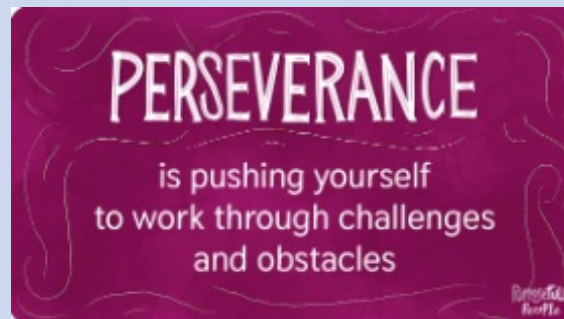

Arlington Online Program (AOP)

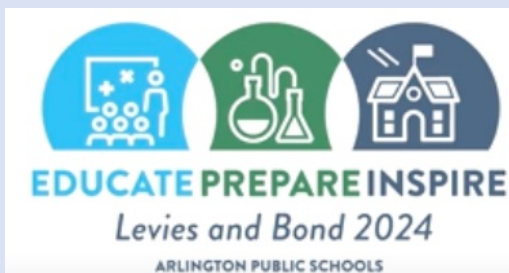
- Please make sure you are logging into your courses each day during the week. Daily progress is very important to the success of the program.

The Middle School Bond will: Build a new Post Middle School; Add parking and drive lanes for Eagle Creek Elementary and Stillaguamish Valley Learning Center traffic to separate cars from buses; Provide a modern learning environment for students coming from Eagle Creek and Kent Prairie; and improve traffic at the Post, Eagle Creek, Stillaguamish Valley Learning Center campus.

Prop. 1: Educational Programs and Operations Levy Renewal

Educational Programs and Operational Levy Renewal

The EP&O Levy was approved by the community in 2020. This levy renewal provides 11-12% of the district's overall budget which continues funding for: Maintaining class sizes; Teaching, nursing, security, food service staffing; Student opportunities like clubs, extracurriculars, and athletics; Technology; and programs like Special Education and Robotics.

Capital Levy Renewal

The levy renewal continues funding for: Facility improvements to extend the life of schools; a new roof for Arlington High School, Haller Middle School, and multiple buildings at Stillaguamish Valley Learning Center; Replace the gym floors at Arlington High School; Parking, drive lane paving, and stormwater management; and replacing heating, ventilation, and air conditioning equipment at Kent Prairie and Eagle Creek Elementary Schools.

Possible School Schedule Change	School Starts	School Dismisses
Two hour delay	Two hours later than regular times	Regularly scheduled times
Early dismissal	May be regular or delayed times, watch for message from district	Earlier than regularly scheduled times
Closed	Schools will not open	Schools will not open

We are officially in the season where severe weather or other emergencies may cause changes to the school day. When this happens, schools may need to start late, dismiss early, or close.

Two-Hour Delay

If there is a two-hour delayed start, the following changes will apply:

- School at all buildings will start two hours later than regular
 - At SVLC, onsite classes will begin at 11:00, doors to classrooms will open at 10:50 AM
- Limited bus transportation and no out-of-district transportation
- Athletics and after-school activities may continue as scheduled but they may also be canceled. Please monitor school communications for updates on the status of these events.

Early Dismissal

With this option, school is closed earlier than regular times to respond to weather or other conditions. Families may pick up students from school and we will transport bus riders home on their limited routes. Dismissing school early is generally an emergency action because we need to verify with parents that someone will be at home if school is dismissed early.

Schools Closed

Depending on the weather conditions, canceling school might be an option to keep our students and staff safe on treacherous roads. Athletics and after-school activities may continue as scheduled but they may also be canceled. Please monitor school communications for updates on the status of these events.

Limited Transportation

In adverse weather, bus routes may be limited to main roads. We will provide notification to the community if we must use limited transportation routes.

How we will communicate information about changes to school schedules:

- School Messenger (Emails and/or phone calls and/or text messages)
- Flash Alert Newswire (FlashAlert.net) (See below)
- Social media
- Home page of district website (www.asd.wednet.edu)
- Broadcast Media

How can I find out if there are changes?

Arlington Public Schools uses FlashAlert Newswire to alert the media and community about school delays and closures. Parents, staff, and community members can sign up for these notifications for free by going to this link:

FlashAlert will send out email and/or text notices to you. Please note that you will need to log into your FlashAlert account at least once per year to keep it active. Reminder notifications will be sent to you before the account is closed.

While we know that our students and families are best served when we are open, our main concern is the safety of our students and staff. Typically, decisions regarding schedule changes are made in the early morning before school. This allows for the most current weather information to factor into the decision. This information is generally posted by

5:30 a.m. When it is necessary to close school due to extreme weather conditions or other unusual circumstances, announcements will be made on local radio and TV stations early in the morning. Please do not call the school office.

We understand that decisions about school schedules and bus route changes have an impact on our families and staff. We appreciate your patience during these situations.

Does your student need new school clothes?
