If students are unsure of previous grades, they can check with the guidance office or go to the Sapphire community portal>reports> student transcript.

Students are expected to come every day and stay for the entire time period Monday-Thursday noon- 3 PM and Friday 8-11 AM until completion of course packet. However, we do recognize the need to accommodate for work and responsibilities, family vacations, transportation issues, etc. We ask that students come for as long or as often as possible.

## **2026 CAHS SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSES – Grades 9 - 12**

**LOCATION:** All classes to be held at Clearfield Area Junior Senior High School in the Social Studies wing. See daily schedule below for times.

**CLASSES:** Classes will be held on Monday through Friday for two weeks beginning Monday, June 15<sup>th</sup> and ending on Friday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. Classes will be held at the Junior Senior High School from noon through 3:00 PM Monday-Thursday and 8-11 AM on Friday.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Students must have failed the course/subject, with a minimum grade of 60. Students who earned between 60-69% are deemed eligible for summer school. Students who earned less than 60% need to contact their counselor to obtain information on other credit recovery options.

**ATTENDANCE:** Students are expected to come every day and stay for the entire time period from 12 noon-3 PM (Monday-Thursday) and 8-11 AM (Friday) to complete their individual course work in a timely manner. However, the two weeks are flexible to accommodate student work schedules, vacations, etc. Students are not penalized for missing a day.

**TRANSPORTATION:** Students are responsible for getting to and from Clearfield Area Junior Senior High School. The district assumes no transportation responsibilities for Summer School.

**TEXTBOOKS:** Students will be provided with the appropriate materials to complete course packets.

**COST:           FREE OF CHARGE**

**COURSES/CREDITS:** Any current year or previous year course(s) in which a final grade of 60-69% was earned. To check previous year(s), go to Sapphire community portal>reports>student transcript.

**GRADES:** Upon satisfactory completion of each student's individual course work, students will receive a passing grade of 70%.

**BEHAVIOR / DRESS CODE:** Student dress and behavior will be in accordance with all guidelines as set forth in the CHS Student Handbook. Inappropriate behavior will result in the student being dismissed from Summer School.

**SCHOOL LUNCH:** School lunch will not be provided at the Junior-Senior HS. Students may bring a drink and snack with them.
