Urbana, with a population of approximately 11,640, is the county seat of Champaign County, which features some of the best farmland in Ohio. This community, with diversified medium and small manufacturing base, serves the local area as well as global markets. Early Ohio settlers who came north from the Ohio River on what is now State Route 68 established Urbana. Tecumseh, Blue Jacket, and Daniel Boone were frequent visitors to the area and were welcomed to the home of Simon Kenton. In the 1800's, the area prospered as farm products supplied the growing city markets of Columbus, Indianapolis, and Cincinnati.

Urbana High School is a public school, serving students in grades 9-12. The North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement, a division of AdvancED accredits UHS. The 2024-25 enrollment is 550 students, including an expected graduation class of 127. Urbana High School has 39 certified/licensed teaching staff and 9 certified/licensed support staff, including a principal, assistant principal, athletic director, librarian, nurse, two school counselors and a para-educator. The total district population of 1,854 students is housed in one elementary school, one junior high school, one senior high school, and a career center. Because of its position on large wooded grounds atop a knoll and the turreted lines of the central building, the school is familiarly known as "The Castle on the Hill."

Grading System

Urbana City Schools grading policies are based on formative and summative assessments. End of quarter grades are based between 80% and 100% on summative assessments (tests, papers, projects, presentations). Students have the ability to reassess after demonstrating additional efforts toward mastering the content. All students are required to take semester and final exams that are not eligible for reassessment. The point value of each quarter grade is doubled and added to each exam grade to calculate the final grade for each course. The GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale. A 5.0 scale is available, but is used solely for determining class rank.
