February 3rd, 2026**

Nashville City Council met in regular session at noon on February 3rd, 2026. Mayor Larry Dunaway called the meeting to order. Brent Thompson led in prayer and Mayor Larry Dunaway led the pledge of allegiance.

Ten council members were present: Freddie Horne, Donna Harwell, Brent Thompson, Phil Jones, William Turley, Kay Gathright, Charles Pinkson, Herbert Turley, Kathy Combs, and Lynn Dyer.

Motion was made by William and seconded by Kathy to accept the minutes of the December 15th meeting. Motion passed.

The financial report was given by the Finance Director Kimberly Green. Extraordinary expenses for December were: General: Police Department-Grant Expenditures: \$86,371.00 for 2nd payment for laptops for police cars paid to Turn-Key Mobile, Inc. City sales tax increased by 4.7% and county decreased by 1%. Motion by Donna, second by Vivian to accept the financial report. Motion passed. Resolution 2026-01 Amend 2025 Budget was read by Larry. Motion by Donna to accept Resolution 2026-01, second by Brent. Motion passed.

Meghan Floyd, Park Director reported the K-2nd grade basketball program had 99 kids. Baseball registration will be open till February 11th and close then drafts will start. Dierks, Murfreesboro, Mineral Springs and Horatio will be in our drafts this year.

Police Chief Amy Marion reported she did not have anything at this time.

Fire Chief Justin Thornton reported he did not have anything at this time.

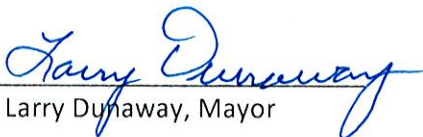
David Riggs Code Enforcement Officer was out. Larry mentioned they are getting some properties for annexation and will bring a list of them at a later time.
