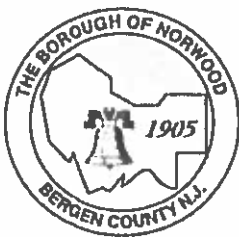

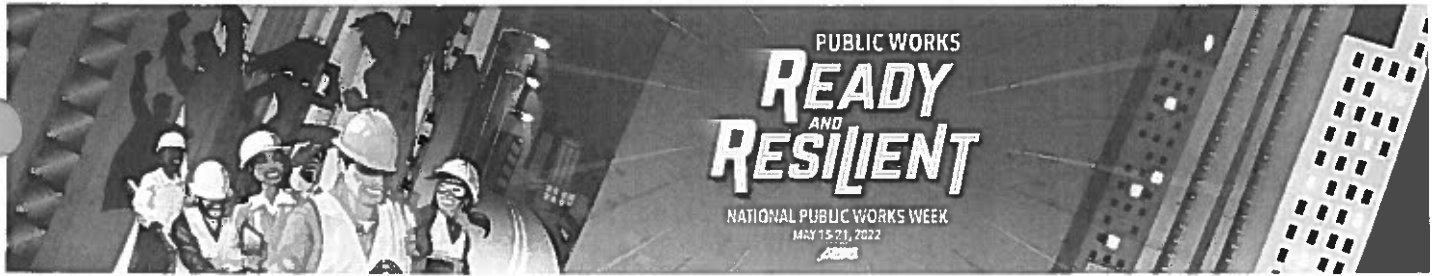

ORDINANCE 2022:05

BOROUGH OF NORWOOD

CALENDAR YEAR 2022

**ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS
AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK
(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Norwood in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 1.00% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$87,913.42 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Norwood, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Norwood shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.50%, amounting to \$307,696.97, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Borough of Norwood be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT UNDER NEW JERSEY STATE CONTRACT NUMBER T-1654, TO VENDOR, FIA CARD SERVICES, N.A., BANK OF AMERICA COMPANY, CONTRACT NUMBER 84675 AND ESTABLISHING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE USE OF PROCUREMENT CARDS AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CORPORATE CARD PROGRAM LINKING THE AUTHORIZATION CONTRACT WITH THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY AND OTHER DOCUMENTATION AS REQUIRED TO IMPLEMENT A PROCUREMENT CARD PROGRAM FOR THE BOROUGH OF NORWOOD

WHEREAS, the Qualified Purchasing Agent has recommended that procurement cards be utilized where appropriate for purchases of and/or for the Borough of Norwood; and

WHEREAS, the use of procurement cards can be a highly beneficial tool for local governments looking to further utilize e-commerce and strengthen their purchasing controls; and

WHEREAS, the rules adopted by the Local Finance Board governing the use of procurement cards are set forth in N.J.A.C. S:30-9A; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-16(c) establishes the specific circumstances when procurement cards can be used; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council find that a procurement card program would be beneficial to the Borough and wish to authorize their use and establish policies and procedures for their use as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council also wish to authorize the Qualified Purchasing Agent to execute a Corporate Card Program Linking Authorization Contract with the State of New Jersey, and other documentation as required to implement a procurement card program for the Borough of Norwood.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood hereby adopt the following policies and procedures for the use of procurement cards for purchases of and/or, for the Borough of Norwood.

PROCUREMENT CARDS

A. Authorized Use of Procurement Cards

1. P-Cards can be utilized under the following conditions:
 - a. When payment to a vendor is required in advance of the delivery of certain materials or services that cannot be obtained from any other source

at comparable prices. (N.J.S.A. 40A:5- 16(c)(1)) and the QPA, CFO and Borough Administrator have approved such item for purchase from a particular vendor

- b. When ordering, billing and payment transactions for goods and services are made through a computerized electronic transaction (N.J.S.A. 40A:5-16(c)(2))
 - i. An order is placed from computer to computer, such as on the Internet or similar computer network
 - ii. Vendor requires immediate payment
 - iii. The QPA, CFO and Borough Administrator have approved such item for purchase from a particular vendor.
- c. When Vendor Certification is not readily obtainable (N.J.S.A. 40A:5-16(c)(3)) by the contracting unit; including but not limited to regulated utilities, telephone and communication services, and fuels, but such exceptions shall not include reimbursement of employee expenses or payment for personal services

- 2. Transactions cannot exceed the amount designated and authorized.
- 3. P-cards cannot be used for the purchase of items or services of a personal nature for employees, volunteers or officials.

B. Procurement Card Program Oversight

- 1. The Borough Administrator shall serve in-the capacity of program manager.
The program manager shall be responsible for day-to-day oversight and management of procurement card usage.
- 2. Should the Borough not hold a QPA certification, the maximum threshold on P-Card transactions shall not exceed 15% of the Borough's bid threshold.
- 3. The program manager and CFO shall assure that internal controls are maintained concerning the integrity of vendor payments, accumulated costs for goods and services as well as other Local Public Contract Law requirements.
- 4. The Borough Administrator, QPA and CFO shall receive training in all aspects of the system.
- 5. The program manager will develop and administer a supervisory review process, identify and manage all risks associated with P-Card use; as well as engage in any other oversight or management duties required to ensure their proper utilization.
- 6. P-cards must be issued in the name of a specific individual upon completion of the requisite training and cannot be issued to personnel who are neither covered by a fidelity bond or a blanket honesty policy held by the local unit (or become ineligible for said coverage after being issued a P-card), Violations of policies governing P-Card use shall result in appropriate remedial or disciplinary action.

7. P-cards shall only be issued in the names of the program manager, CFO and QPA. No other employee shall have a card issued in their name or authority to use the P- Card.
8. The program manager, CFO, Borough Administrator and QPA shall sign an acknowledgement of Procurement card training and agreement to abide by policies and procedures for procurement card usage and said agreement shall be retained by the Borough in their personnel file.
9. The Program Manager shall also ensure that:
 - a. all cards have imprinted on them both the users' names and the name of the local unit
 - b. the merchant code is accurate
 - c. Sufficient funds are encumbered from the proper accounts to cover any charges the user is authorized to make.
 - d. Program participants are aware of the program and approved vendors with whom the cards may be utilized, dependent upon contracts awarded by the governing body.
 - e. When applicable and bids are advertised, the bid documents include that the payments may be made by procurement card so the local unit receives in their bid prices any discount for timely payments.
10. Users shall expeditiously provide all receipts to the program manager, who will compare receipts to the computer-generated usage report provided by the card company. Returned material must be reported to the Program Manager quickly to ensure either the charge is cancelled, or the local unit receives proper credit.

C. Nothing in this policy shall change regulations or requirements pursuant to Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.)

**STATE OF NEW JERSEY CORPORATE CARD PROGRAM
LINKING AUTHORIZATION CONTRACT**

The State of New Jersey has authorized certain non-executive branch governmental entities ("Participants") to utilize the Purchase Card System ("Corporate Card Program") contract awarded as a result of Request for Proposal ("RFP") 13-X-22888 ("Contract") as the basis for a Participant to establish a Corporate Card program with Bank of America, N.A.

This Linking Authorization Contract ("Linking Authorization") is entered into by Borough of Norwood ("Entity") and Bank of America, N.A., ("Bank of America") as of _____ (the "Effective Date"). By signing this Linking Authorization, the Participant requests and Bank of America agrees to provide to the Participant the Corporate card services as set forth in the Contract and the Bank of America Corporate Card Agreement ("Agreement") between the State of New Jersey and Bank of America dated as of August 16, 2013.

Capitalized terms used in this Linking Authorization, not otherwise defined, have the meanings given to them in the Agreement.

The Participant acknowledges and agrees that it has received and reviewed a copy of the Agreement and agrees to adhere to the terms and conditions of the Agreement, as amended from time to time.

The Participant represents and warrants to Bank of America that:

1. it is a legal Participant;
2. its use of corporate card services with Bank of America, and its performance of its obligations under this Linking Authorization, the Agreement and the Contract will not violate any law, regulation, judgment, decree or order applicable to the Participant; and
3. it desires to utilize the Corporate Card Program of the State of New Jersey as the basis for establishing a Corporate Card program.

Bank of America represents and warrants that with respect to each Participant and the State:

1. that the combined total spend of all entities that enter into this agreement will be used to establish the rebate multiplier
2. that the rebate amount will be determined by the individual Participant spend multiplied by the groups rebate multiplier
3. that each Participant will be paid their rebate twice annually
4. rebate check shall be issued no later than sixty (60) days after rebate calculation

The Participant acknowledges and agrees that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Contract and/or the Agreement, Bank of America may disclose to the State of New Jersey and to each other Participant that utilizes the Corporate Card Program of the State as the basis for establishing a Corporate Card program with Bank of America: (i) Participant's name and the fact that Participant has entered into this Linking Authorization; and (ii) aggregate information about Participant's Transactions and spend volume.

The Participant will promptly furnish such financial and other information as Bank of America reasonably requests for the purpose of reviewing the Participant’s ability to perform the obligations to Bank of America on an annual basis.

The Participant acknowledges and agrees that Bank of America may terminate this Authorization or a Service effective immediately, and will send the Participant notice of the termination if any of the following occurs with respect to the Participant:

- it fails to pay as and when due or it breaches any of the terms and conditions in the Contract and/or the Agreement or any other agreement with us or any of our affiliates or subsidiaries;
- it, voluntarily or involuntarily, becomes the subject of any bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization or other similar proceeding;
- it experiences a material adverse change in its financial condition or its ability to perform its obligations under the terms and conditions in the Contract and/or this Agreement;
- it fails to pay or perform any other obligation, liability or indebtedness to any other party;
- it fails to comply with any material law or regulation controlling its operation;

This Linking Authorization is solely for the purpose of determining a multiplier for rebates to the participating governmental entities and in no way creates a liability for the State or any Participant for the expenditures of other Participants.

This Linking Authorization, the Agreement, and the Contract constitute and represent the entire agreement between the Participant and Bank of America regarding the corporate card services Bank of America provides to the Participant anywhere in the world and supersedes and extinguishes all prior agreements, understandings, representations, warranties and arrangements of any nature (including requests for proposals and other sales material), whether oral or written, between the Participant and Bank of America relating to such corporate card services.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF
NORWOOD WITH JEFFREY L. KRAPELS AS CHIEF OF POLICE AND
SALVATORE RUSSINO AS CAPTAIN OF POLICE**

WHEREAS, Jeffrey L. Krapels is currently the Chief of the Norwood Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Salvatore Russino is currently the Captain of the Norwood Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor & Council of the Borough of Norwood wish to enter into Agreements with Jeffrey L. Krapels and Salvatore Russino to continue in their positions as Chief of Police and Captain of Police, respectively, for a term effective January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the positions of Chief of Police and Captain of Police are not controlled by the PBA Local 233 Collective Bargaining Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreements have been reviewed by the Borough Attorney; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that sufficient funds are available, and the certification is attached;

**RESOLUTION OPPOSING A1294/S2103 AND ITS IMPACT ON
FLOOD-PRONE PROPERTIES**

WHEREAS, A1294/S2103 seeks to circumvent local zoning regulations by permitting the conversion of certain office parks and retail shopping centers into mixed-use developments as a matter of right “without being constrained by outdated zoning ordinances”¹; and

WHEREAS, local land use law takes into consideration the municipality’s topography, economy, demography, environment – in short, the needs of the community for which they are crafted; and

WHEREAS, legislating local zoning on a state level blatantly disregards the needs of the constituency on the local level; and

WHEREAS, A1294/S2103 as currently written applies to all subject office parks and shopping centers indiscriminately throughout the state, including those in flood zones;

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey is experiencing worsening climate change impacts in the form of more frequent, and more intense rain events resulting in ever more costly, severe repetitive losses, which well-established trajectory causes FEMA to periodically enlarge the flood maps to reflect the rising threat to persons and property; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP continues to grapple with flood mitigation throughout the state, expending taxpayer funds for projects such as the removal of residential uses in flood zones via the Blue Acres acquisition program; and

WHEREAS, A1294/S2103 not only disregards the wisdom of local zoning law that guides the cohesive development of property to benefit the health and safety of residents while preserving the environment, it would squarely places some of the State’s most vulnerable residents directly in harm’s way should an office park or shopping center being redeveloped under this law be located in a flood plain, by requiring at least 20% of residential units constructed be reserved for low, moderate, or very low income housing; and

WHEREAS, no matter how well-intended, State legislation that preempts local land use jurisdiction will result in unintended consequences;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood hereby opposes A1294/S2103 in its entirety; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that should the Legislature still see fit to proceed with A1294/S2103, then in the interest of public safety, environmental protection, and common sense, properties located in or bordering documented flood zones be exempt from this local zoning override; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that land use on any such flood-compromised properties will continue to be governed by local land use ordinances and subject to the normal local zoning and planning oversight afforded by the MLUL; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that A1294/S2103 should also be revised to hold harmless municipalities from class action lawsuits of property owners impacted by the adoption of this bill; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the bill sponsors; District 39 Legislators; Governor Murphy; the Bergen County Commissioners; and all municipalities in the County of Bergen.

Matters involving individual privacy: any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational training, social service, medical, health custodial, child protection, rehabilitations, legal defense, welfare, housing relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless, the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing the same be disclosed publicly.

_____ 4. Matters relating to collective bargaining agreements or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiations of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

_____ 5. Matters relating to the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property or the investment of public funds, the setting of bank rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

_____ 6. Matter relating to public safety and property; any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law.

 X 7. Matters relating to litigation, negotiations, and the attorney-client privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

_____ 8. Matters relating to employment: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotions or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employees employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected

_____ 9.
