

FINANCIAL AID

Several sources of financial aid may be available to students meeting specified criteria. Information is available through the student services office.

Scholarships

Senior Scholarship

Any participating school junior, senior or immediate graduate who resides in the Indian Capital district will be eligible for one (1) tuition free program. This tuition free program may be used during their junior and senior year or through the year following their high school graduation. The maximum benefit is a tuition waiver up to 1050 hours at the in-student rate for regular full-time Career Majors.

Superintendent Scholarship

The Superintendent's Scholarship Program allows one adult student from each campus to receive a full ride scholarship for one year. There are specific eligible criteria considerations each student must meet in order to qualify. Campus directors submit nominees from their campus to the Superintendent. The Superintendent will determine the individual adult student who will be awarded the scholarship.

Workforce Investment Act Funds

Assistance is available for the economically disadvantaged, dislocated worker, and for the older worker (over 55). These funds are administered locally through the Eastern Oklahoma Workforce Investment Bond (EWIB).

Nursing Student Assistance Program

A scholarship/loan program administered by the Physician Manpower Training Commission is available.

Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant (OTAG)

OTAG is a grant program based upon financial need and is available to all Oklahoma residents who are full-time or part-time students.

Otha Grimes/Francis Tuttle Scholarships

These are scholarships for adult students who may not qualify for other scholarships or student assistance programs.

Pell Grant

This is a federally funded grant program that provides funds for adult students in post-secondary educational training. Application forms may be picked up from the financial aid office.

Veteran's Benefits

Selected training programs at Indian Capital Technology Center are accredited and approved for eligible veterans.

Vocational Rehabilitation (DHS)

Persons having a handicap or disability are eligible. Training is available for qualified applicants through referrals to the Department of Human Services, Vocational Rehabilitation.

The fundamental purpose of the financial aid office is to provide assistance for financially disadvantaged students who, without such aid, would be unable to further their education. Financial assistance includes grants, scholarships, and tuition fee waivers. The primary responsibility for financing education lies first with the student and the student's family (parents or spouse). When the total resources they can provide do not meet expenses, the financial aid will provide assistance to the student.

Financial aid is awarded to students according to institutional policies and federal regulations on the basis of need and ability to benefit from the training without regard to age, ethnicity, religion, or gender. Information on any of the available financial aid programs may be obtained from the school office and online.

When a student has a need for financial assistance, arrangements should be made prior to the beginning of the student's training. Every effort will be made to meet the student's need through a variety of available financial assistance programs.

Grants and scholarships, as well as assistance from other agencies are available to assist most students. Each student will be treated as an individual and a financial package will be arranged according to the student's needs and ability to pay.

Students who are sponsored by an agency or organization shall be responsible for providing a letter or voucher from the agency to the financial aid office on or before the first day of class. It is the student's responsibility to keep the financial aid office informed of any changes in their address and enrollment status.
