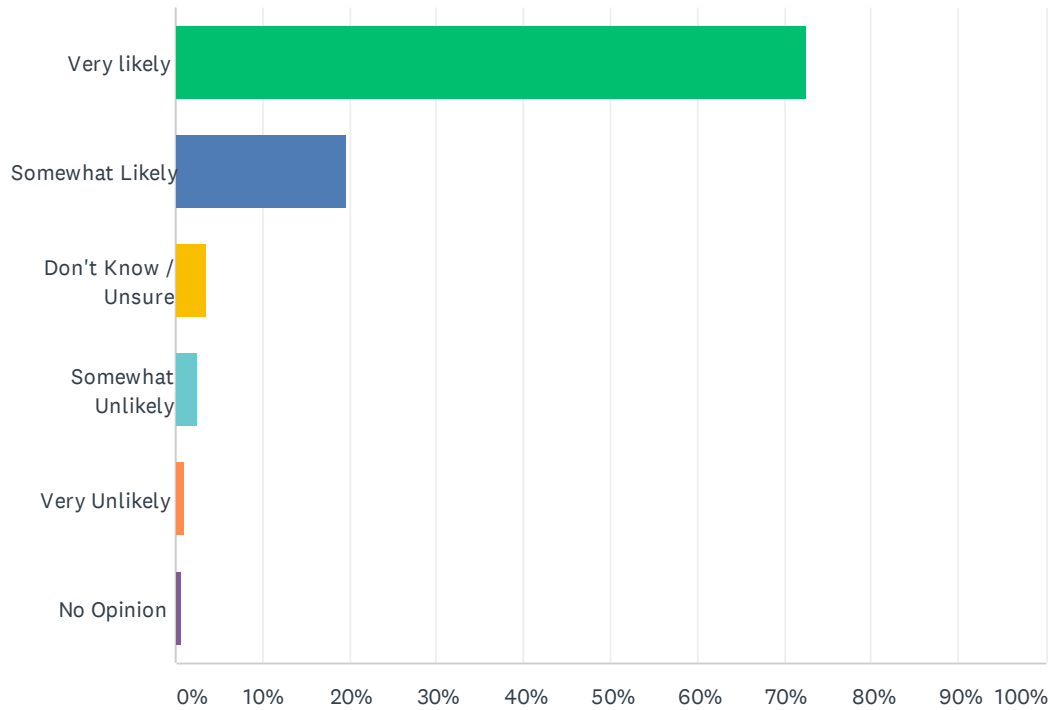

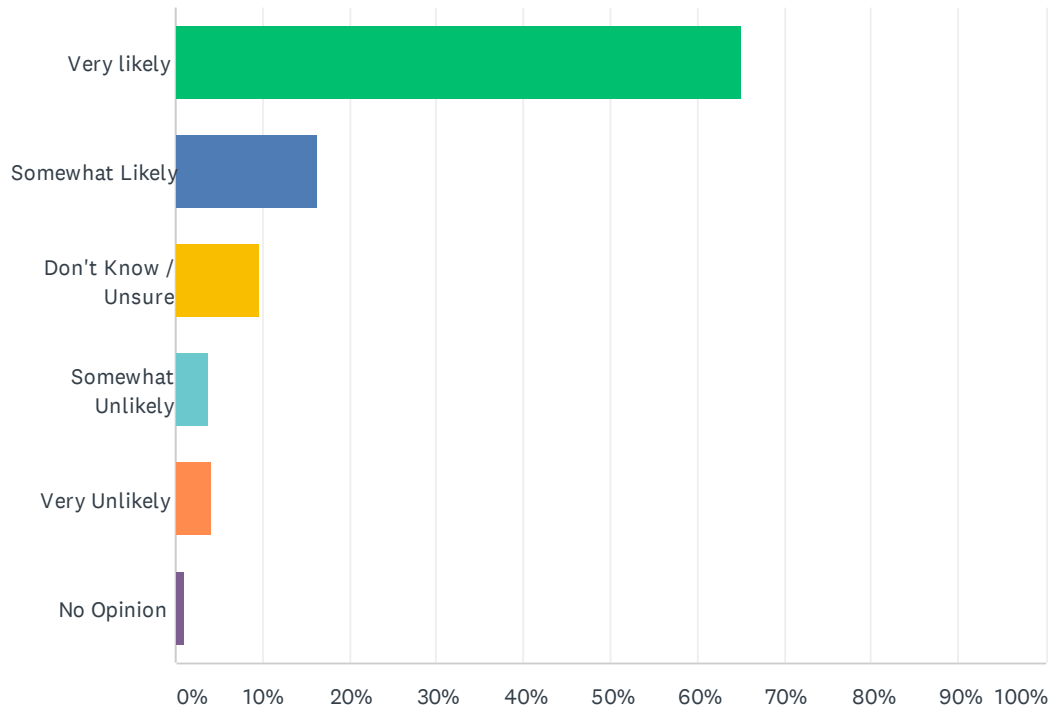

Q11 Remain in Forsyth for the next five years

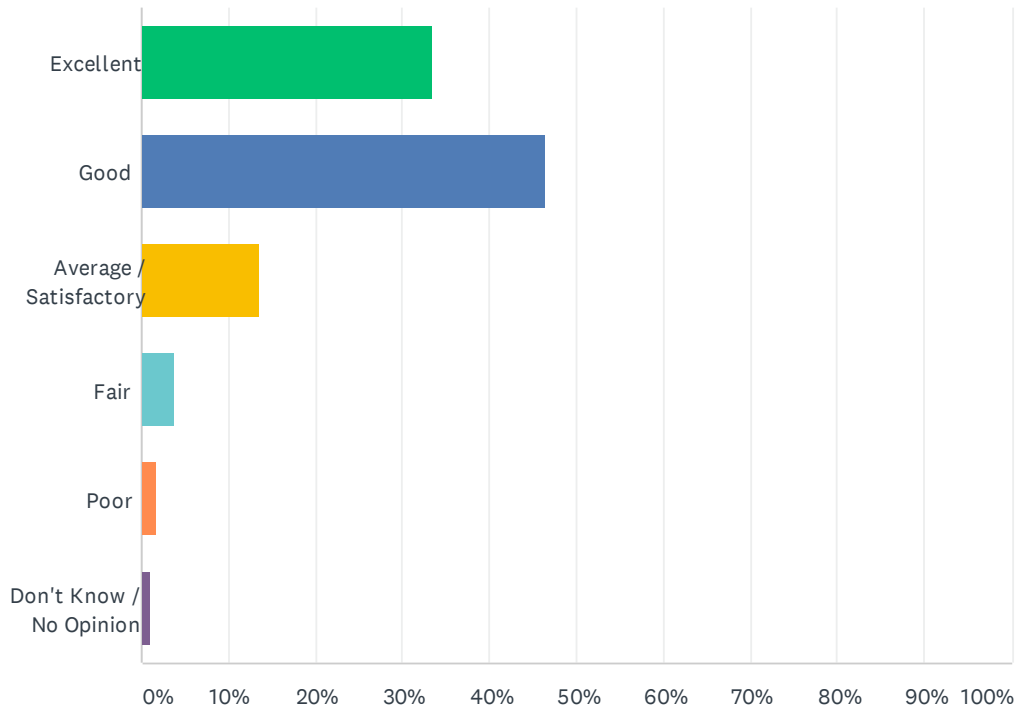

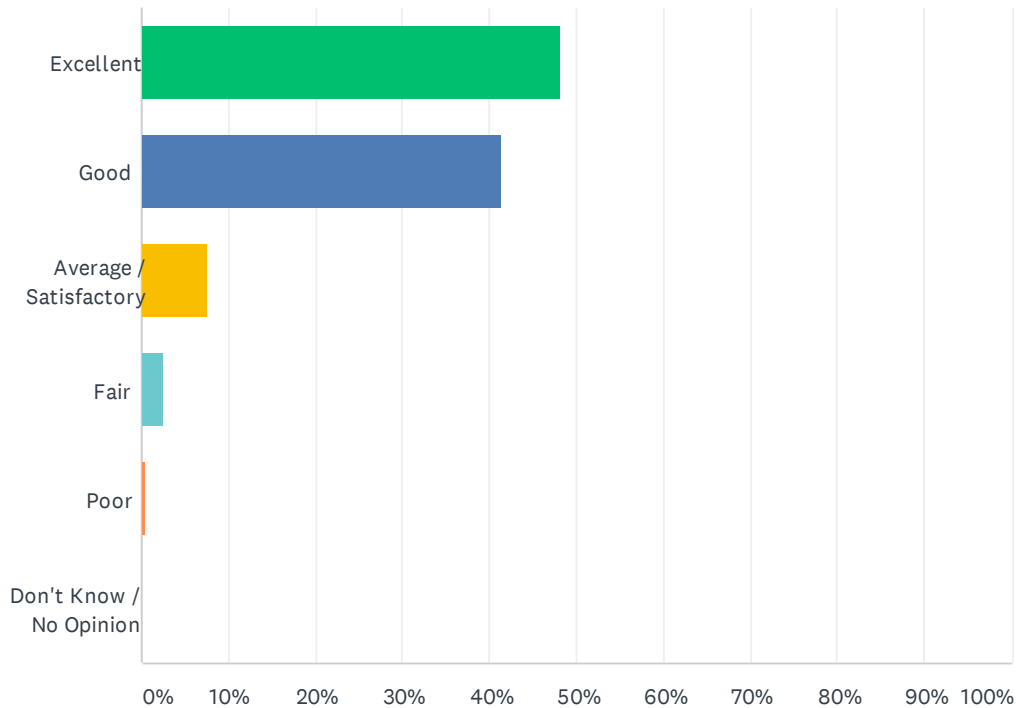

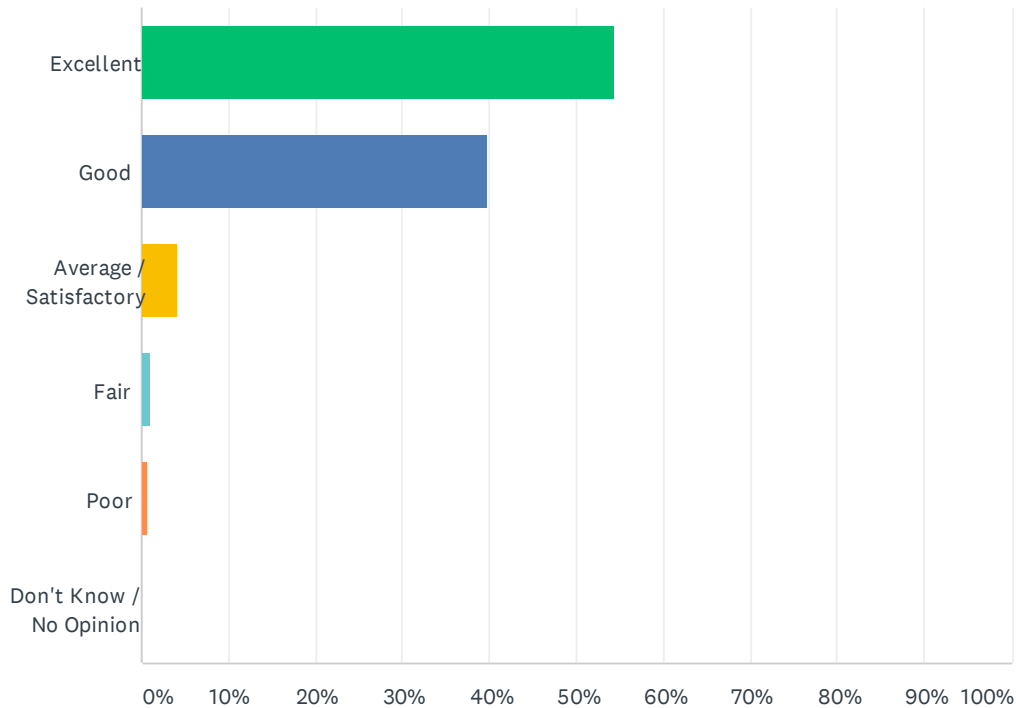

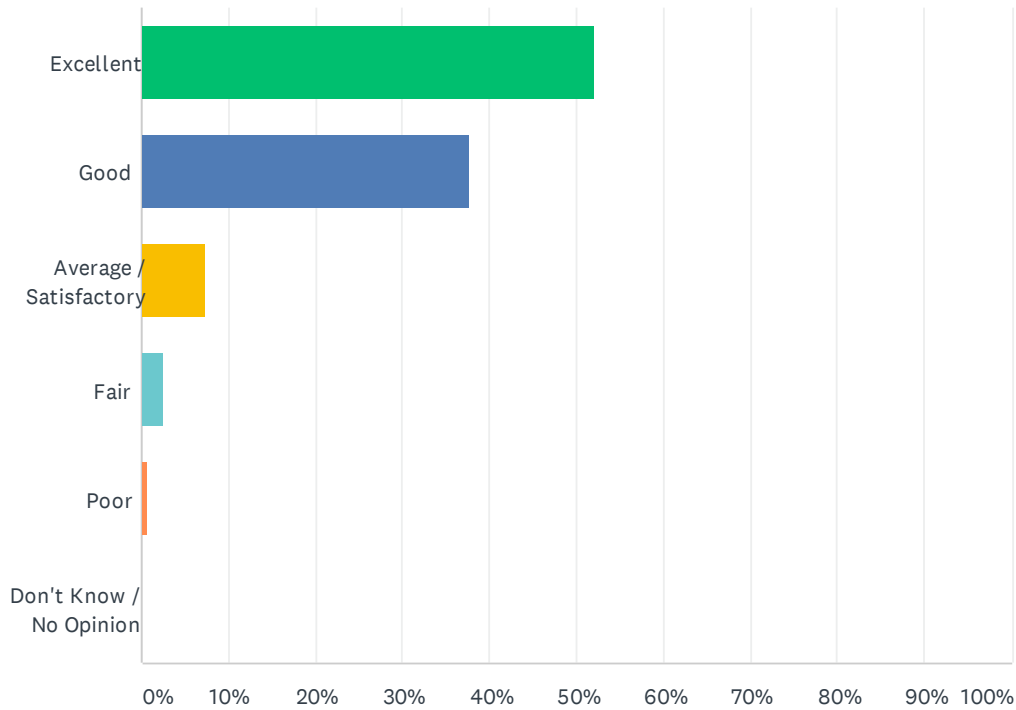

Q15 Overall appearance of Forsyth

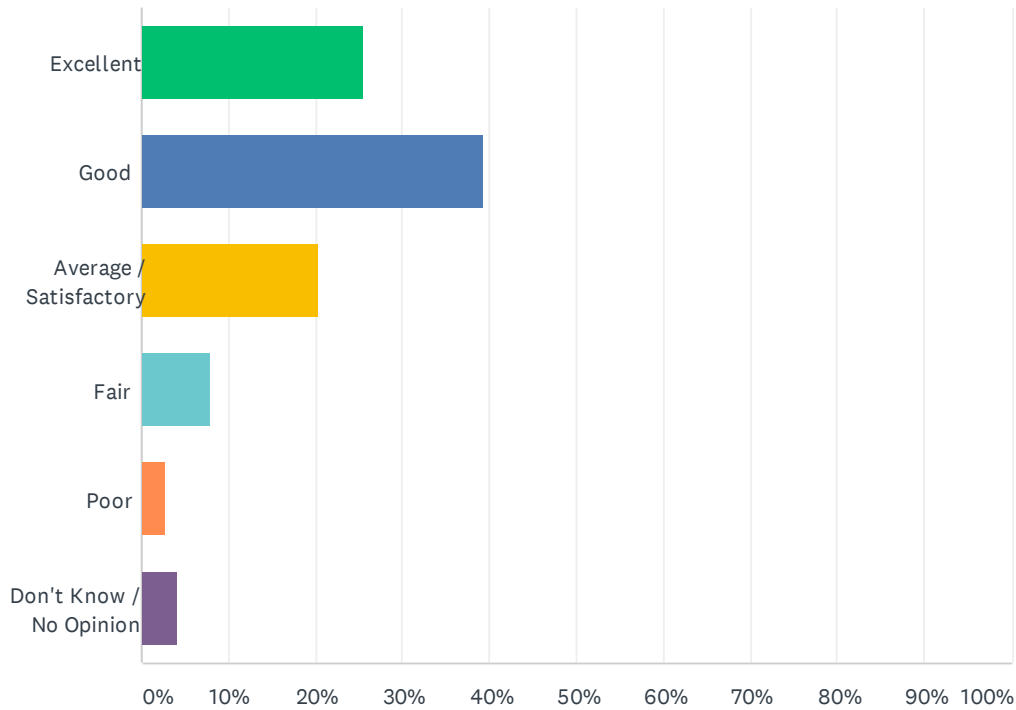

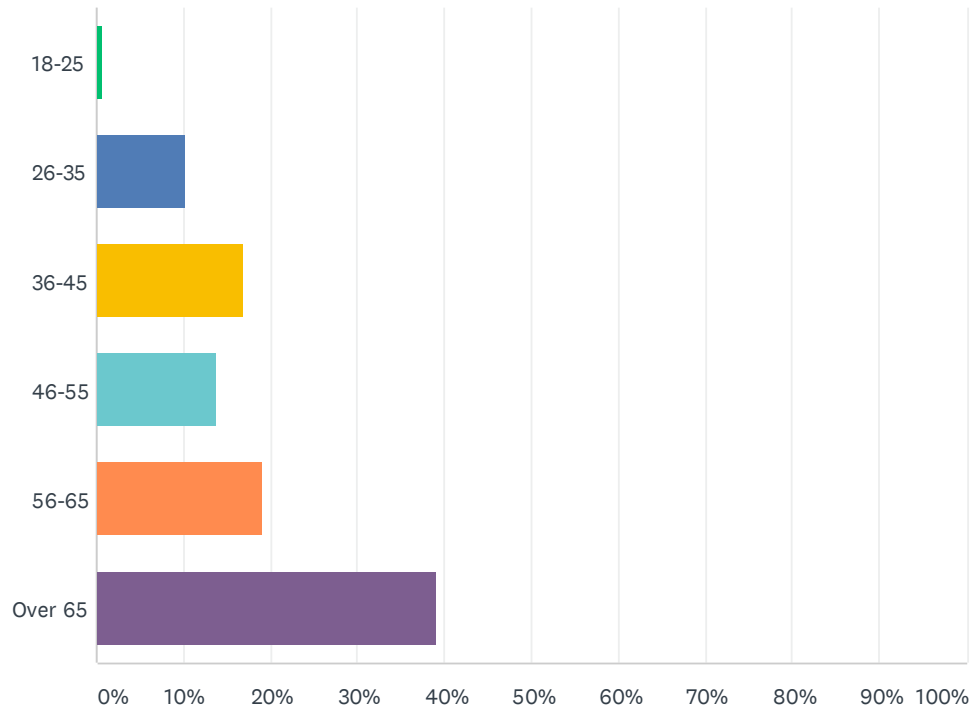

Q89 Which category best reflects your age in years?

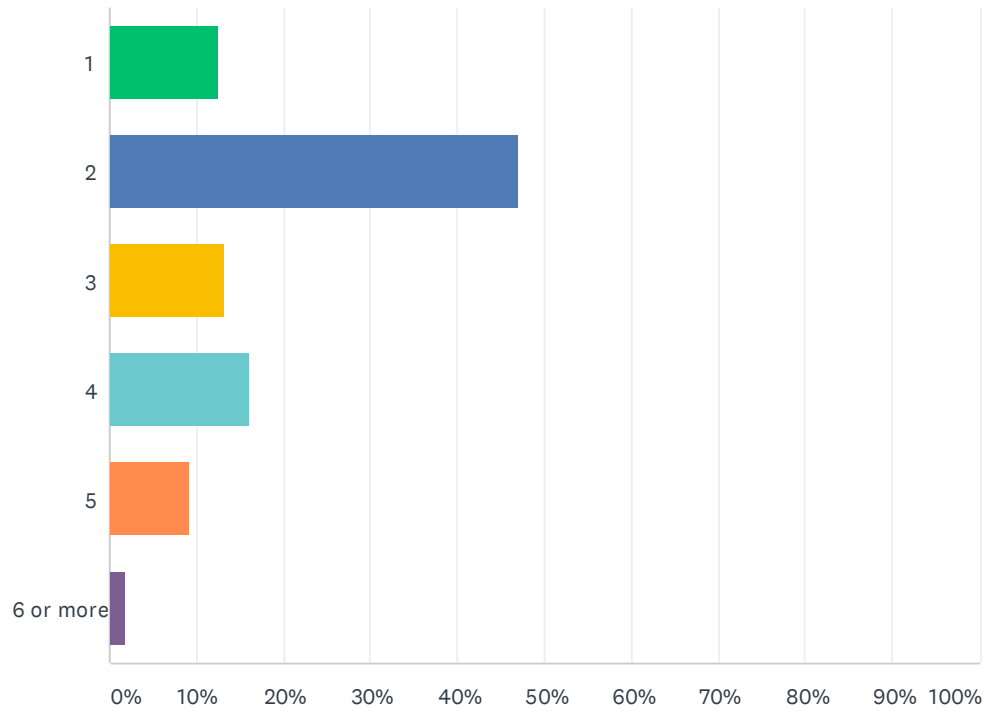

Q90 How many people live in your household?

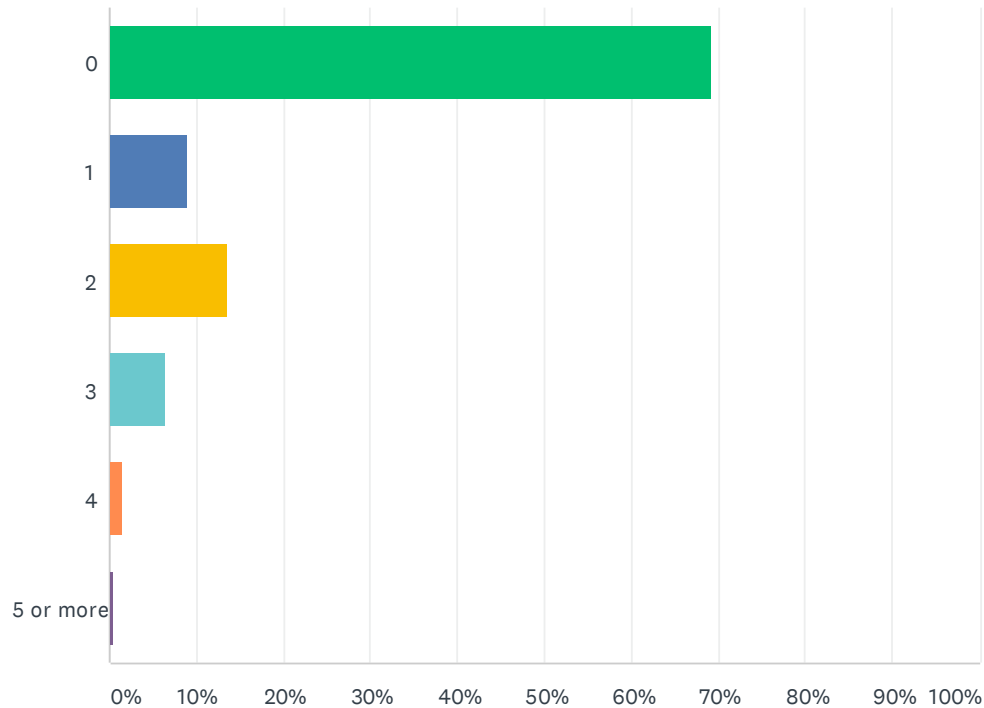

Q91 How many children under the age of 18 live in your household?

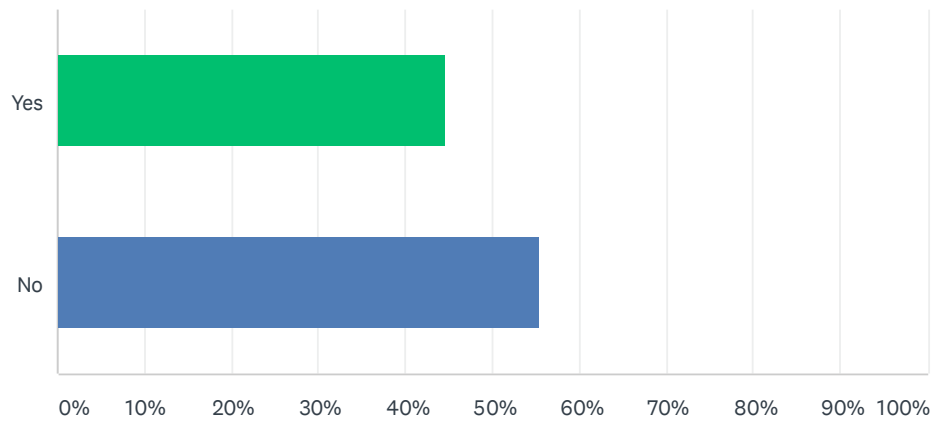

Q92 Are you or any other member of your household age 65 or older?

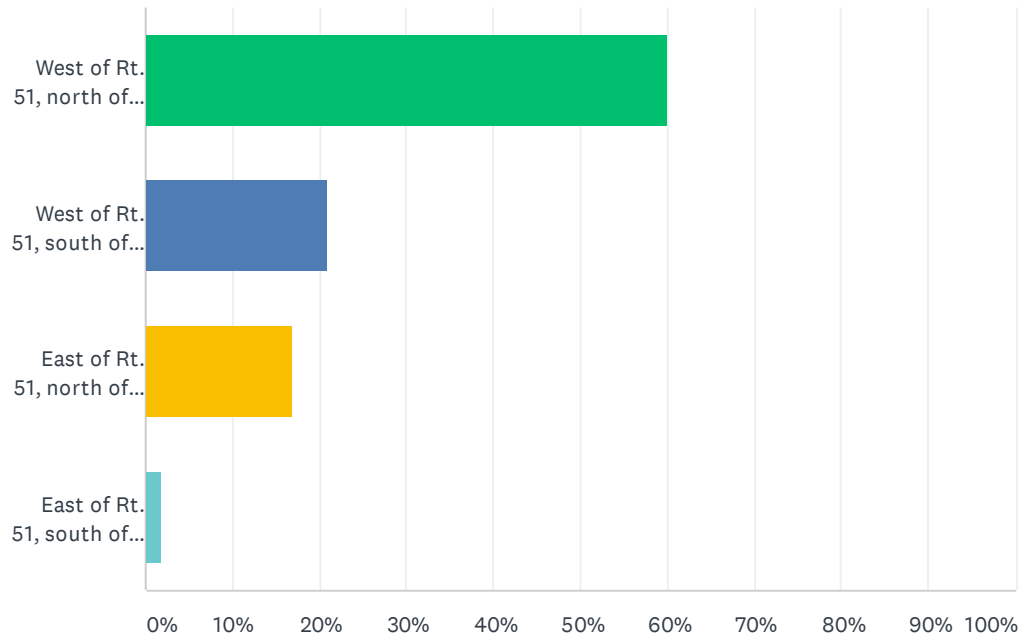

Q93 Please identify the area of Forsyth in which you live:

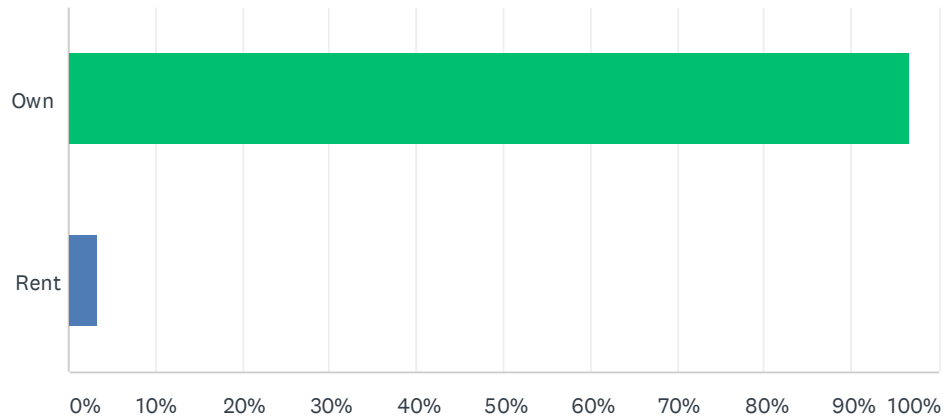

Q94 Do you own or rent your residence?

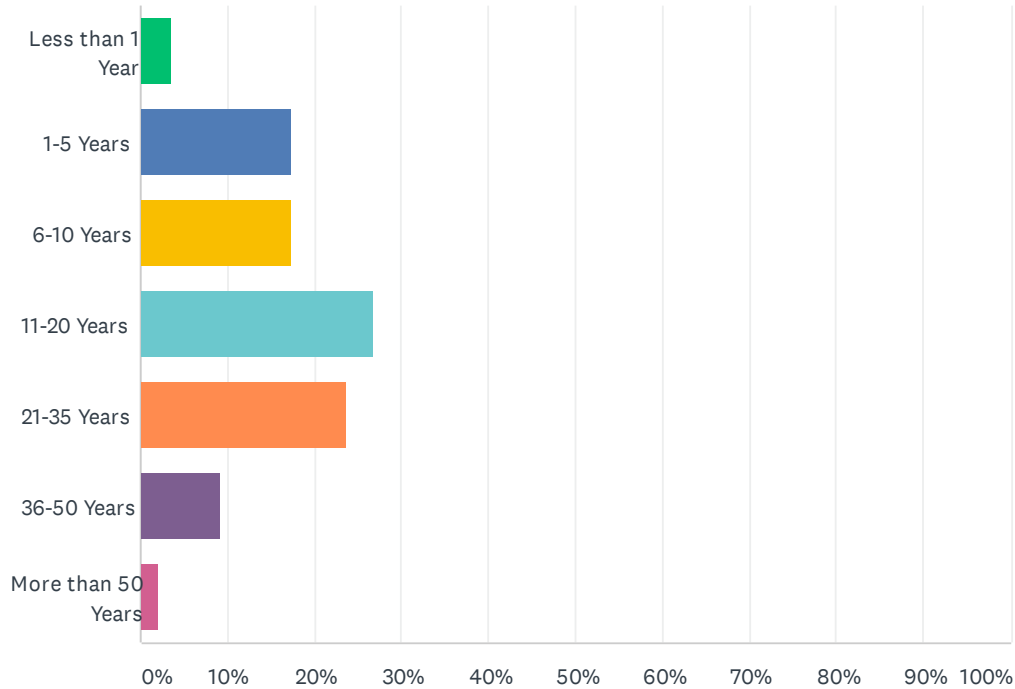

That being said, it is the practice of this Board to keep confidential the minutes of meetings closed to the public pursuant to 5 ILCS 120/2(c)(1) for litigation matters until such matters are fully resolved and publicly closed.
