The winner of the tournament will go to Columbus to compete in the state finals.

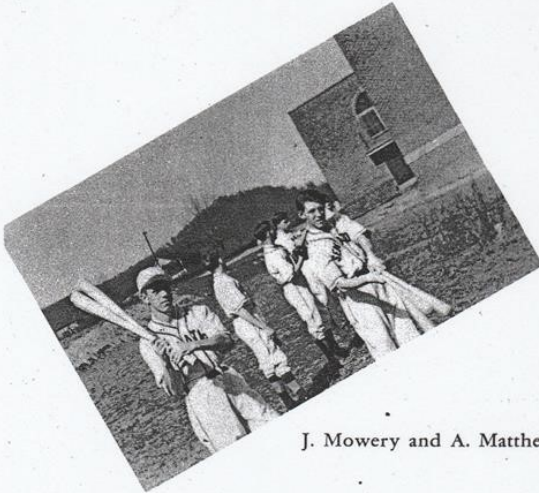




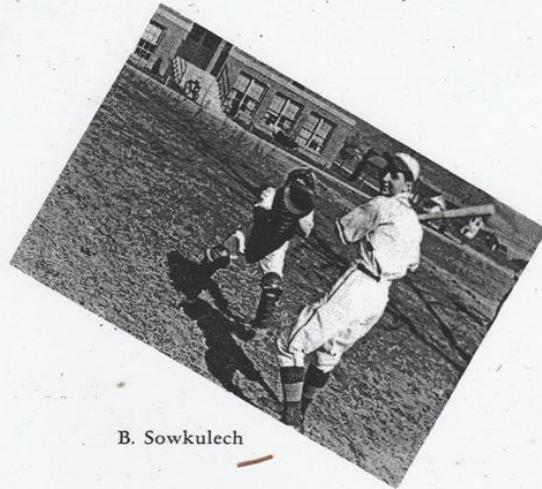

## SENATORS BEGIN PLAY WITH SIX VETS IN LINEUP

### Washington Meets Indians With Infield Lacking Experience

Washington's Senators open their baseball season at Lucasville today with a team built around a nucleus of six lettermen from the 1945 squad.

Infield problems have been worrying Coach Russ Christian more than any other factor this year. Graduation riddled the inner defenses and only two veterans are available for duty. Woten, a shortstop, and Moriarity, a catcher, are the sole lettermen in the Senator infield.

The bases will be handled by three men, although unseasoned, have shown promise in practice.

At the initial sack, Miller will probably get the call and Mowrey seems to have the edge on the second base slot. Hopkins is slated for the third base position.

Washington has fared a little better in the pitching department. Three experienced hurlers have been tossing them up in drills and will give the Solons plenty of strength. Litteral and Knauff were starting twirlers last year and Woten switches from his shortstop post to mound duties when necessary.

In the outfield, O'Dell and Moore will provide the experience with a first year man, Jacks, coming along to fill the vacancy.

If the veterans can prove a steadying influence on the first year starters, Coach Christian will have his Senators in the race all of the way.

## SOLON HURLERS PITCH NO-HITTER AGAINST INDIANS

### Minford Upsets Clay As Green Downs Pirates For Opener

An upset by Minford's Falcons and a no-hit pitching exhibition by two Washington twirlers featured the opening of the Scioto baseball league Friday afternoon.

Coach Roy Pfleger's Minford nine, rated a slight underdog in their battle with the defending champions, Clay, uncorked a sensational sophomore hurler in Sparks who set the champs down in solid style for the seven inning route and struck out 14 Panthers as the Falcons pulled their surprise 13-to-3 win at Clay Friday.

hurler found himself again and fanned three Falcons. For Washington, Moriarity got his second hit of the afternoon, a home run into left center field.

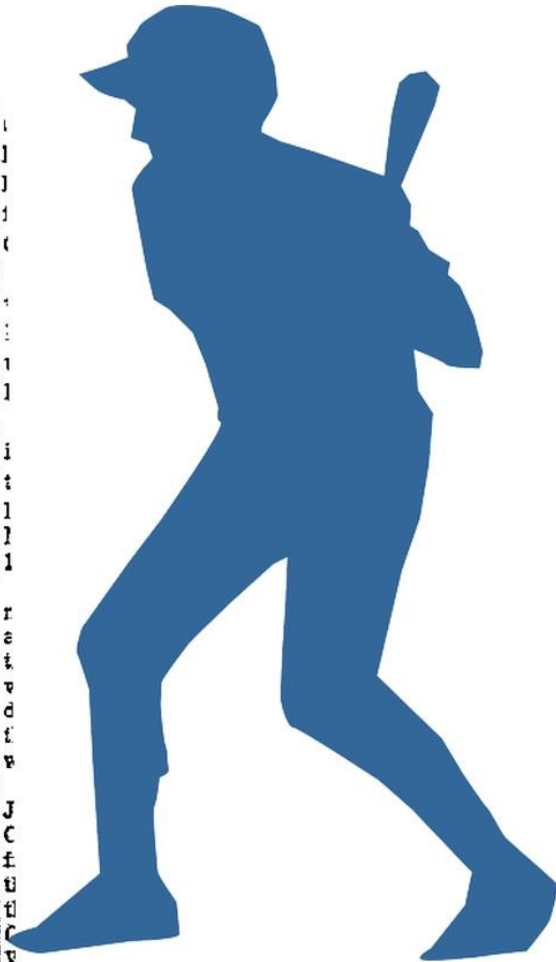

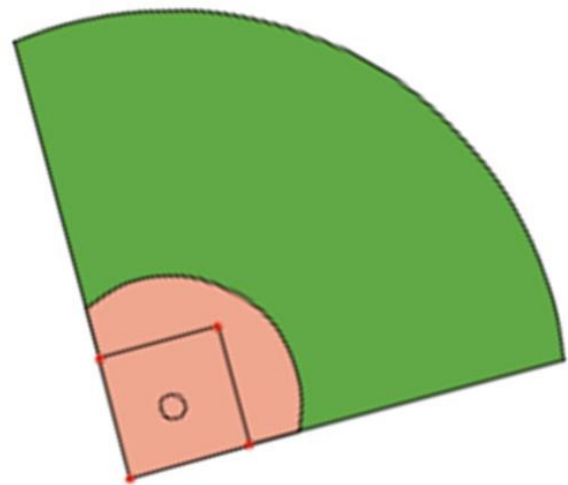
Tronton's Tigers face Athens in the other class A semi-final game. The finals are scheduled to be played Monday.

This year's team came away with league championships in both the S.O.C. and the S.C.L. The Senators also won the sectional title and were runners-up in district play.

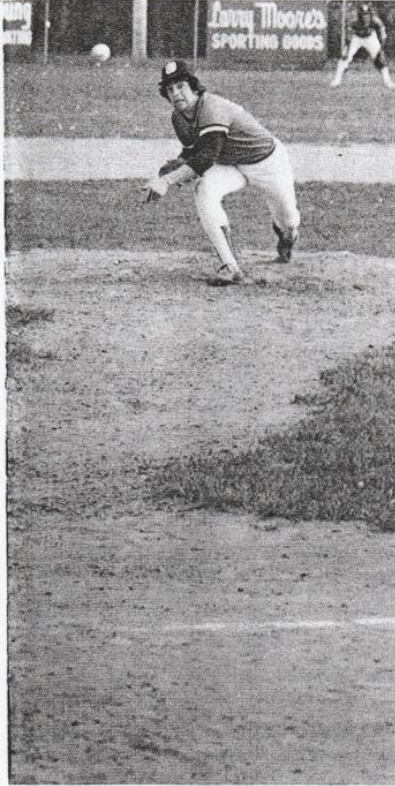
