**STAFF REPORTS.**

**Daniel Halek – Police Chief** (see attached report). At this time Chief Halek presented information regarding Resolution 2026-40 that is on the agenda under New Business. This Resolution would grant permission for the Police Department to apply for a grant with the Community Oriented Policing services hiring grant that would assist the department with grant funding (75%) for the hiring of a new officer. This would pay up to \$125,000 in a three-year period. After three years the department will have to re-apply for the grant again. Chief Halek answered questions from some of the board members. The deadline for the grant is July 1<sup>st</sup> and if awarded Chief Halek said he would appropriate the proper funding in the FY 2027 budget to cover the expenses associated with new employee that the grant will not cover. As the City continues to grow the police department has experienced an increase in calls for service and demands on patrol operations. Additionally, staffing challenges stemming from employee vacations, sick leave,

training requirements and work related injuries can lead to coverage gaps that affect the department's ability to maintain proactive policing efforts . The addition of an officer through this grant opportunity would help ensure adequate staffing levels and provide greater flexibility in maintaining patrol coverage when officers are unavailable.

**CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT - UPDATE**

June 25, 2026

1. Bauman's began work on Prop S Phase II asphalt streets this week. Jokerst Inc. continues to work on the first part of the water line on the northern half of LaHaye.
2. Alliance began work last week and continues this week replacing the water line on N 6<sup>th</sup> Street between Jefferson & Washington. Once that is done, they will shift to the water line connection at the end of Parkwood.
3. City Offices will be closed on Friday, July 3<sup>rd</sup> for the Independence Day federal holiday.
4. Our public works surplus vehicles will be listed on Purple Wave next week. We will share that out on our website once they are listed.
5. The Residential Trash Service Contract Survey was posted on our website on Monday. I plan to leave it open for 1-2 weeks and provide the responses at a future work session. I've attached the link here and will also email it to all of you. Please share it out as much as possible. (<https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/F2FH68W>)
6. McBride signed an agreement with MLC this week which was the final hurdle for them. I expect a Release of Contingencies letter from them on Monday and to close on the property at the end of July.
7. The new signs for the brush site have been installed. Cameras will be installed next and we will be monitoring the site via police patrol and cameras.
8. The annual Consumer Confidence Report was released by MoDNR. It is available on their website, our website and is posted in the foyer.

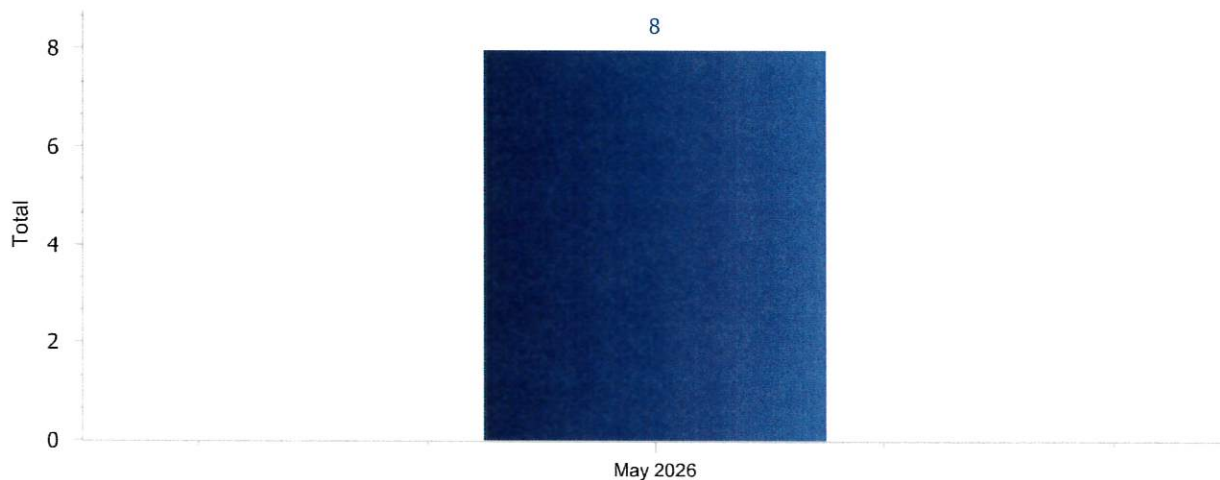

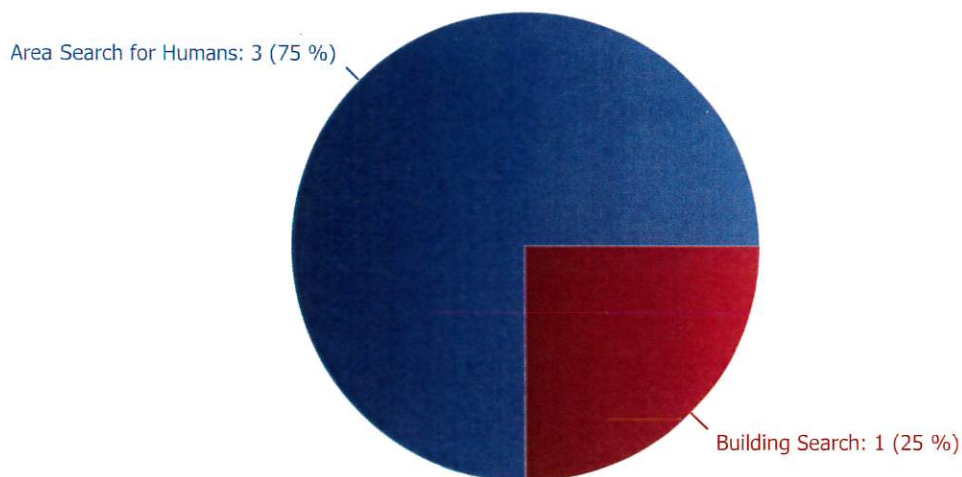

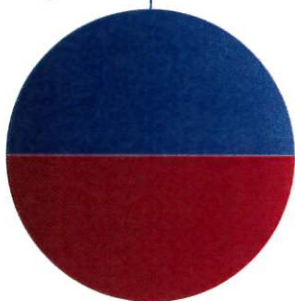

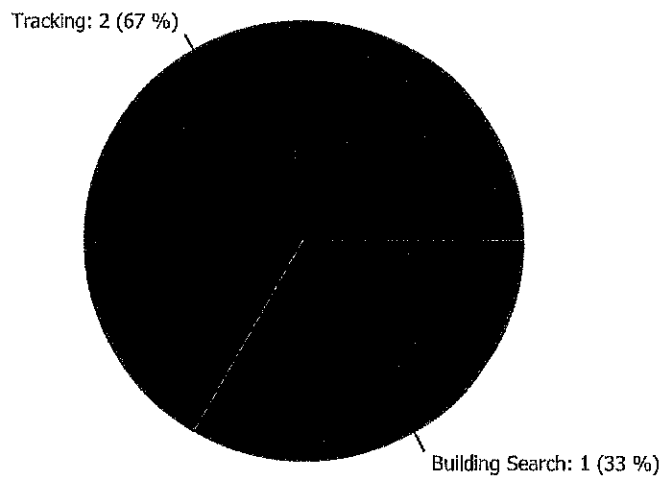

Patrol Types

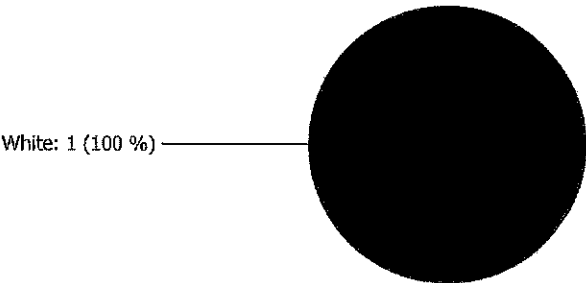

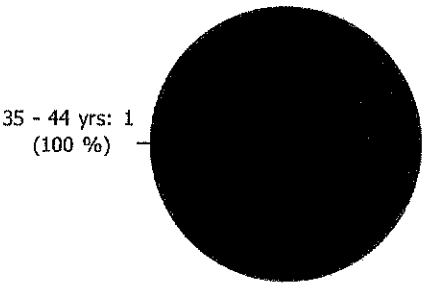

## Demographic Data: Arrests

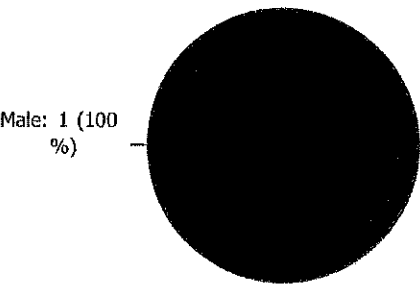
Arrests by Race/Ethnicity

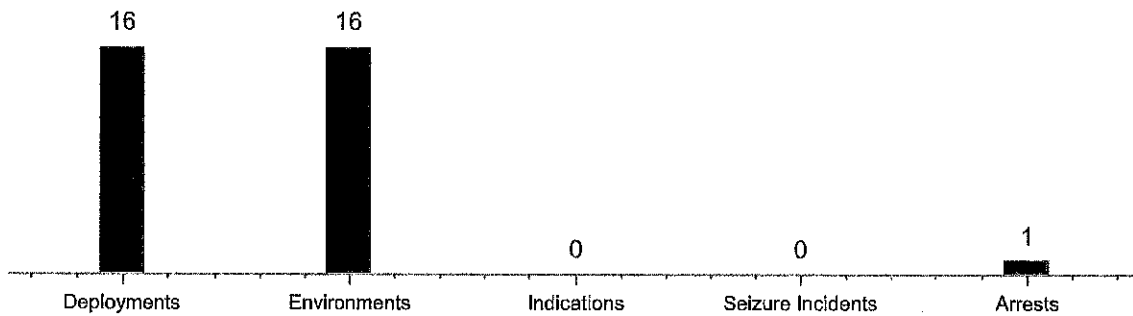
Arrests by Sex At Birth

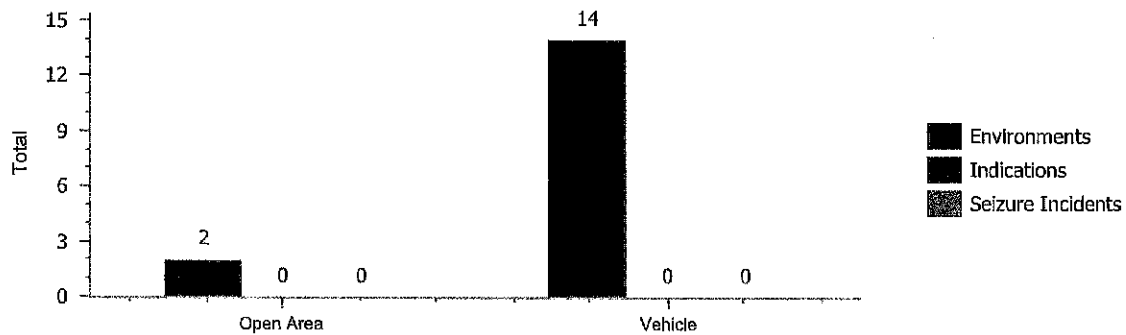

We covered the many kinds of tags, locks, and devices that make it possible to lock out any situation. We were shown how to use each one. This decreases the risk of electrical shock

## **WATER TREATMENT**

- The CO2 tank's condenser fan went out so we replaced it. This is part of the cooling system that helps control the pressure in the tank.
- The tanker is scheduled to be sandblasted and painted. After this, we will do the swap to the new cab and chassis.
- The roof repairs have been completed by SRS. We had one leak with a rain, and they came out the next day and fixed it.

## **WASTEWATER TREATMENT**

- The bearing on the north rotor went out. The new one has been ordered, and we are waiting for delivery.
- The uv parts that were ordered back in March have been delivered. These are the replacement parts that we typically use throughout the disinfection season.

## **WATER DISTRIBUTION**

- We had a water leak on South Main Street on a 4" transite line. There was a hole in the pipe, and we put a repair band on it.
- We verified water and sewer availability on Biltmore Street on an empty lot that is potentially being purchased for a new construction home.
- We have spent a good amount of time on LaHaye Street with the water line project. We abandoned an old service that was hit and assisted the contractor in locating some existing services.
- I got quotes for the material to install a water line on Picardy Street to serve an empty lot.
- We removed the drinking fountain and sidewalk by Saras Ice Cream so electric can be ran to the pergola.

## **SEWER COLLECTIONS**

There were no sanitary sewer overflows (SSO) for the month.

- We removed an existing manhole that the bottom was gone. We poured a new concrete structure and lid. The old manhole had no access and the new one does, so this could be beneficial in the future.

- We abandoned 4 old sewer laterals on LaHaye Street that were found during the water line project. This may help with I & I in that area.

## **STREETS/STORM**

- We set out barricades for the Blessing of Mary statue at Valle School.
- We installed storm grates on 4<sup>th</sup>, Academy, and Washington Streets.
- We took possession of the tractor and boom mower from the Special Road District.
- I did the walk through with Bauman Contracting for the Prop S work that is scheduled to start on June 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- I walked Valle Springs Trail sidewalk and found several panels that are scheduled to be replaced. They have settled and pose a tripping hazard.
- We repaired 6 streetlights downtown that were not working.
- New caution symbol signs were installed on Chadwell Lane bridge. They were faded.
- The tractor and boom mower have been out quite a bit doing creeks and ditches.
- The new sweeper head was delivered. We are working on getting it installed as quickly as possible.

## **PARKS**

- I contacted Citizens Electric about a downed line in the park. They came out and repaired it. They also trimmed some trees around the line, and we will meet later to discuss more options about the tree.
- I contacted Citizens Electric about a tree that was dead and was hanging over a power line. They sent out their contractor to take it down and we did the cleanup and hauled it away.
- We installed a bench at the skate park, so people have a place to sit.
