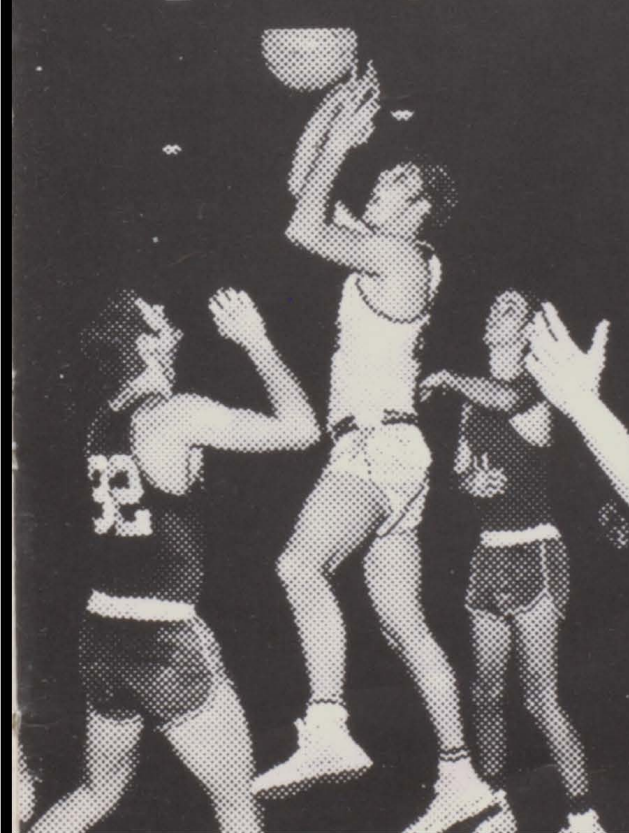


#### REMEMBER

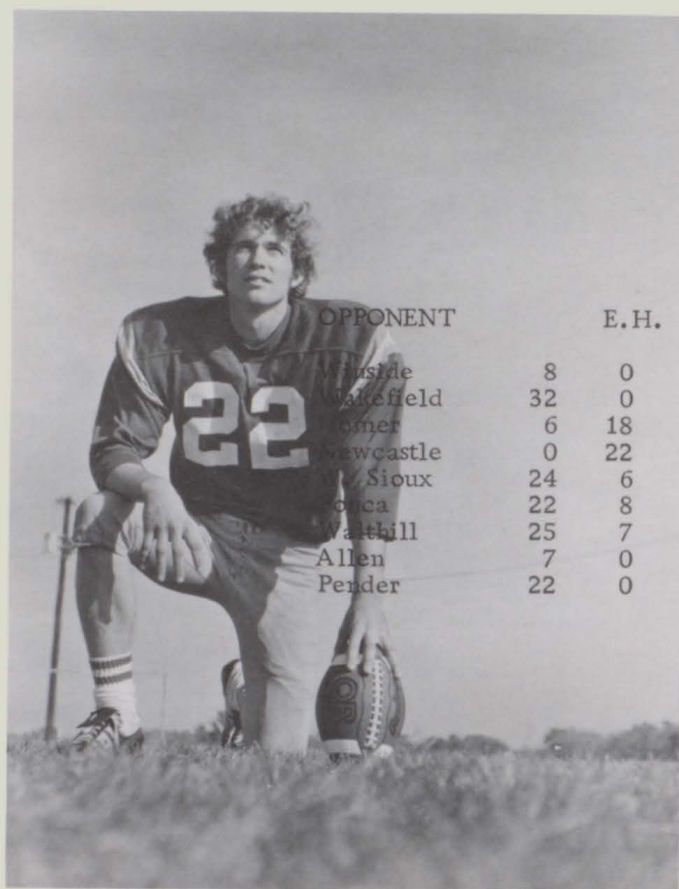
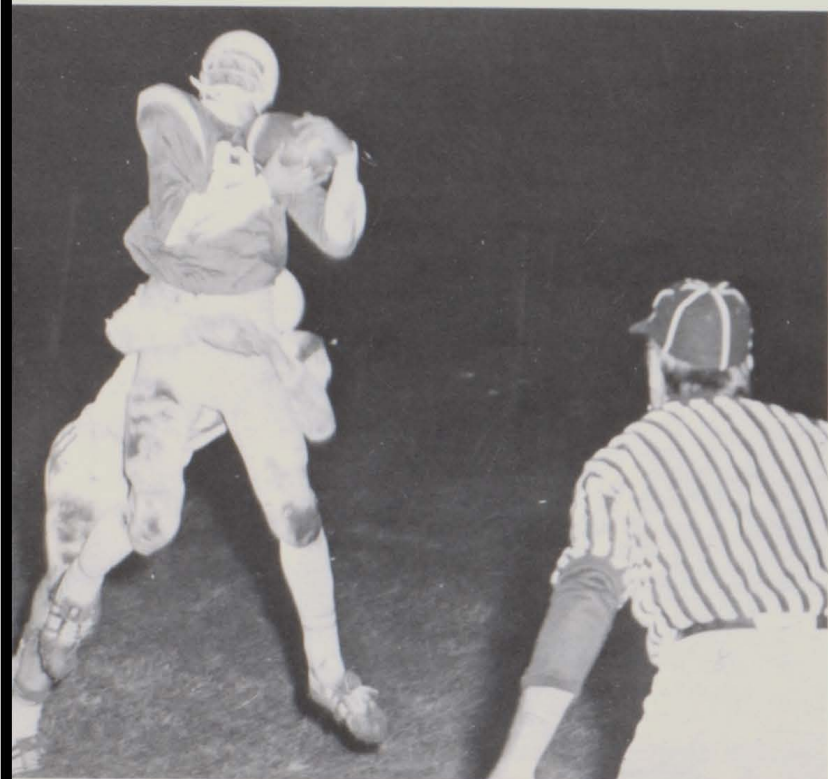




## Football 1972-73

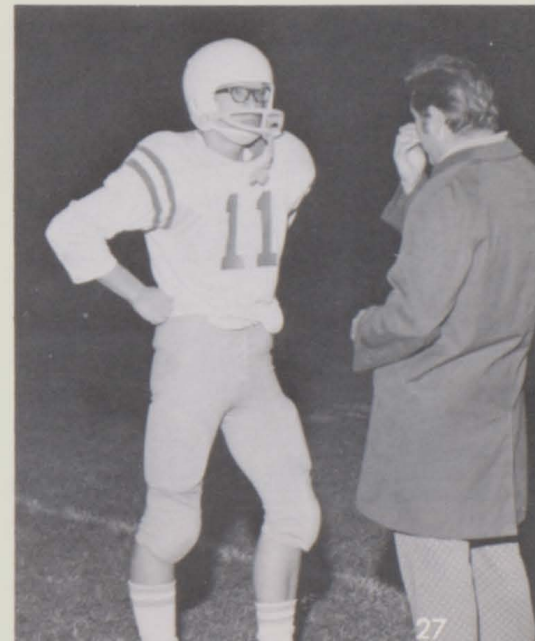
