INSTRUCTOR SPOTLIGHT

Zachary Hagen is a passionate writer, chef, and teacher. While he didn't attend a culinary school, Hagen's life has brought him to such places as the American South, Italy, Southeast Asia, and other places, where he was able to delve into the flavors of the places he has lived and visited. His upbringing was largely centered around the table because of his family's strong ties to Cuban heritage. In Cuba, the food is one of the most recognizable symbols of national pride.

Hagen worked as a personal chef while earning his undergraduate degree and has spent the last seven years honing the craft, science, and art of cooking both traditional and innovative foods inspired by the world and his home.

BASICS OF GOOD COOKING

The Basics of Good Cooking class is a four-night class that focuses on four essential elements of cooking that exist across cultures and culinary traditions: salt, fat, acid, and heat. Mastering these elements can enable any cook to create great food. This class will be split into four units, each one focusing on mastering one particular element and using it to make existing recipes shine. Emphasis will also be given to proper knife techniques, beginning recipe development, and intuitive seasoning. 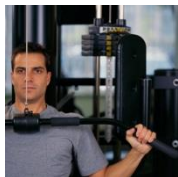

EARLY CHILDHOOD NEWS

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) ~ Classes are geared for all families with a birth to five-year-old. We will be exploring art, literacy, science, (and more) as we learn through creating, listening, moving, and doing! We are looking forward to being able to have some great discussions in parent education time as well. There will be many opportunities for discussing parenting techniques and child needs.

ECFE is for everyone! Please join us! There is no charge!

School Readiness Preschool ~ If you have a child who is three, four, or five years (and hasn't begun kindergarten) by September 1, 2021, then we have a preschool program for your child! School Readiness focuses on "whole child" development (physical, cognitive, language, and social/emotional areas), and aims to support children as they learn essential skills for later learning.

Call Kayla Hoelscher at 218-583-2927 for an information packet to sign up for preschool. We have full day fours classes that meet Monday/Wednesday/every other Friday and Tuesday/Thursday/every other Friday. Threes meet for two full day sessions on Mondays and Wednesdays. Preschool follows the public school calendar. All preschool is free, but there may be some paperwork required. We will let you know as soon as we learn of any requirements from the MN Department of Education. We look forward to working with your child (and you!) throughout the preschool program this year!

Advisory Council ~ Let Laura Smith (218-583-2927) know if you're interested in serving on our Early Childhood Family Education/School Readiness Advisory Council. This is a group that provides input into our early childhood programs and supports/advocates for our youngest citizens and their families! We meet approximately three times/year.

Early Childhood Screening ~ Henning early childhood staff will be conducting developmental screenings. This screening gives a brief look into a child's social, emotional, cognitive and physical development and can help us provide referrals for extra educational (or other) support if needed. A screening is required by the Minnesota Department of Education when a child participates in School Readiness preschool. We will be working in order of birthdate and will be contacting you/sending screening materials to you as your child meets the age requirement. ADULT BASIC EDUCATION FREE HELP FOR ADULTS

Adult Basic Education is the program for adults who would like to improve reading, writing, and math skills. Also included in the ABE program:

- *English as a Second Language
- *Driver's License Exam Preparation
- *Job Seeking Skills – Life Skills
- *Test Taking
- *Spelling – Vocabulary

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE/LEP ~ Limited English Proficient (LEP/ESL) classes are designed for foreign-born adults who wish to learn the English language. Basic reading, writing and math skills are taught.

GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT (GED) ~ General Education Development is a national program to prepare adults (16 and older) for a test that results in a high school equivalency diploma. Computer assisted learning is available in all subject areas at most sites.
