There's a LOT cooking in the kitchen at HCTC!

HCTC's Culinary Arts students proved that food is more than just recipes this month – serving up a Thanksgiving feast with the VFW while sharpening the skills that prepare them for any kitchen, anywhere.

This month, HCTC's Culinary Arts students partnered with Ellsworth's VFW Post 109 to prepare a full Thanksgiving feast for local veterans and seniors. Together, they cooked 12 turkeys, 100 pounds of potatoes, 80 pounds of squash, seven pans of stuffing, four gallons of gravy, and 32 pies — all served with a side of gratitude and community connection.

The event wasn't just about food; it was about building bridges across generations. Students gained the experience of cooking for a large crowd while also learning the deeper meaning of service — how a shared meal can bring comfort, joy, and community pride.




Our Science National Honor Society group took their annual trip to the University of Maine this month, too!

This month, students designed their own experiments to study how certain enzymes function and react!







These eight Eagles received their official admission to Husson University during our "Husson-On-The-Spot" event in Guidance!




