### **A Small Learning Community**

A small learning community, comprised of a group of students within a larger high school who take classes together, taught by teachers who work as a team to integrate curriculum and personalize instruction.

### **Partnerships**

Partnerships with employers, the community, and local colleges, bringing resources from outside the high school to improve student motivation and achievement.

### **A College Prep Curriculum**

A well-rounded college preparatory curriculum with a career theme, enabling students to see the relationship among academic subjects and their application to a broad field of work.

### **Endorsement Opportunities**

By completing a program of study in one of our academies, students also simultaneously earn their state mandated endorsement.

# The Vision of Academies

The purpose of academies is to ensure all students are prepared for college and careers when they graduate from high school. All students will be asked to select an academy and endorsement in the spring of their eighth grade year.

Students may apply for a transfer or enrollment to any open campus. Approval to enroll or transfer to a campus does not guarantee approval to a specific elective or program of study with an academy. Access to these courses is based on whether or not the course is available on the campus and space availability. Some courses are unique to specific campuses. Transportation is not provided to students applying for out-of-district enrollment or transfers. # FAQs About Academies

## **What does it mean when the high schools have been partnered?**

The high schools have been “partnered” to cover more effectively the similar programs in a more cost efficient manner. All similar academies will be covered between two or three high schools, but not all courses will be offered on all campuses.

## **How are the high schools partnered?**

Cedar Ridge, Round Rock and Stony Point high schools are partnered; and Westwood and McNeil high schools are partnered.

## **Will students be able to participate in multiple academies and endorsements?**

Yes, students may participate in multiple academies and earn multiple endorsements at the campus they are attending. Students select a primary academy and endorsement and take additional electives as their schedules allow.

## **Will students be required to select an academy and endorsement?**

All students will be required to declare an academy and endorsement based on their interests prior to the end of their eighth grade year.

## **What is my home campus?**

The legal residence of a student and his or her parent(s) or legal guardian establishes the home campus of the student. The legal residence requires that parent(s) or legal guardian actually live in the attendance area, receive their mail at their residence, and plan to continue to live there.

## **What is my school-of-record?**

The school where a student’s official records are maintained is the student’s school-of-record. A transfer is required to change a student’s school-of-record.

## **What are the requirements to earn an academy stole for graduation?**

A student must complete three or more sequential courses for four or more total credits as prescribed by their Program of Study.

# ACADEMY STUDENTS CAN EARN:

## Advanced Placement (AP) Credit

Advanced Placement (AP) courses provide students with a rigorous college curriculum that prepares them to take an AP exam. Students are eligible to take AP exams at the completion of each AP course. College credit is issued based on the score received on the AP exam and the individual college or university's policy on granting credit for AP exam results.

## Articulated Credit

Articulated courses are designed to prepare students for the future. Emphasis is placed on higher-level academic courses taken in conjunction with Career and Technical Education programs. Articulation agreements with community colleges (and some four-year universities) make it possible for students to earn college credits for a course of study that prepares them to obtain an associate degree, a two-year program certificate, or to enter the workforce better prepared to be competent employees. Taking articulated courses enables students to earn FREE college credits while in high school.

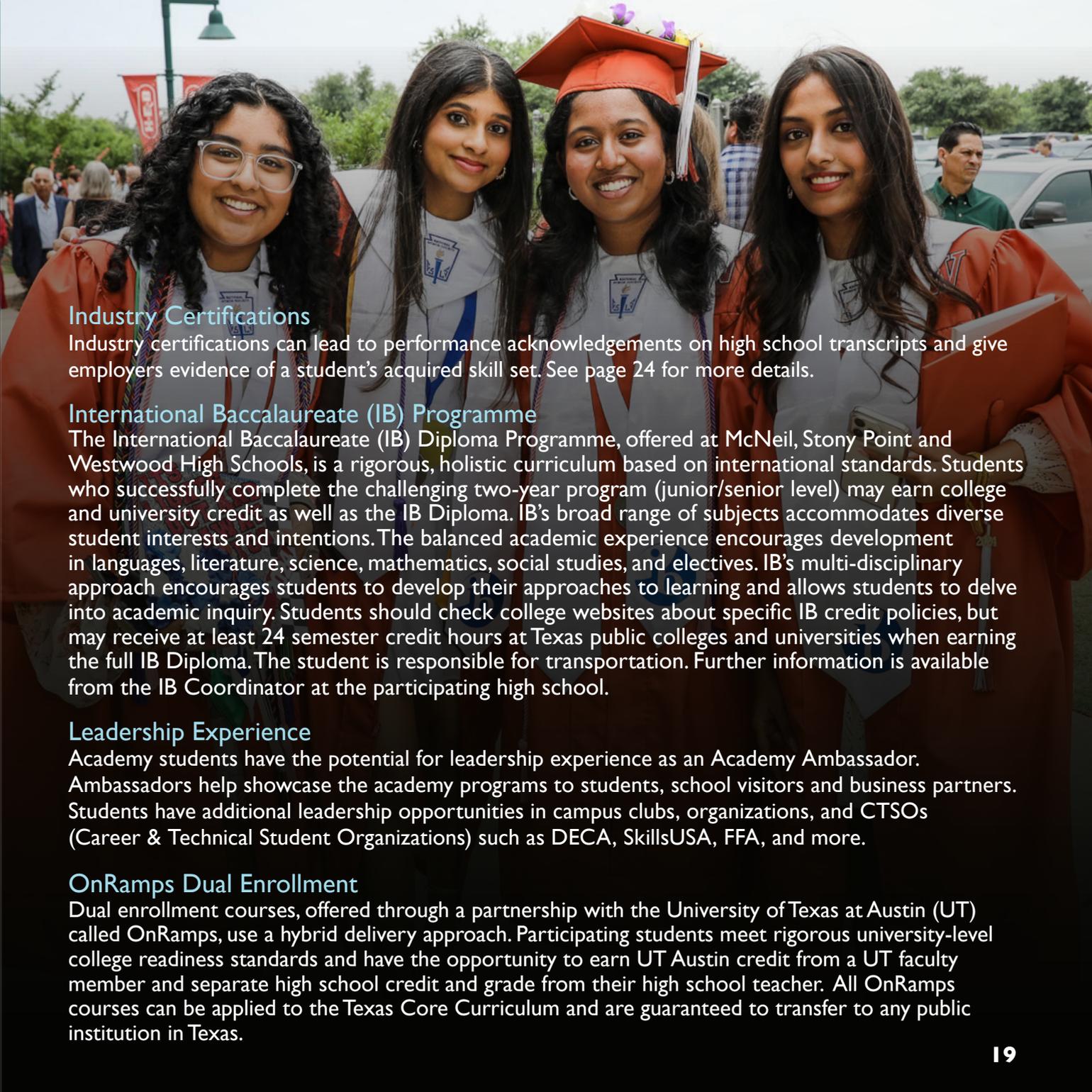

## Dual Credit

Dual credit courses are college courses that also count toward high school requirements. These courses may be taken at the high school (or at the college) during regular school hours, after school hours, online and in the summer, and are taught by a high school teacher with appropriate credentials, or by regular college faculty. Successful completion of a dual credit course can earn high school credit as well as college credit. Students who meet the Texas Success Initiative standards for registration in dual credit courses can take up to 12 courses FREE of TUITION and FEES beginning their freshmen year.

## Endorsements

Students may earn an endorsement by completing a coherent sequence of coursework housed within an academy. This “program of study” should suit a student’s unique skills and interests. An endorsement is earned once a minimum of four credits in three or more courses are completed, and must include upper level coursework. Endorsements offered to students during 9th grade registration include Arts & Humanities, Business & Industry, Public Services, STEM, and Multidisciplinary Studies. Endorsements can be achieved in numerous ways to allow students to focus their studies in Academy Programs of Study as well as traditional academics.



### Industry Certifications

Industry certifications can lead to performance acknowledgements on high school transcripts and give employers evidence of a student's acquired skill set. See page 24 for more details.

### International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme, offered at McNeil, Stony Point and Westwood High Schools, is a rigorous, holistic curriculum based on international standards. Students who successfully complete the challenging two-year program (junior/senior level) may earn college and university credit as well as the IB Diploma. IB's broad range of subjects accommodates diverse student interests and intentions. The balanced academic experience encourages development in languages, literature, science, mathematics, social studies, and electives. IB's multi-disciplinary approach encourages students to develop their approaches to learning and allows students to delve into academic inquiry. Students should check college websites about specific IB credit policies, but may receive at least 24 semester credit hours at Texas public colleges and universities when earning the full IB Diploma. The student is responsible for transportation. Further information is available from the IB Coordinator at the participating high school.

### Leadership Experience

Academy students have the potential for leadership experience as an Academy Ambassador. Ambassadors help showcase the academy programs to students, school visitors and business partners. Students have additional leadership opportunities in campus clubs, organizations, and CTSOs (Career & Technical Student Organizations) such as DECA, SkillsUSA, FFA, and more.

### OnRamps Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment courses, offered through a partnership with the University of Texas at Austin (UT) called OnRamps, use a hybrid delivery approach. Participating students meet rigorous university-level college readiness standards and have the opportunity to earn UT Austin credit from a UT faculty member and separate high school credit and grade from their high school teacher. All OnRamps courses can be applied to the Texas Core Curriculum and are guaranteed to transfer to any public institution in Texas.

## Classroom Visits

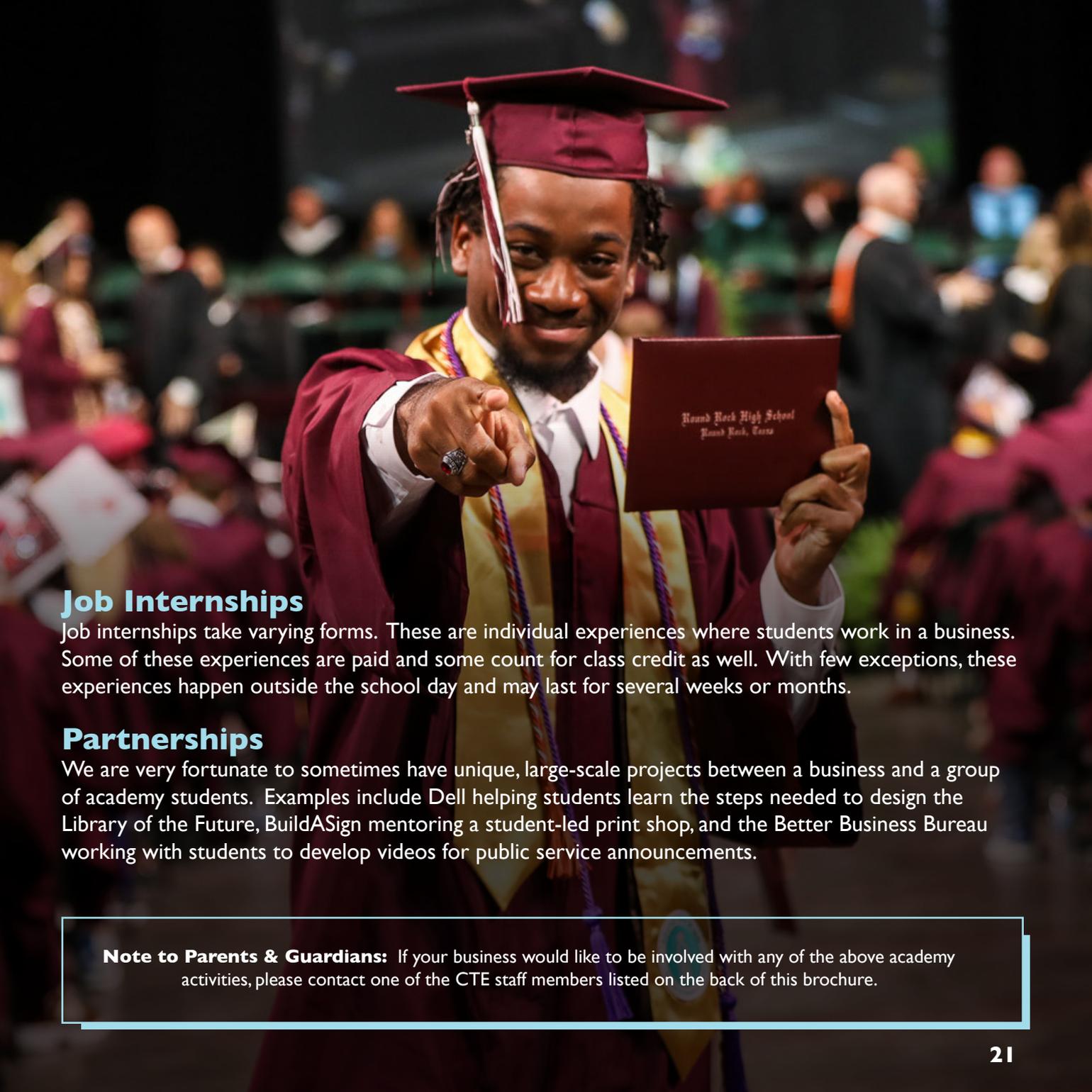
Many business partners visit our academy classrooms throughout the year. Some serve as guest speakers regarding their business, career or professional skills; some serve as interviewers as students practice in mock interviews before going out into the work place; and some help judge competitions for our student organizations.

## Site Visits

Students in our academies have the opportunity to visit area businesses and see them in action. This is a great way to enhance classroom learning by making it more real and in-depth. Some site visits are also taken to tour post-secondary educational facilities. These trips typically happen during the school day, and students attend along with the rest of their class.

## Job Shadowing

Job shadowing is a one-day experience usually lasting a few hours. During this activity students can shadow, observe and ask questions at a business site, providing the opportunity to make learning more in-depth. Job shadowing typically happens on days when the students are not attending class.



## Job Internships

Job internships take varying forms. These are individual experiences where students work in a business. Some of these experiences are paid and some count for class credit as well. With few exceptions, these experiences happen outside the school day and may last for several weeks or months.

## Partnerships

We are very fortunate to sometimes have unique, large-scale projects between a business and a group of academy students. Examples include Dell helping students learn the steps needed to design the Library of the Future, BuildASign mentoring a student-led print shop, and the Better Business Bureau working with students to develop videos for public service announcements.

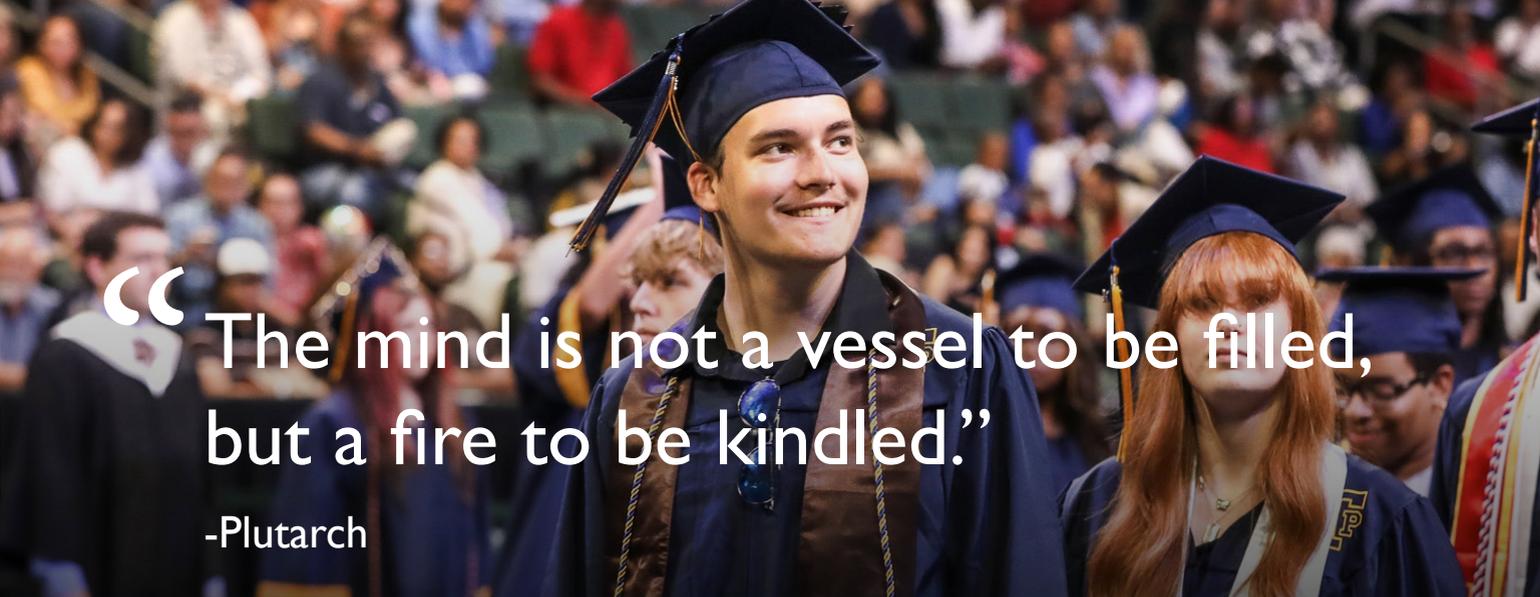
