Program Activities

Throughout this two-day clinic, students will explore the fundamentals of the stage through interactive workshops and games:

- **Acting Basics:** Learning the art of pretending with purpose and making believable, imagination-based choices.
- **Voice Projection and Articulation:** Practicing diaphragm breathing to develop a strong stage voice (not yelling) and mastering tongue twisters for clear speech.
- **Movement and Stage Presence:** Using "Charades" to practice communicating feelings through facial expressions, posture, and gestures.
- **Emotion Switch:** An acting exercise where students practice how the delivery and tone of a single line (like "I found it!") changes its entire meaning.
- **Creative Drama Games and Teamwork:** Building listening and collaborative skills through group activities like "One Word Story."
