Sweigert stated that the change would allow our employees who are not residents to garner the benefit of fees that a resident would pay. Beshara stated that is \$100.00 difference between resident and non-resident. There have been a couple of employees who do not live in the city that have bought lots and to be buried with their loved ones here in Rittman. I thought it was a good gesture to see how Council feels about it. It's not going to be that many people. Simpson stated that Beshara also wanted to include close family members. Sweigert stated that his concern was why don't we encourage them to move into the city if they want to get the resident fee. We did this with EMS billing and gave the employees the same charge as a resident. The unfortunate thing is the employees who live outside the city don't pay into the property tax that funds the EMS. Those employees don't pay the 2.3 mil property tax. Beshara stated that this is cemetery, it's a little different. Sweigert voiced concerns because now our residents who live in town who do pay property taxes and all the other taxes their funding somebody and their close family members to get buried in our cemetery. Beshara stated that when employees come to us that want to be buried here that work here, but don't live here, that she believes that it's pretty special and is looking to treat them the same because they work so hard for our city. It's a \$100.00 difference. Huff inquired if we could change it to immediate family. Shows stated that it should also extend to retired employees. Shows made a motion to change wording to include current and retired employees, upon roll call Sweigert – No, Hayward – No, Nelson – Yes, Schumacher – Yes, Shows – Yes, Huff – Yes, roll call and **motion carried**. Nelson moved to place on second. upon roll call Sweigert – No, Hayward – Yes, Nelson – Yes, Schumacher – Yes, Shows – Yes, Huff – Yes, roll call and **motion carried**.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RITTMAN, WAYNE AND MEDINA COUNTIES AND STATE OF OHIO, AMENDING SECTION 991.10 CHARGES AND FEES OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF RITTMAN.

WHEREAS, section 991.10 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Rittman is the ordinance governing the fees related to the municipal cemetery; and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to recognize the service of the employees of the City of Rittman by treating them the same as citizens with regards to cemetery charges and fees.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Rittman, Counties of Wayne and Medina and State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected and appointed thereto concurring:

SECTION ONE

That section 991.10(b) be amended as follows (new text underlined):

Residents and Nonresidents. Since the City is obligated to pay from the General Fund all costs involved in the operation and maintenance of the cemetery over and above the income derived from the sale of lots, burials, the Cemetery Maintenance and Operations Fund, the Special Lot Endowment Fund, gifts and bequeaths, and since nonresidents of the City do not necessarily contribute to the General Fund by way of taxes, a distinction is made in charges and fees for the lots and services rendered between residents and nonresidents of the City. All current and retired employees of the City of Rittman and their close family members, as determined by the City Manager, shall be considered "residents" for the purposes of charges and fees under this section.

RESOLUTION NO. 8518

A RESOLUTION ALLOWING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR A CONNECTING COMMUNITIES PLANNING GRANT FUNDS PROGRAMMED BY THE AKRON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY (AMATS) TO CONDUCT A CITY-WIDE ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Rittman Active Transportation Plan is of great importance; and

WHEREAS, this project will study pedestrian and bicycle connectivity throughout the City, with focus on improving safety, streetscaping, and connections to the Downtown District; and

WHEREAS, Rittman's Active Transportation Plan will also address how to safely more pedestrians, bicycles, and other modes of transportation throughout the Downtown District and enhance sidewalk connectivity throughout the City.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Rittman, Counties of Wayne and Medina and State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected and appointed thereto concurring:

SECTION ONE.

That the City Manager is hereby authorized to apply for Connecting Communities Planning Grant Funds programmed by the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study (AMATS) for the following Active Transportation Plan:

This project will assist the City in identifying new and improved sidewalk connections, bicycle-friendly routes to connect to the trail system and better traffic safety in the downtown. The City is requesting \$50,000.00 dollars from AMATS for this project. Further, the City has earmarked an additional \$20,000.00 to support a downtown feasibility and marketing study.

That the City of Rittman acknowledges and understands the AMATS “Funding Policy Guidelines” and confirms to the best of its knowledge that the information contained in the project application is accurate, that it intends to diligently pursue that project, and that a local share will be provided.

That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public and in compliance with law.

This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Rittman and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is to apply for this funding by March 20, 2026, provided that it receives the approval of two-thirds of the members of Council, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 8519

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RITTMAN, WAYNE AND MEDINA COUNTIES AND STATE OF OHIO, ENACTING A 180 DAY MORATORIUM ON THE RECEIPT, PROCESSING, ISSUANCE, AND APPROVAL OF ANY APPLICATION FOR A ZONING CERTIFICATE FOR NAICS 518-DATA PROCESSING, HOSTING, AND RELATED SERVICES (DATA CENTERS) UNDER THE CITY'S PLANNING AND ZONING CODE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City has determined it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to adopt an ordinance enacting a 180 day moratorium on the receipt, processing, issuance, and approval of any application for a zoning certificate for NAICS 518-data processing, hosting, and related services (Data Centers); and

WHEREAS, due to concerns relating to data centers the City recognizes that the Planning and Zoning Code needs to be reviewed and updated to ensure proper development can occur within the City and that the City has the necessary processes, resources and infrastructure in place to address such growth and demand for data centers; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Rittman, Counties of Wayne and Medina and State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected and appointed thereto concurring:

SECTION ONE

This Council believes it is in the best interest of the City to institute a 180 day moratorium on the receipt, processing, issuance, and approval of any application for a zoning certificate for NAICS 518-data processing, hosting, and related services (Data Centers). This moratorium is necessary to ensure such

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future developments align with the intent of the City and its residents, to ensure proper development can occur within the City and that the City has the necessary processes, resources and infrastructure in place to address such growth and demand for data centers and that such interests are a legitimate public interest necessary to protect the public health, safety and general welfare.

SECTION TWO

The Council may rescind this moratorium at any time prior to the expiration of the 180 days.

SECTION THREE

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the City due to the dangers and complications that NAICS 518-data processing, hosting and related services (Data Centers) pose to the City's residents and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval or otherwise take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
