Donald Jennings began the program with a selection entitled "They Grind Exceeding Small." He was

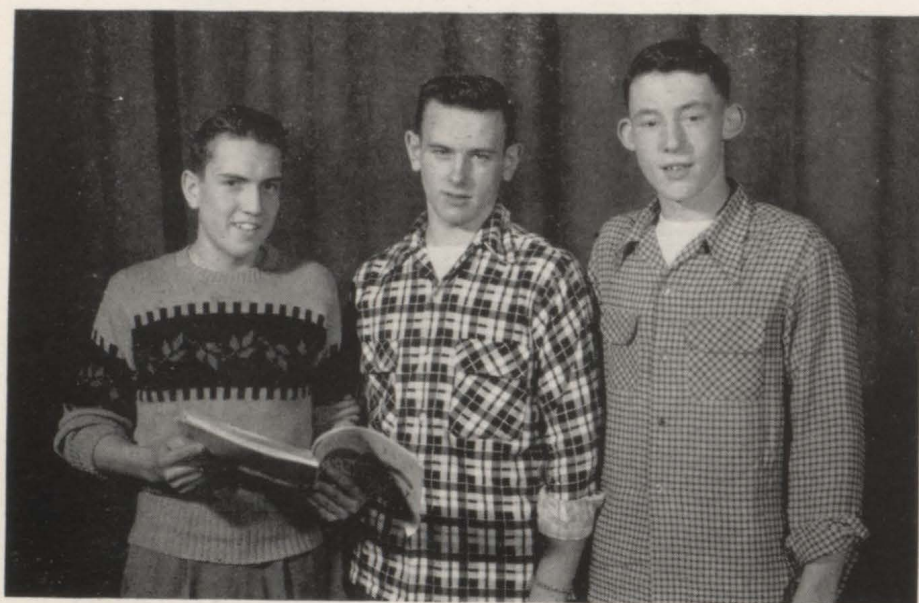
