

Board Member Compensation

A board of director member is eligible to receive compensation at the rate of fifty dollars (\$50) per day, or for a portion of a day, for the following activities:

- A. Attending regular or special meetings of the board of directors;
- B. Serving as a designated representative of the board of directors, including, but not limited to, such activities as: school committees, community development and/or betterment committees, collective bargaining, etc;
- C. Attending board-approved training and/or development activities, including, but not limited to: regional, state, or national school board association conferences, board in-service meetings, etc. This may also include time involved in traveling to and from the activity; and
- D. Attending special board-related activities when approved by the board of directors in advance, including, but not limited to: building dedications, commencement activities, staff retirements, and other such ceremonies.

Total compensation for a calendar year shall not exceed four thousand eight hundred dollars (\$4,800.00), plus reasonable expenses incurred for travel, meals and lodging.

Any board of director member may waive all or any portion of his/her compensation for any month or months during his/her term of office, by a written waiver filed with the Dayton School District. The waiver may be filed any time after the director's election and before the date on which the compensation would otherwise be paid. The waiver shall specify the month or period of months for which it is made.

A board of director member shall submit a monthly claim which verifies the nature and amount of approved activities for which compensation is claimed during the month. A director is only eligible to make one compensation claim for a given day.
