Dear Yonkers Public Schools Community,

As we enter the final month of summer vacation I wanted to provide you an update of our busy July month and reflect on some of the work that took place across our district.

This summer, nearly 1,500 students participated in our <u>Summer Enrichment</u> Academies. From reading and writing to math games, engineering projects, and film production, students were actively engaged and supported by dedicated teachers and mentors. Our Extended School Year program, which provides continued learning for students with special needs, is still underway and will conclude on August 12.

Looking ahead, the first day of school is Wednesday, September 3rd. Families can find school supply lists by visiting their school's website or by downloading our Yonkers Public Schools mobile app and subscribing to your child's school page for timely updates. If you are registering a new student or need to complete a withdrawal form, that process can be done online at yonkerspublicschools.org under the Registration and Withdrawal section.

The Board of Education has approved the <u>2025–2026 school calendar</u>, which is now available for families to view and will be mailed. I encourage everyone to take a moment to review the calendar to stay informed about key dates throughout the school year.

In addition, the Board adopted a <u>new policy</u> regarding student use of internet-enabled devices. Internet enabled devices and devices capable of connecting to an internet enabled device are not allowed to be used during the school day, following guidance from New York State. The policy is available on our website, and I encourage families to read it in full so we can work together to support a focused, distraction-free learning environment.

Summer Enrichment Highlights

Nearly 1,500 Students Engaged with Hands-on Learning Across Yonkers







This summer, students across the district took part in enrichment programs that combined academics with creativity and real-world skills. At School 16, students explored ELA themes and built math skills through the Math For Love curriculum, supported by mentors from MBK and SMART Scholars.

Siragusa students showcased their math games and writing at a family celebration, while Hostos focused on multilingual learners with culturally responsive lessons in reading, math, and language development. At Yonkers Middle High School, middle schoolers explored engineering, film production, and crime scene investigation through engaging, project-based tasks.

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New Policy: Internet-Enabled Devices





Starting school year 2025-2026,
New York State's "bell-to-bell"
ban on internet-enabled devices
aims to minimize classroom
distractions, allowing students
to concentrate better and
engage more deeply.

Internet Enabled Devices NOT Allowed

- Smartwatches
- Smartphones
- Tablets
- Laptops
- Wireless earbuds
- Gaming devices
- Devices with messaging, video, or web-browsing

Limiting Distractions, Promoting Safety

A new policy concerning student use of personal internet-enabled devices (phones, tablets, etc.) devices capable of connecting to a internet-enabled device has been adopted. The policy sets clear expectations to limit distractions and protect the learning environment. Read the full policy here and discuss it with your child ahead of the first day of school.


A school's storage plan may include, but is not limited to, one or more of the following storage options:

- the classroom teacher's storage container
- individual cubbies in classrooms
- the school office or other area designated by the Building Principal
- student lockers
- all-day storage in centralized device holders and/or caddies
- individual pouches

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
Yonkers 2030 Strategic Plan

- Prekindergarten students must be 4 years-of-age on or before December 1, 2021
- Kindergarten students must be 5 years-of-age on or before December 1, 2020


